


# York overall picture:

- The JSA claimant count for York in January 2024 is 155.
- In March 2020 the figure was 185, which is a decrease of 16.2%.
- This represents 0.1% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 0.3% and GB at 0.2%.
- The highest JSA claimant count in York in the past 10 years (from January 2014) is from February 2014 with a figure of 2,225 or 1.7% of the working age population.




#### JSA Claimants 18 - 24 years old

- In January 2024 the total number of claimants (18-24) stood at 5, no change since Mar 2020.
- This represents 0.0% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 0.1% and GB at 0.1%.




#### JSA Claimaints out of work for over one year

- Claimants out of work for over one year, showed no change from last month, 15 less than one year ago a 42.9% decrease.
- This represents 0.0% of the working age population who were out of work for over 1 year.
- The region stands at 0.1% and GB at 0.1%.




# **JSA Male Claimant Count**

- Male Claimants have increased by 10 from last month, totalling 90, 20 more than one year ago a 28.6% increase.
- This represents 2.0 % of the male working age population.
- The region stands at 4.9% and GB at 4.3%.



# **JSA Female Claimants**


- Female Claimants have increased by 15 from last month, totalling 65, 15 more than one year ago a 30.0% increase.
- This represents 1.5 % of the female working age population.
- The region stands at 3.4% and GB at 3.2%.


# York Jobseekers Allowance/Universal Credit overall picture:

- The JSA/UC claimant count for York in January 2024 is 2,315.
- In January 2023 the figure was 2,300, this is an increase of 15 (0.7%).
- This represents 1.8% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 4.2% and GB at 3.7%.
- The highest JSA/UC claimant count in York in the past 4 years (from January 2020) is from August 2020 with a figure of 5,080 or 3.6% of the working age population.




#### JSA/UC Claimants 18 - 24 years old

- In January 2024 the total number of claimants (18-24) stood at 410, a reduction of 15 (a 3.5% decrease) from December 2023.
- This represents 1.4% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 5.8% and GB at 5.0%.




#### **JSA/UC Male Claimant Count**

- Male Claimants have increased by 60 from last month, totalling 1,300, 30 less than one year ago a 2.3% decrease.
- This represents 2.0 % of the male working age population.
- The region stands at 4.9% and GB at 4.3%.



#### **JSA/UC Female Claimants**

- Female Claimants have decreased by 5 from last month, totalling 1,015, 45 more than one year ago a 4.6% increase.
- This represents 1.5 % of the female working age population.
- The region stands at 3.4% and GB at 3.2%.


Under Universal Credit a broader span of claimants are required to look for work than under Jobseeker's Allowance. As Universal Credit Full Service is rolled out in particular areas, the number of people recorded as being on the Claimant Count is therefore likely to rise.

#### **Universal Credit Claimants**

#### **Universal Credit Claimants**

The JSA figures should be viewed in the context of the number of people receiving Universal Credit in York increasing from 12,619 in December 2023 to 12,813 in January 2024. Under Universal Credit a broader span of claimants are required to look for work than under Jobseekers Allowance. As Universal Credit Full Service is rolled out in particular areas, the number of people recorded as being on the Claimant Count is therefore likely to rise.

On 12 July 2017 Universal Credit became available to parents and couples in the York area, until this date Universal Credit was only available to single job seekers in the area. From November 2019 the provisional figures will show the total of those claiming Universal Credit. A breakdown will only be shown when the figures are revised.

Following the introduction of Universal Credit, the claimant count takes into account:

- people claiming contribution JSA (this is not affected by the introduction of Universal Credit)
- the figures for Universal Credit are provisional for the current month and may be revised in the next update.


#### **Universal Credit Claimants**

#### **Universal Credit Claimants: Not in Employment**

The number of Universal Claimants claiming out of work benefits in December 2023 was 6,724, which has increased by 8.3% from last year, when the total was 6,206. The not in employment figure for January 2024 will be available in February 2024, as the figure is published a month in arrears.

Nationally, the number of people claiming the not in employment element of Universal Credit has increased by 11.4% from the same period last year.

Regionally, the figure has increased by 13.3% from the same period last year.

#### Universal Credit Claimants: Percentage of Working Age Claimants Not in Employment

The percentage of Universal Claimants claiming out of work benefits in December 2023 was 5%, which has increased by 0.4% from last year, when the total was 4.6%,

Nationally, the number of people claiming the not in employment element of Universal Credit has increased by 1% from last year, when the total was 8.5%, .

Regionally, the figure has increased by 1.2% from last year, when the total was 9.4%.
