

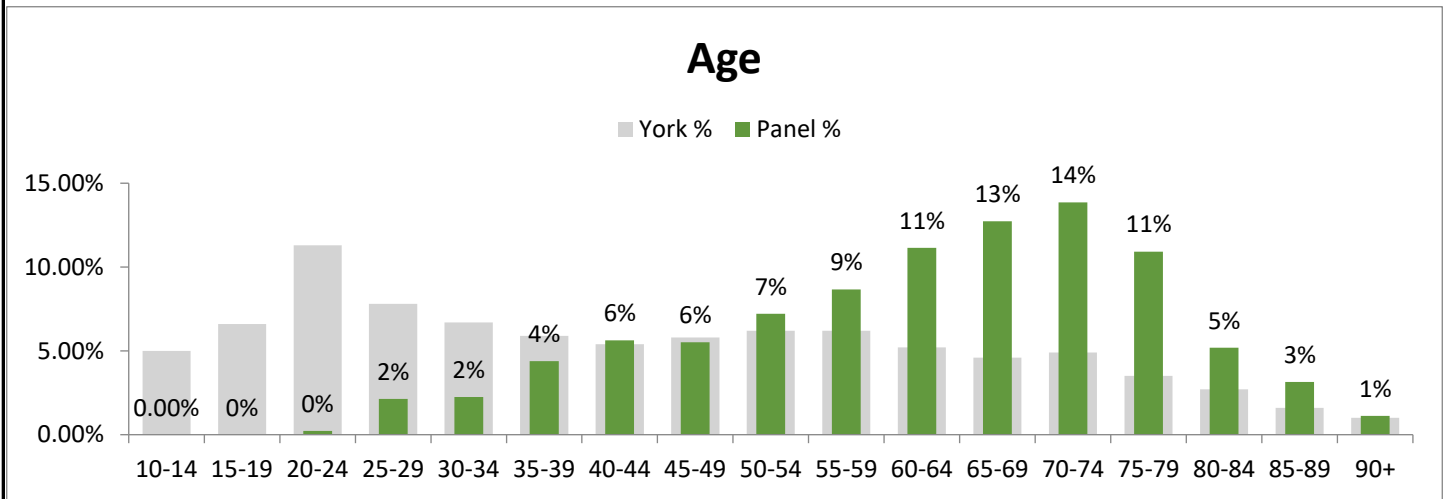

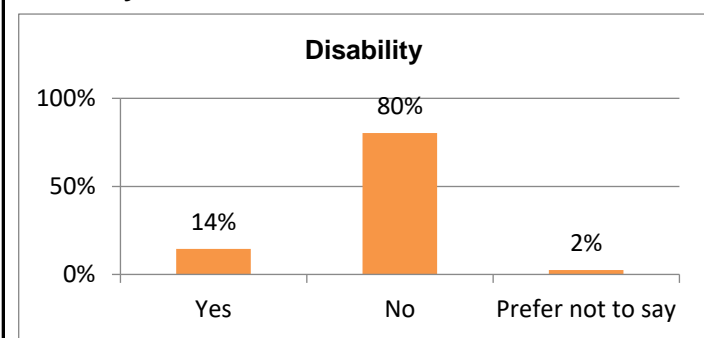
Age

The table below reflects the age breakdown for the panel compared York.



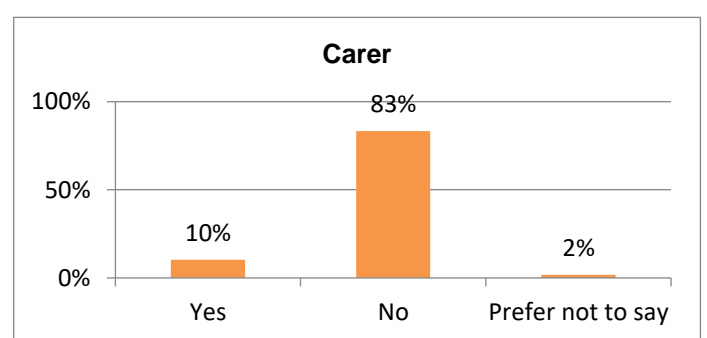

When asked which activity described what pannelist were doing at present the following responses were given

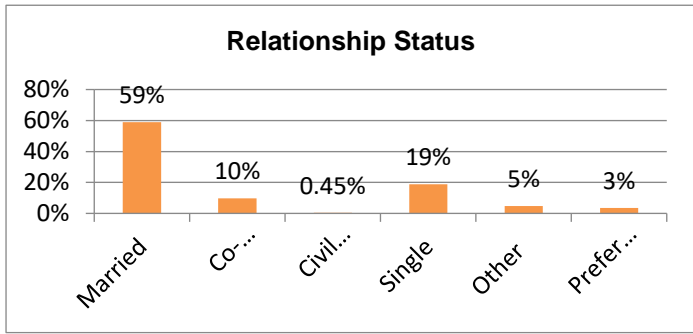
- Employee in full time job (30 hours plus) 33%

Gender and Transgender

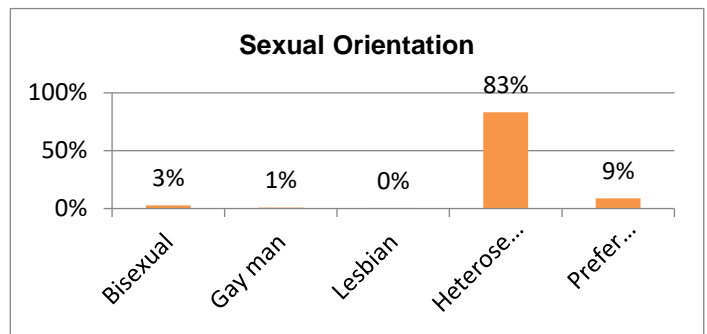

Relationship Status



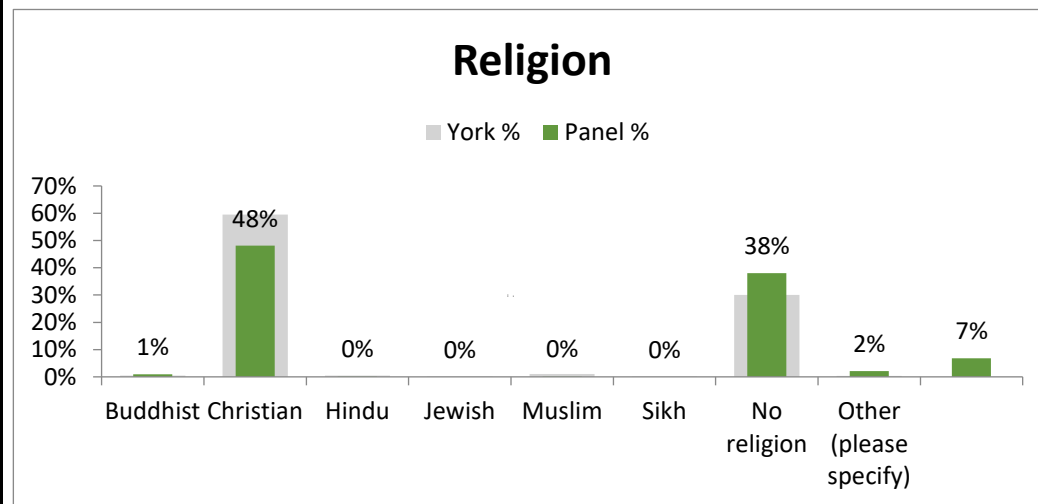

Religious Beliefs

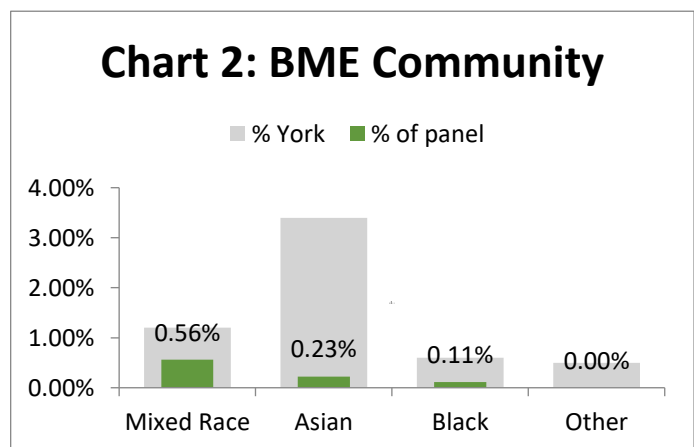
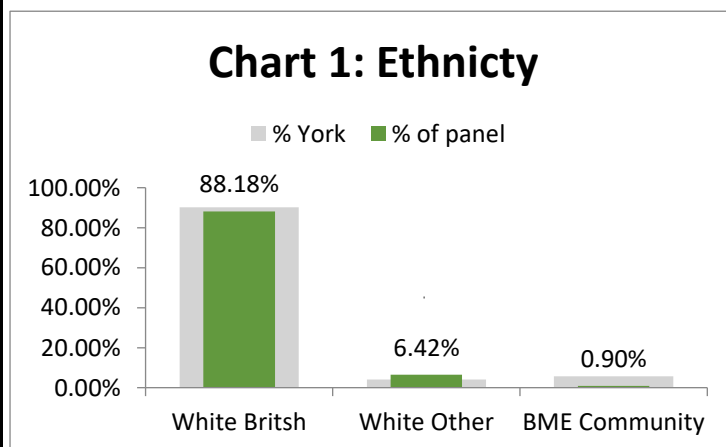


Religious beliefs are largely proportional to those of York as a whole.
