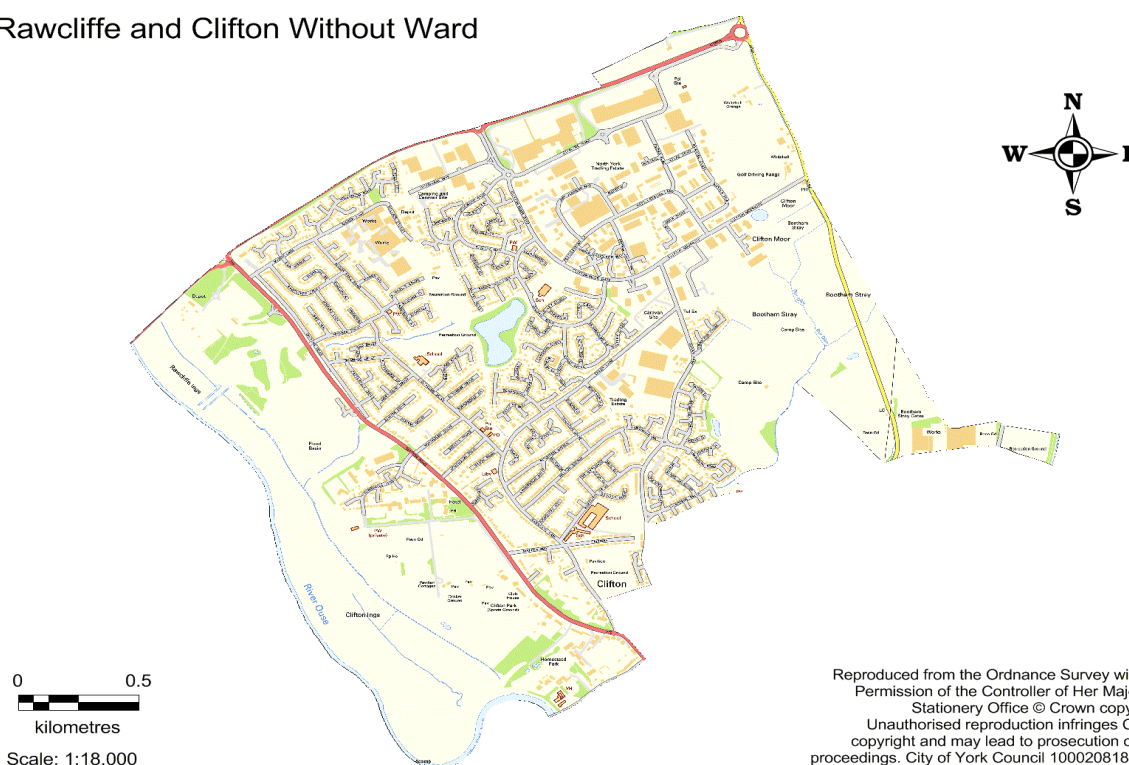


Rawcliffe and Clifton Without Ward Profile

York Summary

- York has 208,367 residents with 5.7% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 83.9% are in good health, with 15.3% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- £637.58 was the Average Weekly Household Income in 2015/2016 (£629.00 in 2013/2014).
- 66% own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage, 18% are private renters and 14% are social tenants. There are 7,614 Council Houses in York.
- 73.5% of residents have a Level 1 - 4 qualification, of which 62.9% are, at least, qualified to Level 2, but 18.0% have no qualifications at all.
- 9.7% of children are in child poverty (7.8% of children live in a household where a parent or guardian claims an out-of-work benefit) and there are 11.5% of households in fuel poverty.
- 1.7% of the working population (aged 16-64) claim out of work benefits and 0.2% claim job seekers allowance.

Ward Summary

- Rawcliffe and Clifton Without has 12,034 residents with 4.3% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 85.4% are in good health, with 13.9% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- £643.16 was the Average Weekly Household Income in 2015/2016 (£627.78 in 2013/2014).
- 80% own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage, 10% are private renters and 8% are social tenants. There are 164 Council Houses in this ward, which is 2.15% of York's total.
- 73.5% of residents have a Level 1 - 4 qualification, of which 60.9% are, at least, qualified to Level 2, but 17.7% have no qualifications at all.
- 8.1% of children are in child poverty (4.7% of children live in a household where a parent or guardian claims an out-of-work benefit) and there are 9.6% of households in fuel poverty.
- 1.8% of the working population claim out of work benefits and 0.1% claim job seekers allowance.

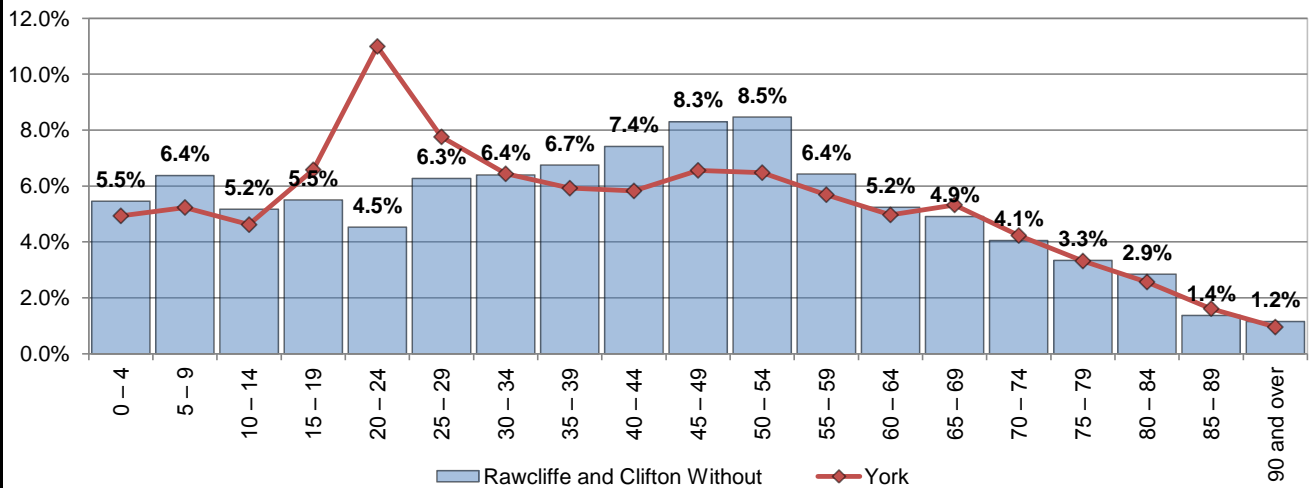

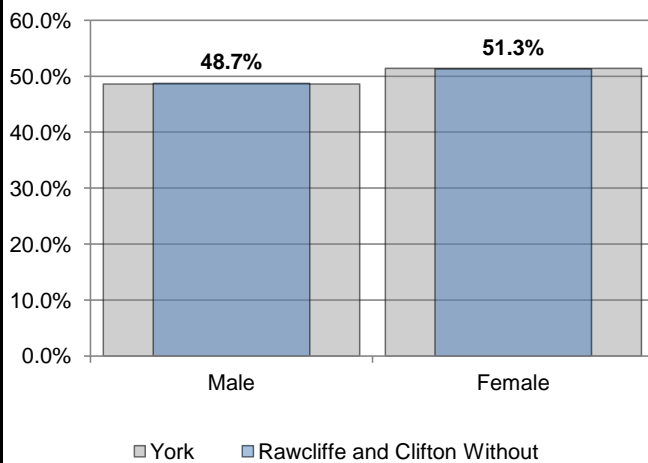
Population by Age

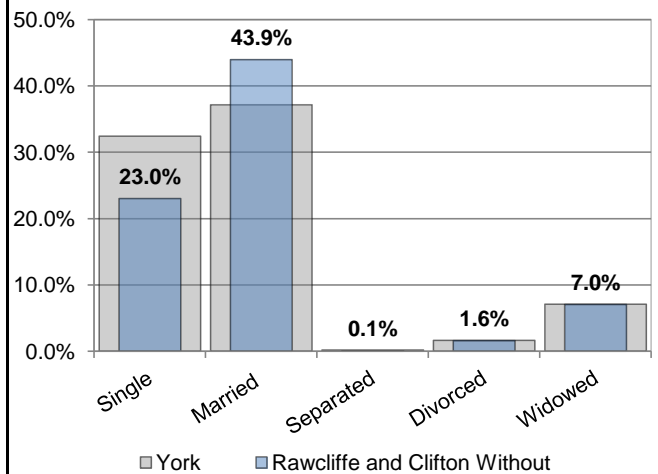

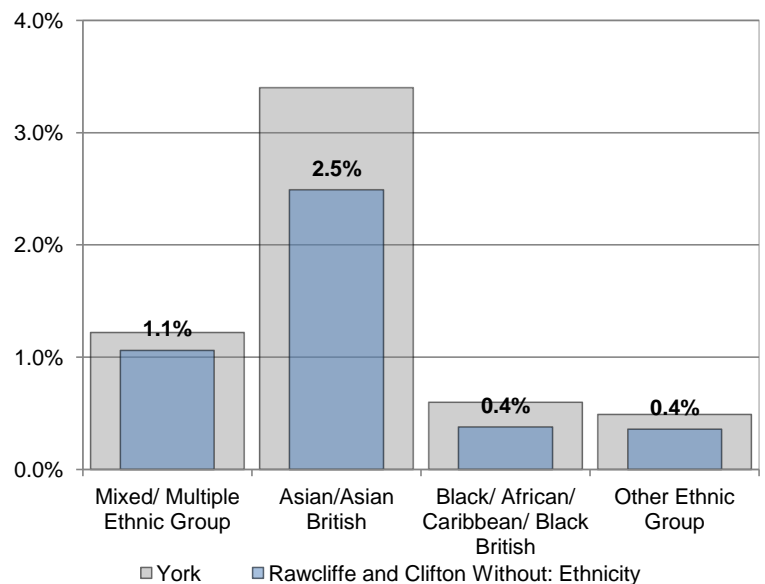

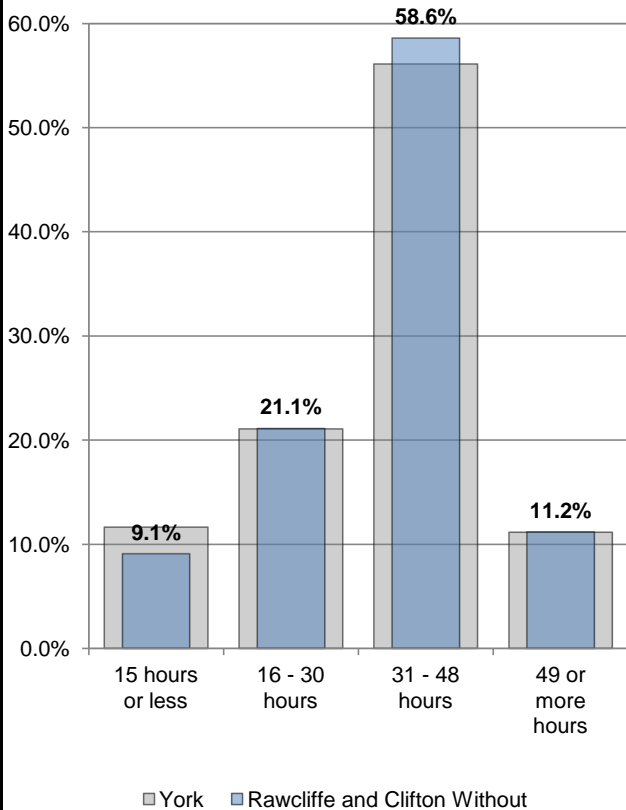

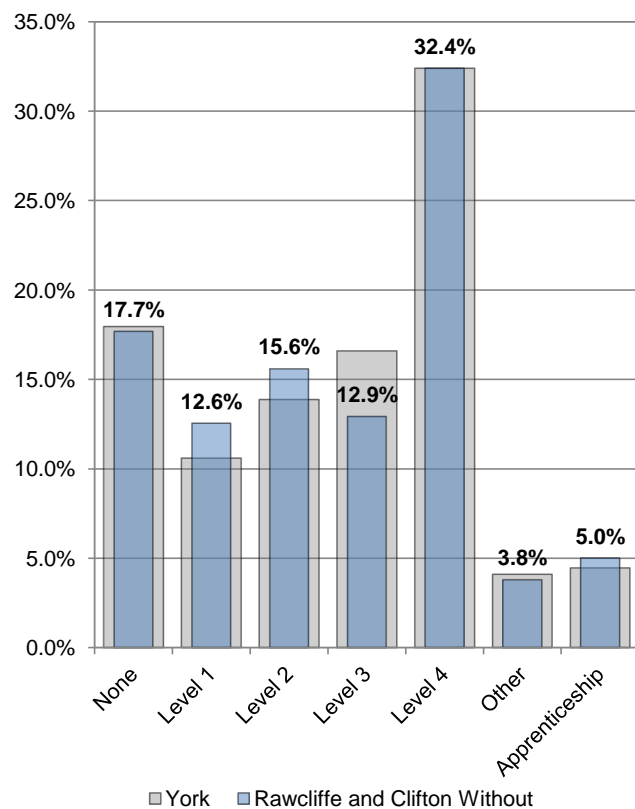

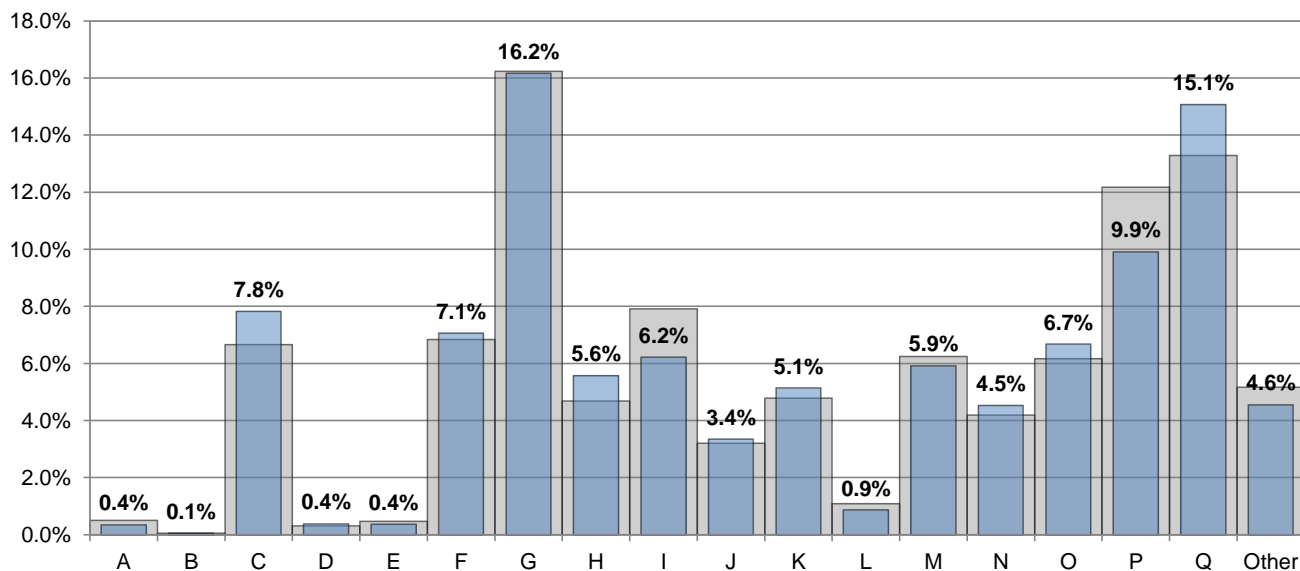

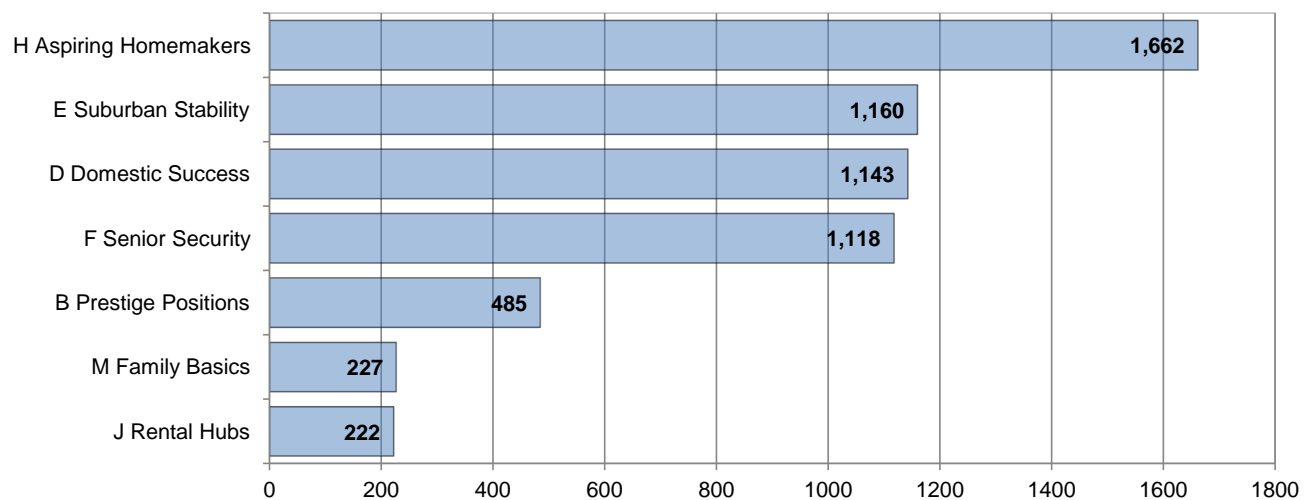

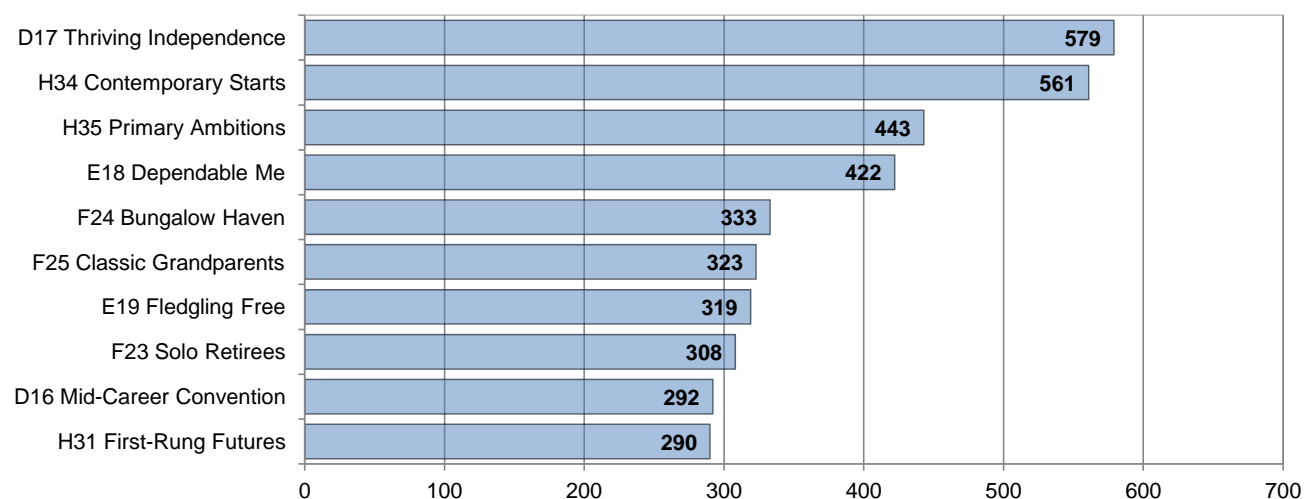

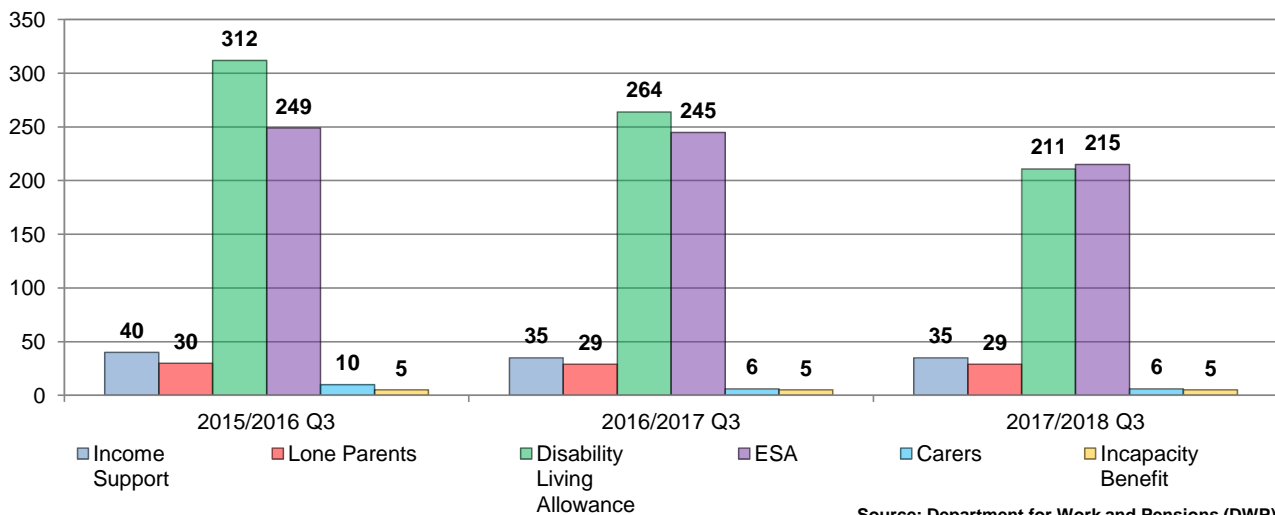

Working age Population (16-64)

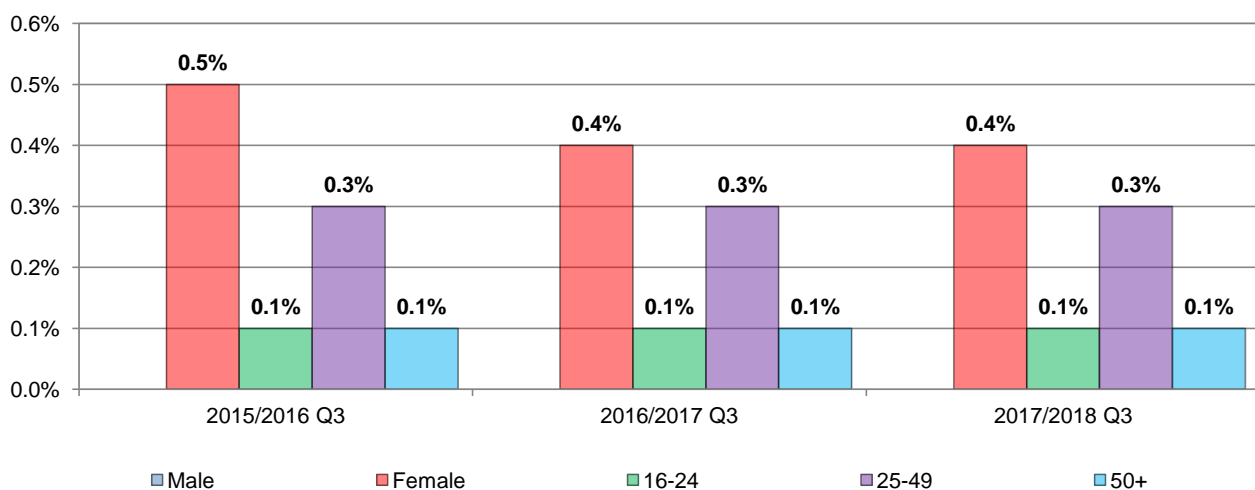


Benefit Claimant Rate

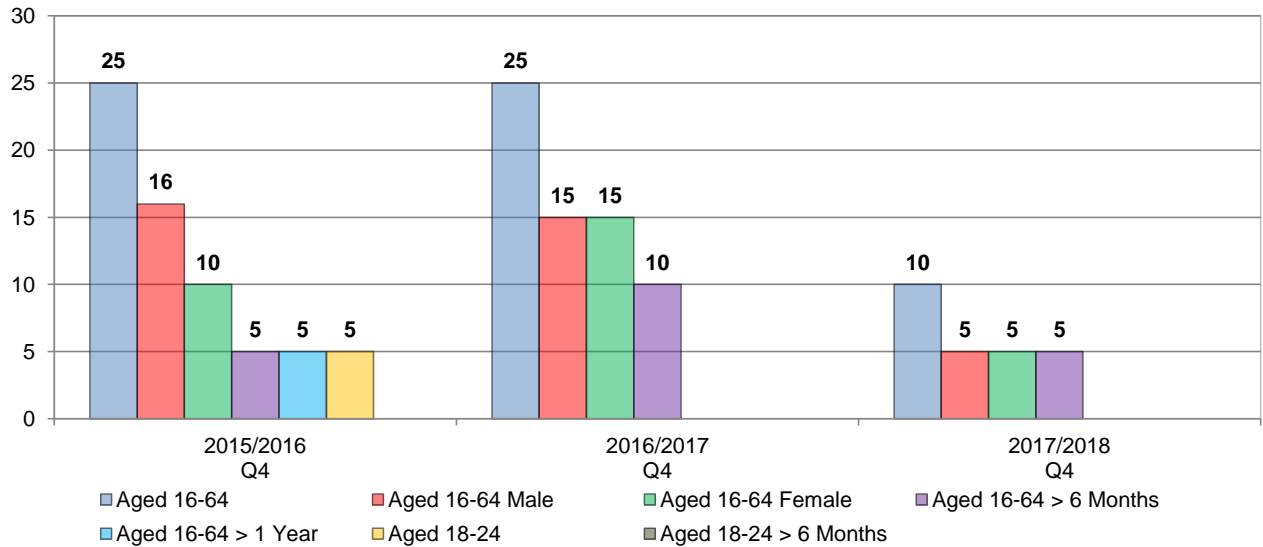

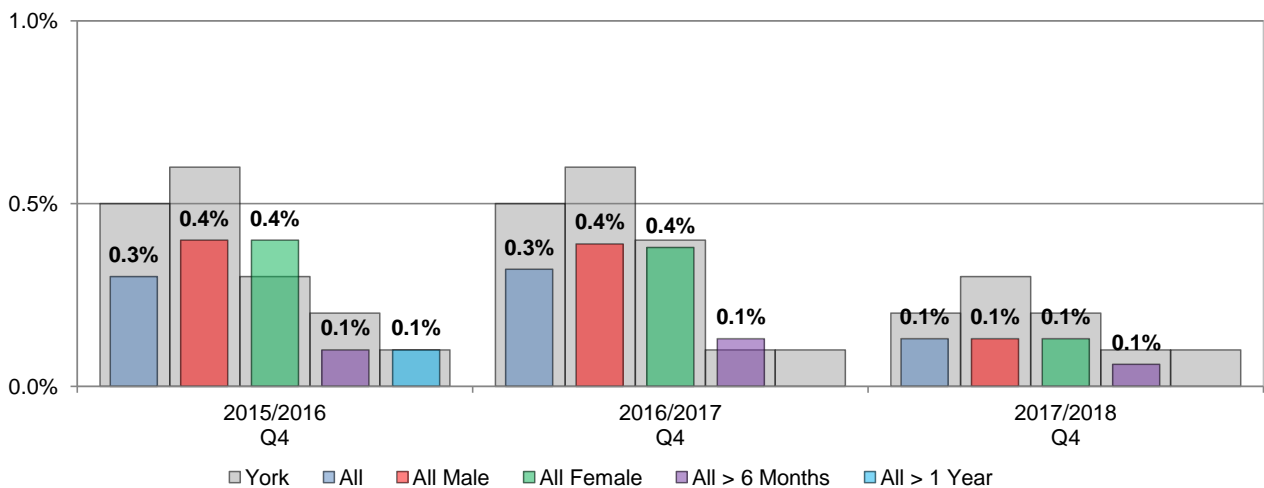

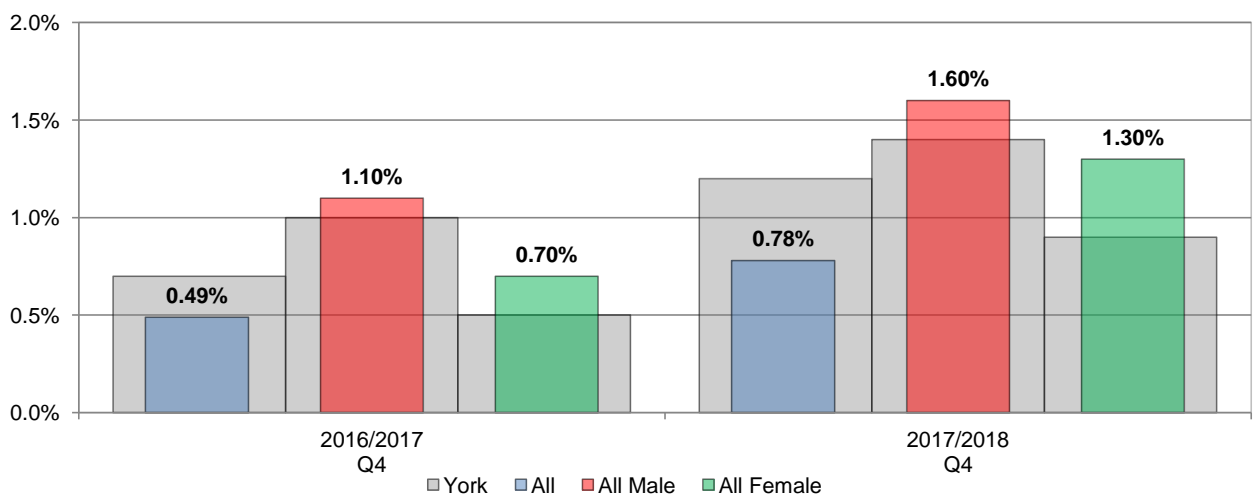
JSA Claimant Numbers



JSA Claimant Rate (Age and Gender) Working age Population (16-64)



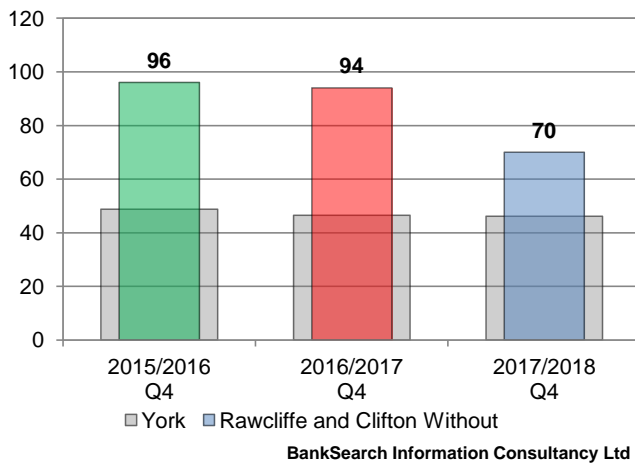
JSA and Universal Credit (out of work) Claimant Rate Working age Population (16-64)



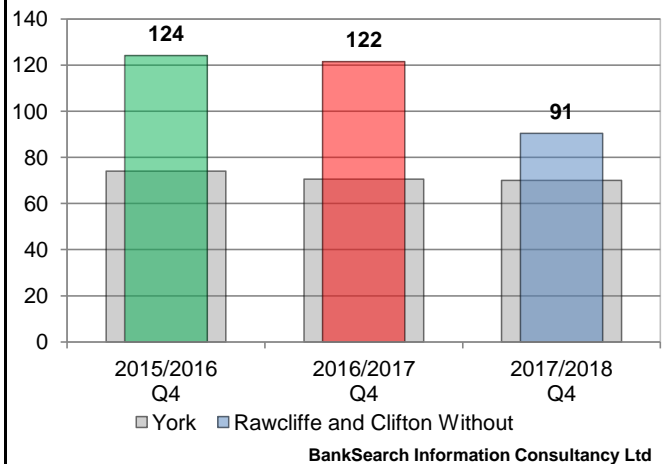

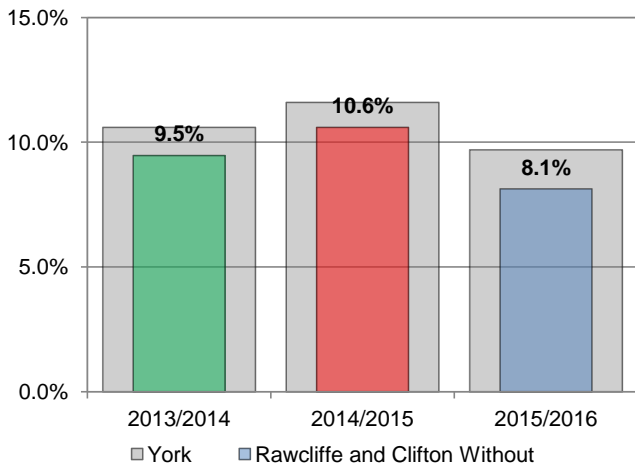

The proportion of children living in families in receipt of out-of-work (means-tested) benefits or in receipt of tax credits where their reported income is less than 60 per cent of UK median income

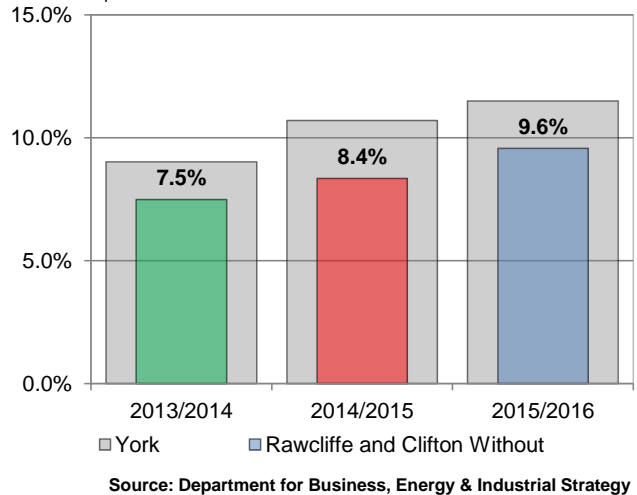


Fuel Poverty

The Low Income High Costs indicator is a twin indicator consisting of:

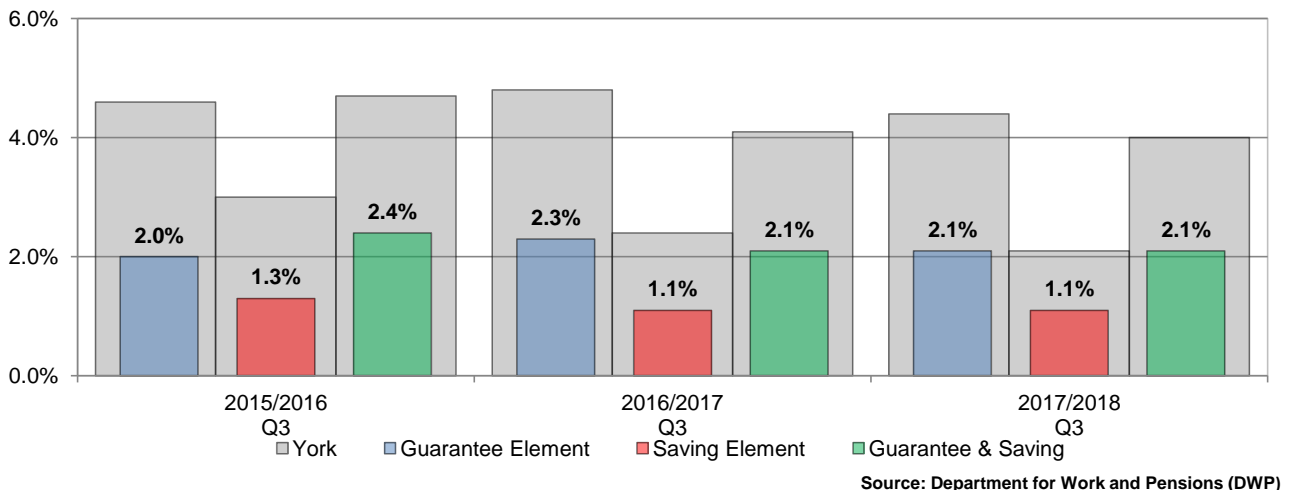
- the number of households that have both low incomes and high fuel costs; and
- the depth of fuel poverty amongst these fuel poor households.

This is measured through a fuel poverty gap which represents the difference between the required fuel costs for each household and the median required fuel costs.



Pension Credit

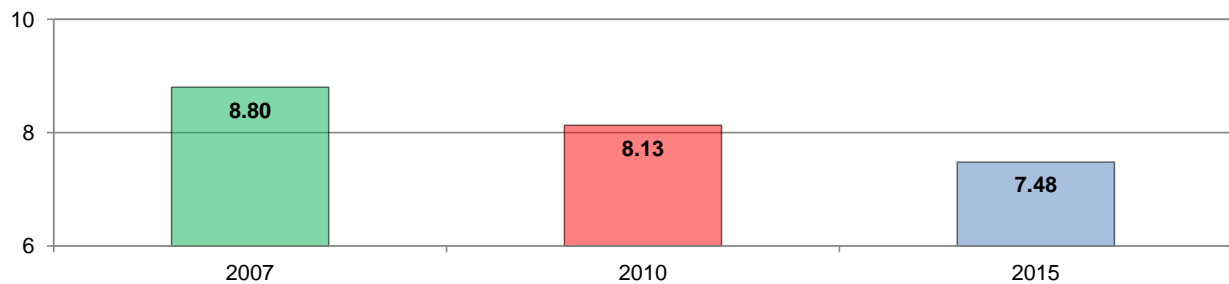
Pension Credit is an income-related benefit made up of 2 parts - Guarantee Credit and Savings Credit.

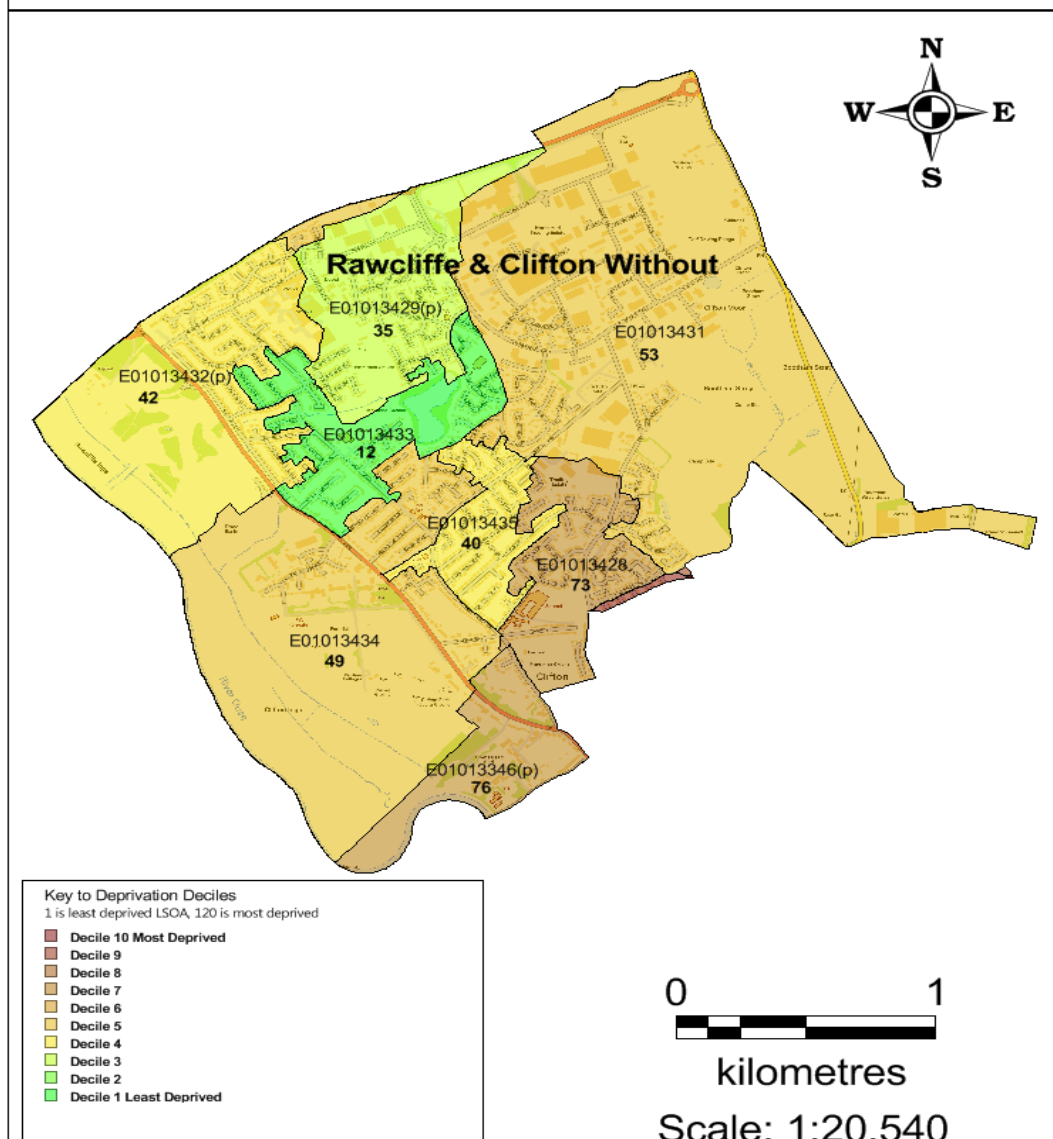

Hospital Admissions, All ages



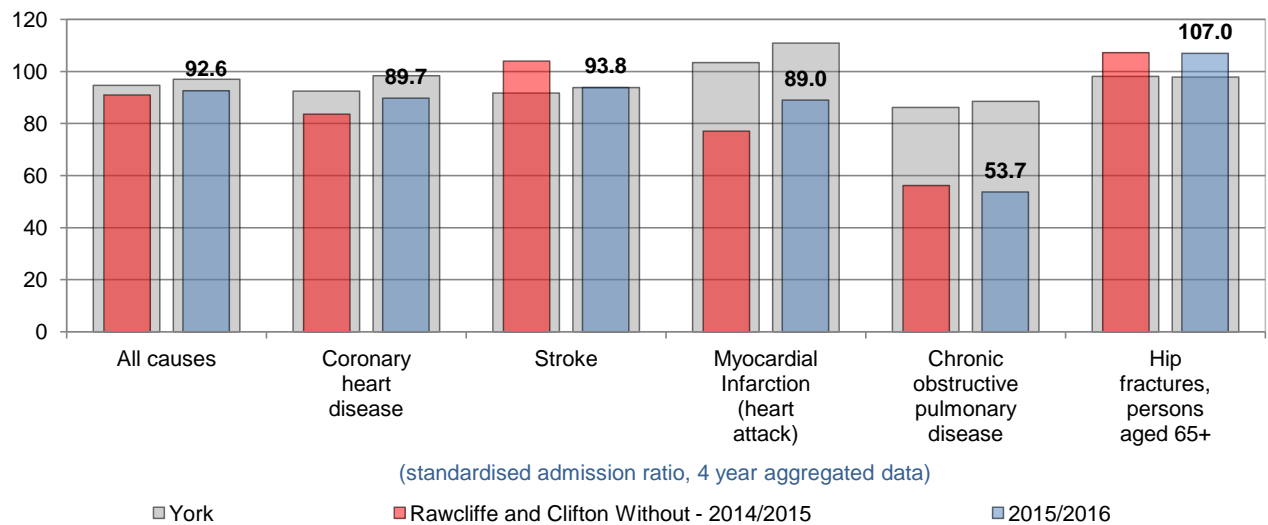

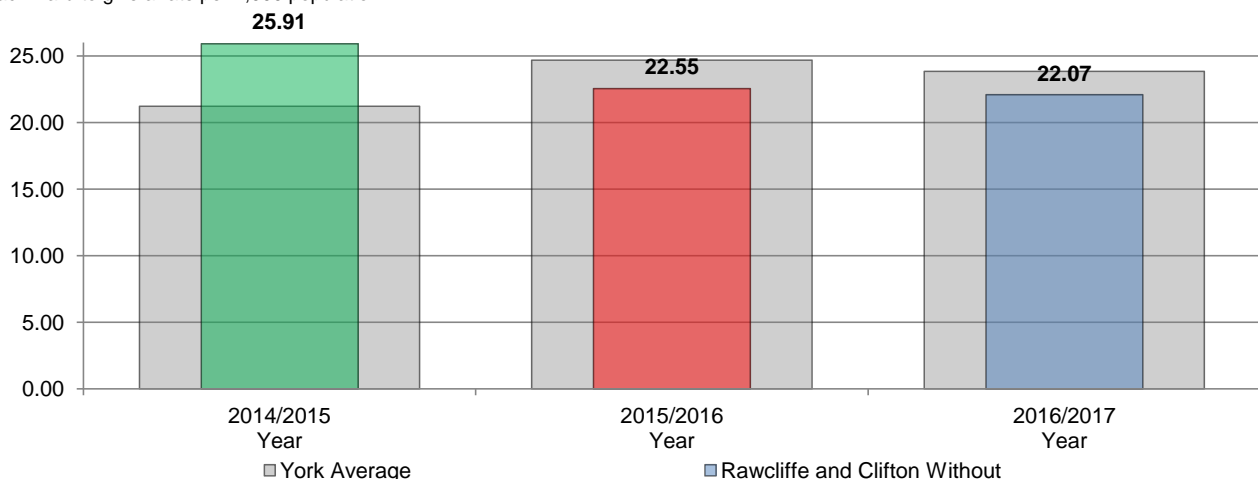

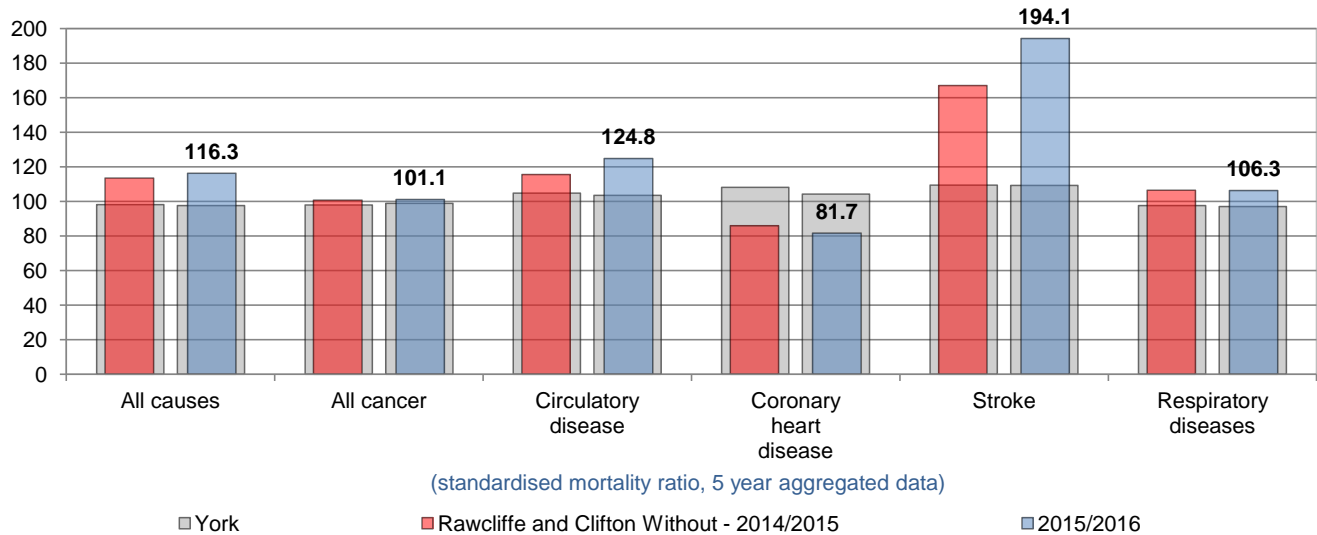

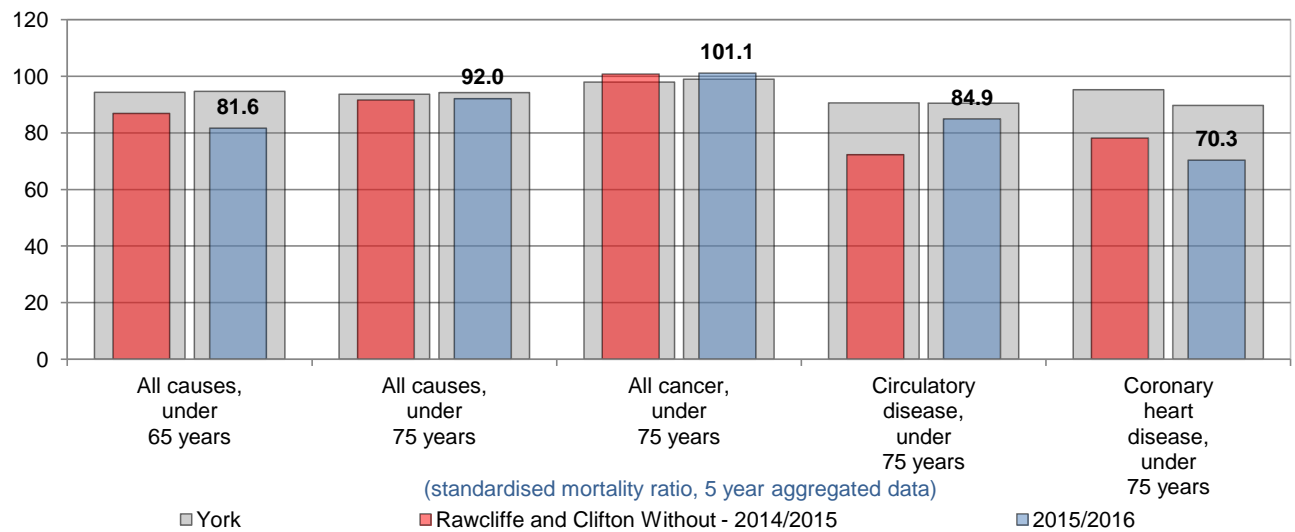

Mortality, All ages



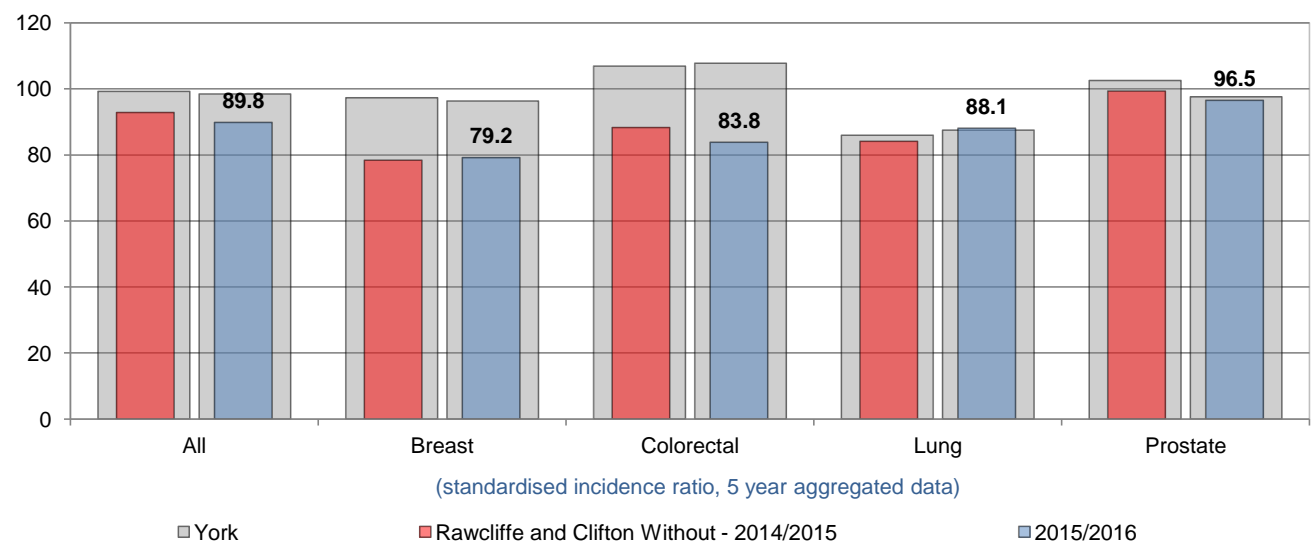

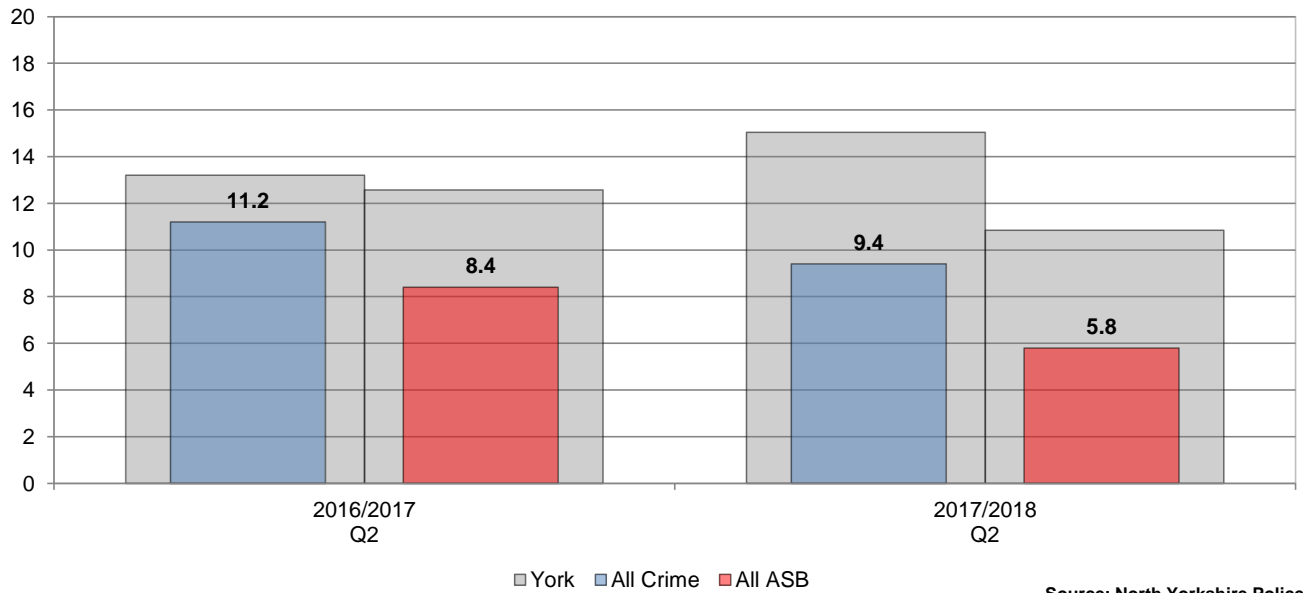

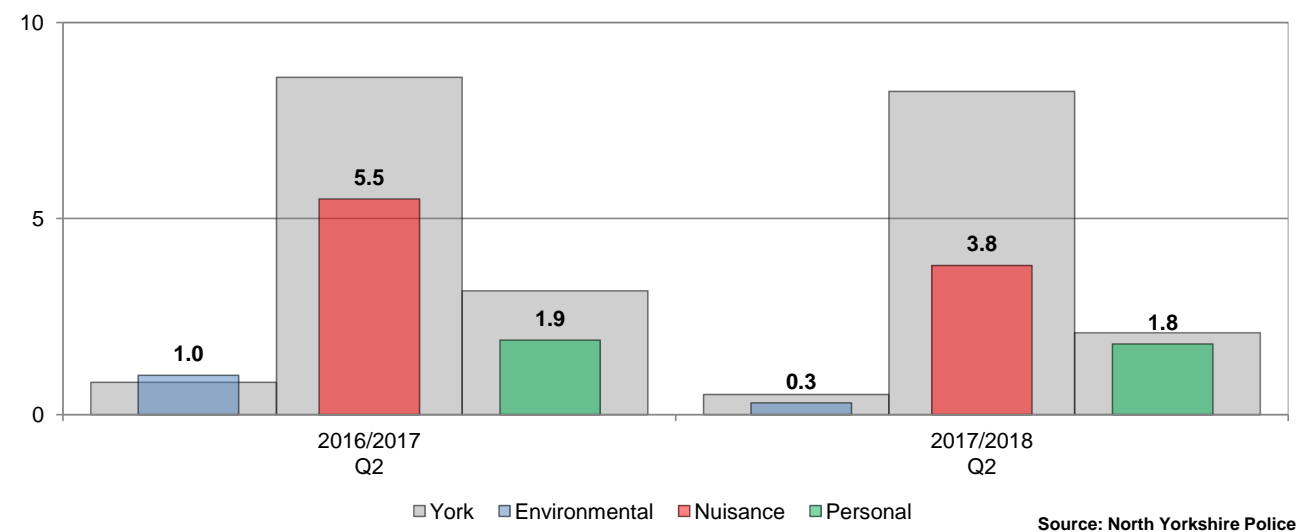

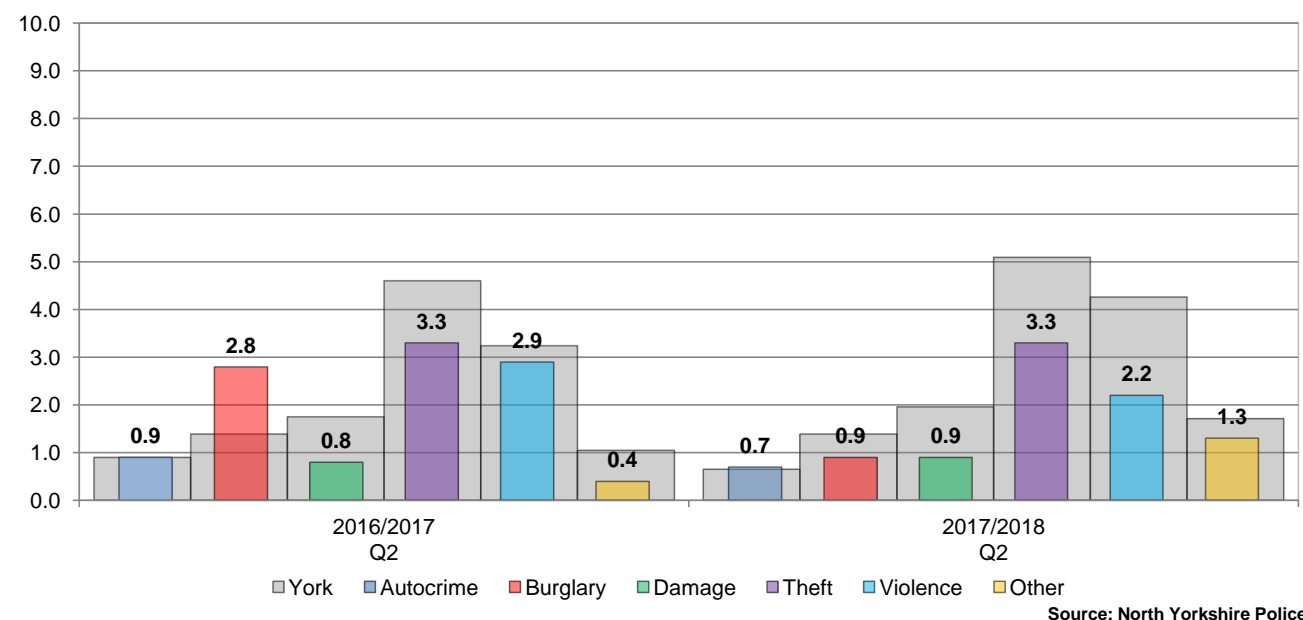
Total Crime and Total Anti-Social Behaviour per 1,000 population

Crime Rate per 1,000 population



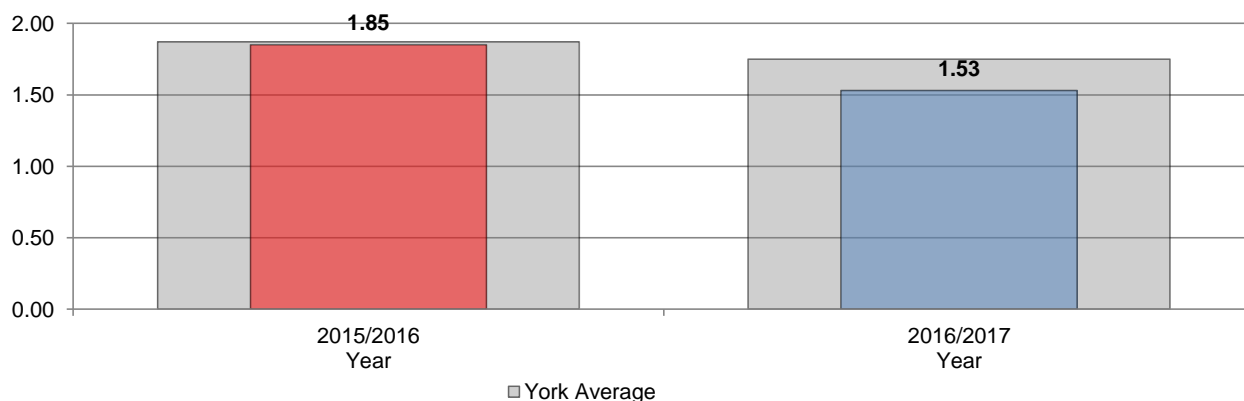

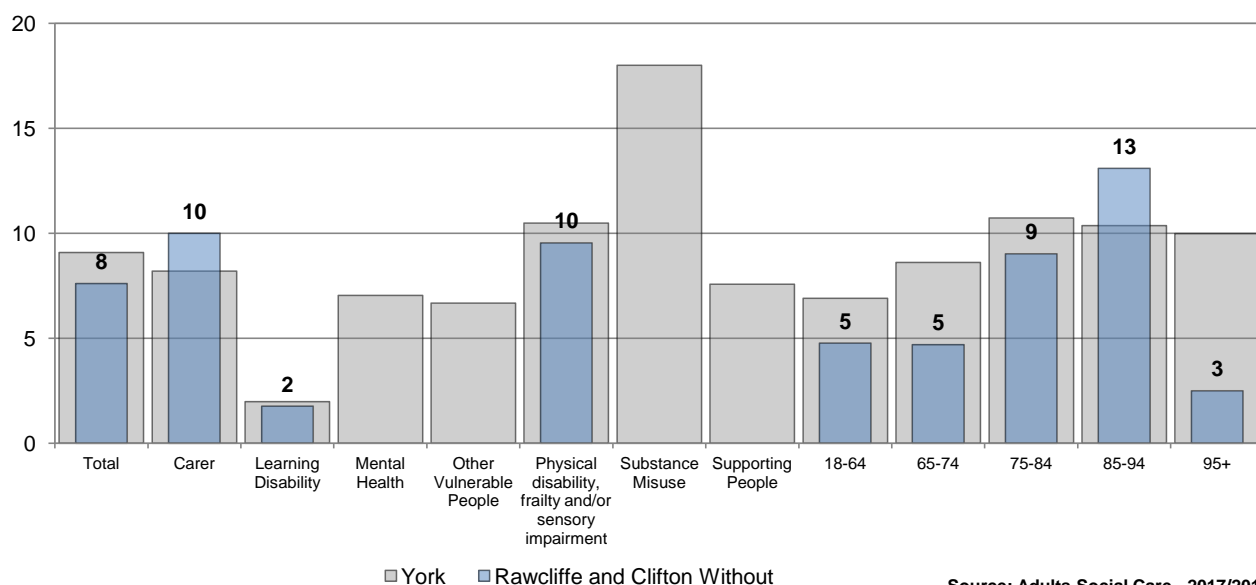
Social isolation

Social isolation: This is based on respondents to two questions on the Adult Social Care Survey regarding social contact and how time is spent. A score of 1 indicates that the respondent has plenty of social contact and that they spend their time doing things they enjoy. A score of 4 indicates that the respondent feels socially isolated and that they don't feel they do anything of value with their time. The mean of all respondents' responses to both questions is the score presented here.



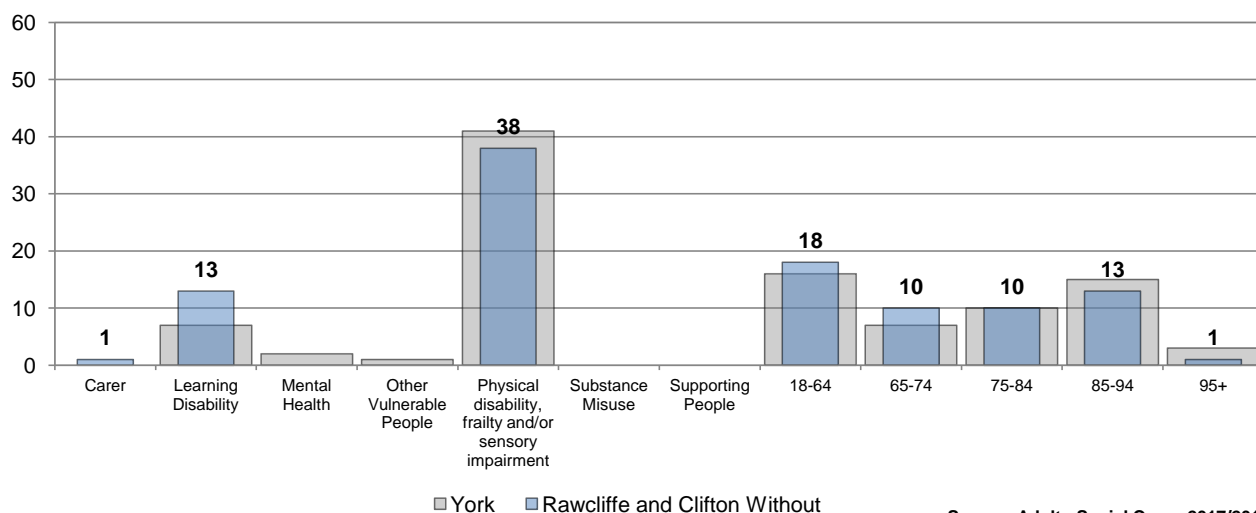

Homecare Clients by Type and Age

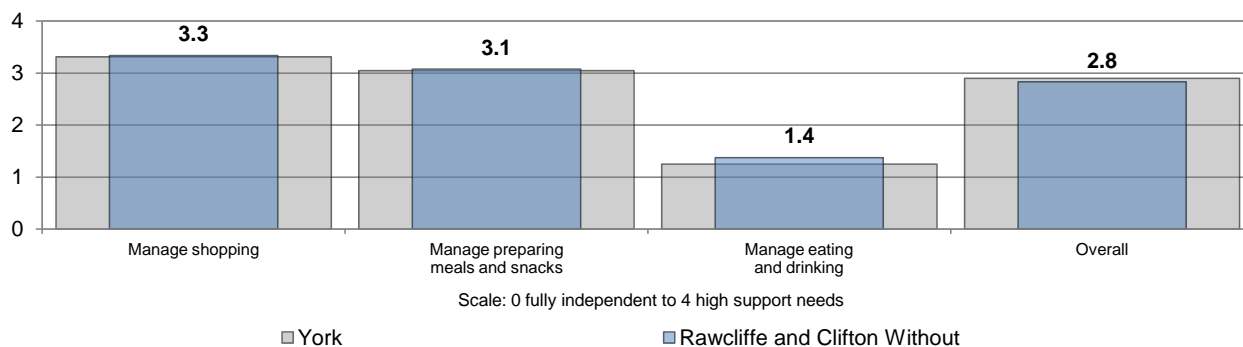

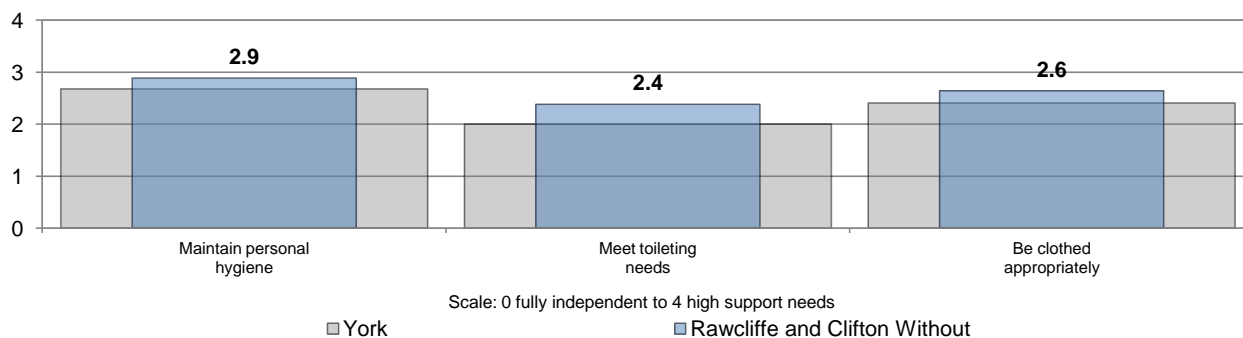

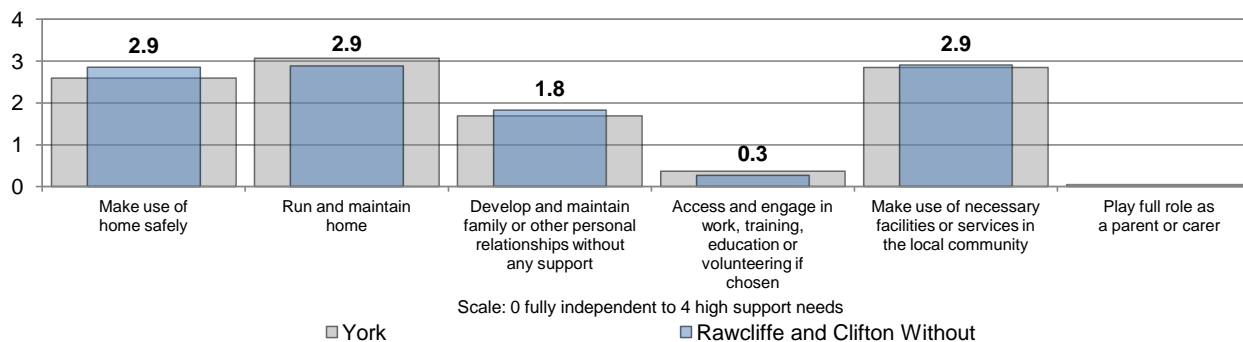

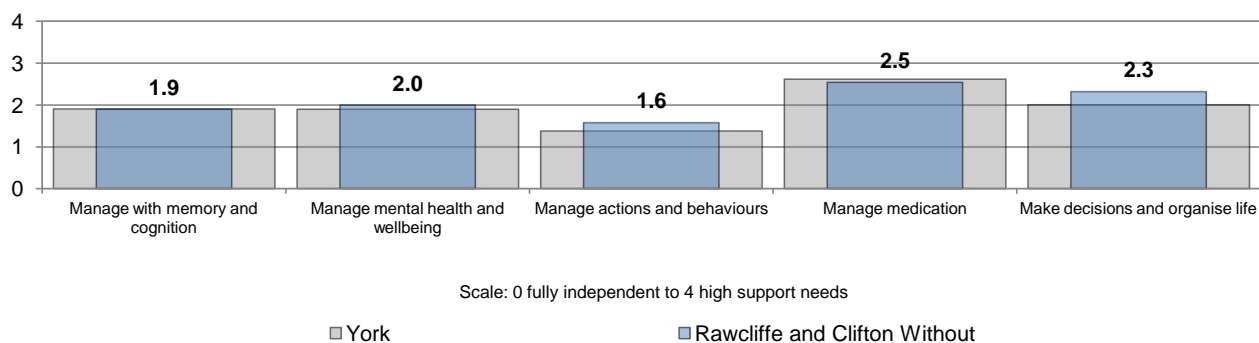

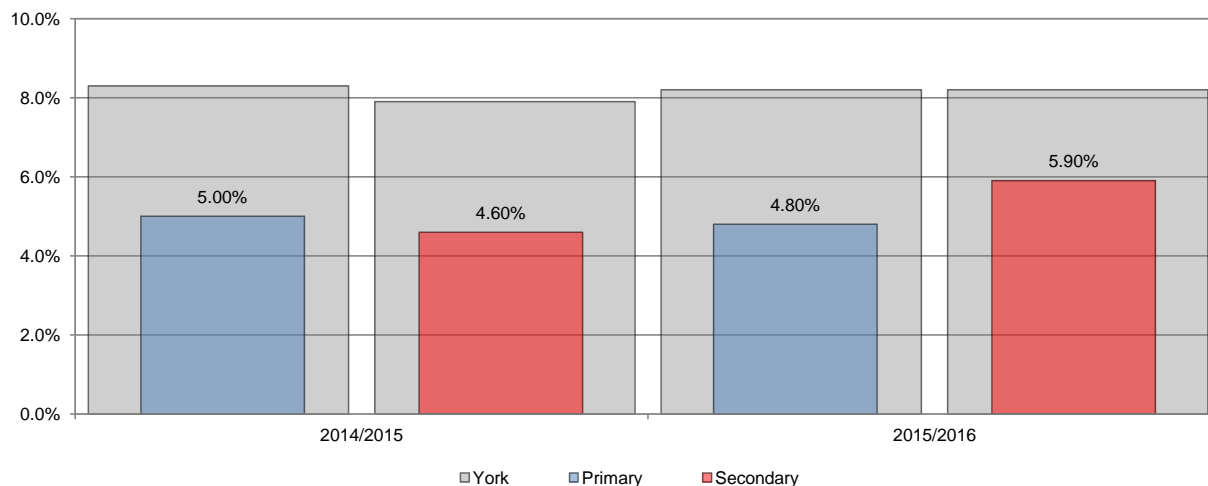

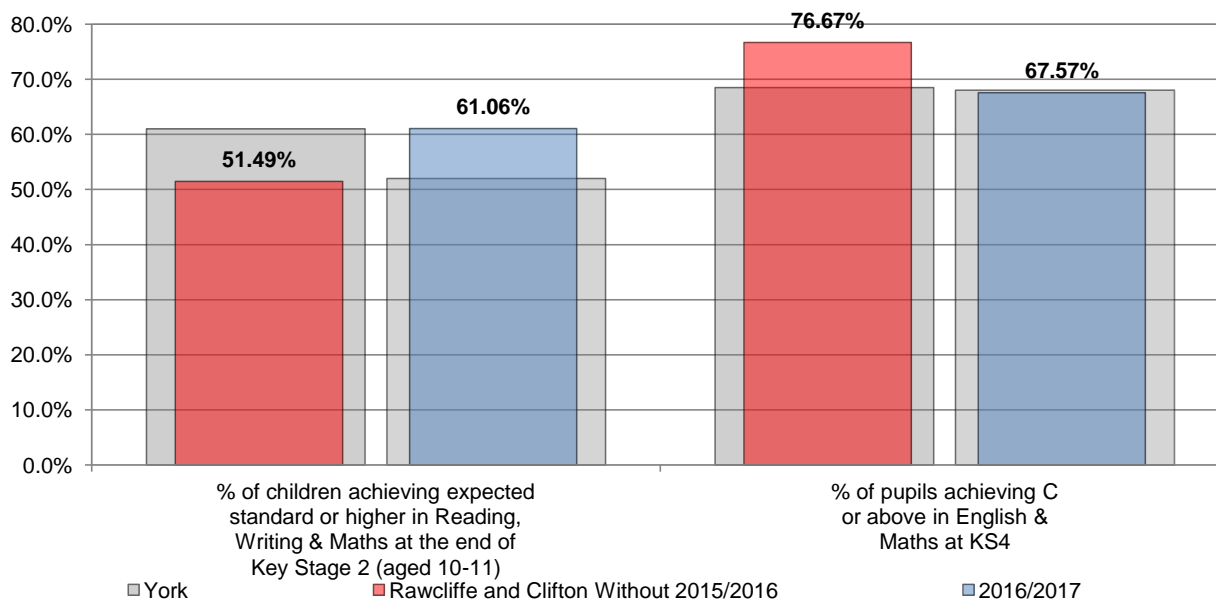

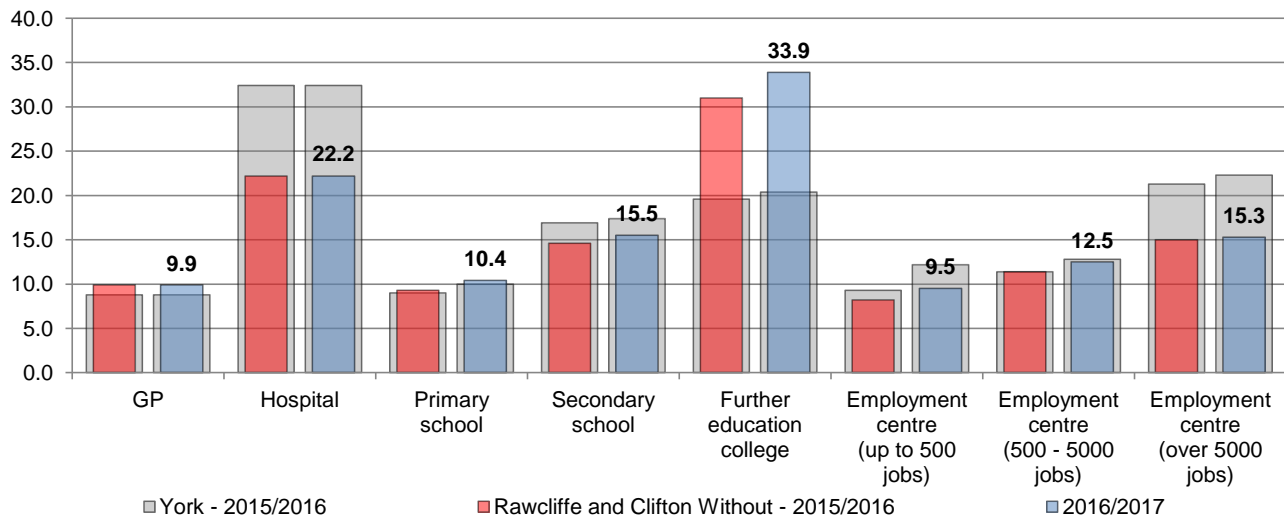

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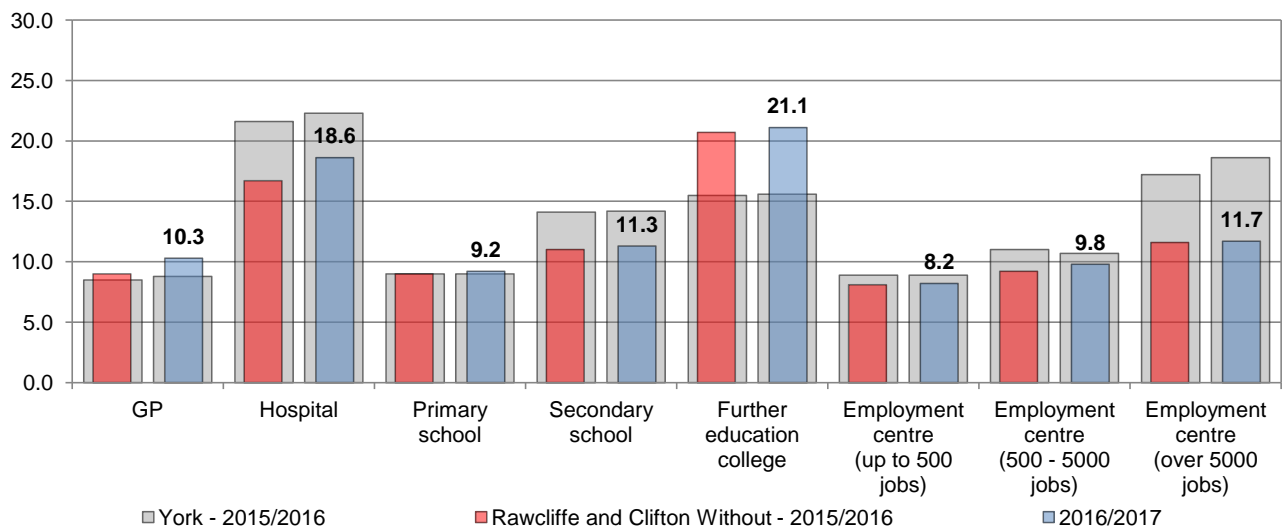
Access to local services

Travel time (minutes) by public transport / walking to nearest...



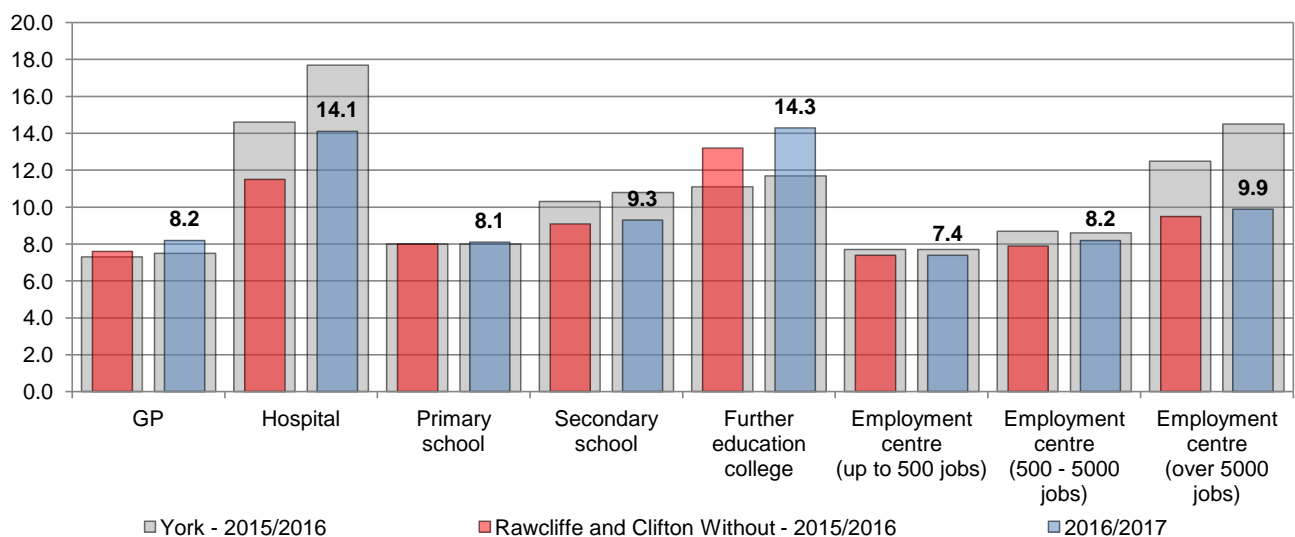

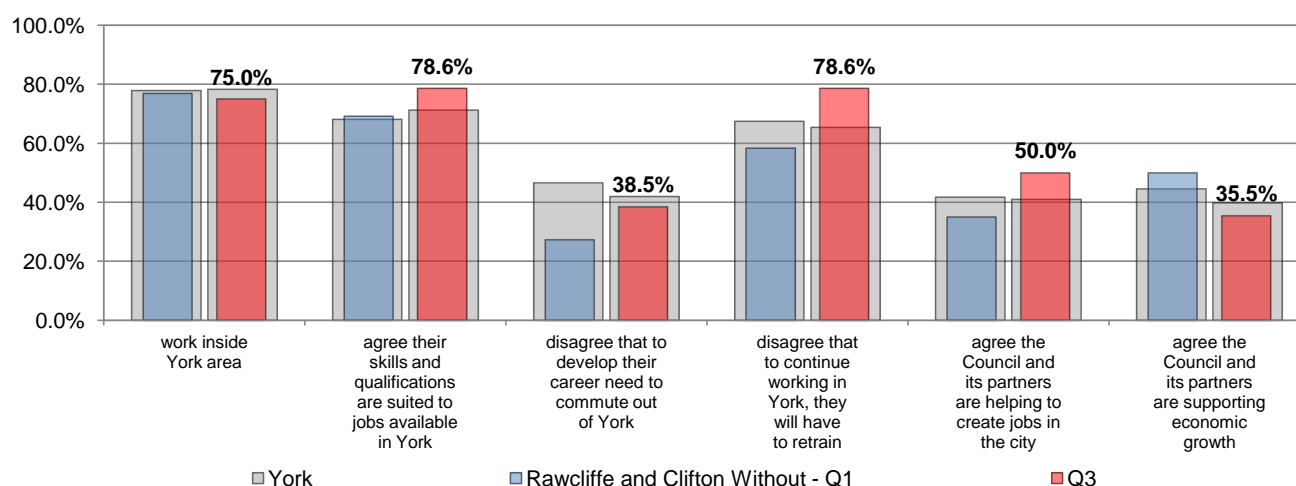

This data is based on House of Commons Library analysis of Ofcom's Connected Nations data. Ofcom collected and analysed data from major fixed telecoms operators (BT, Virgin Media, Sky, Talk Talk, Vodafone and KCOM). The availability data also includes coverage information provided by alternative network providers (B4RN, BU-UK, City Fibre, Gigaclear, Hyperoptic, ITS and Relish). Due to variations in broadband performance over time, Ofcom cautions that the data should not be regarded as a definitive and fixed view of the broadband infrastructure but rather a snapshot of current variation in availability and performance across the country.

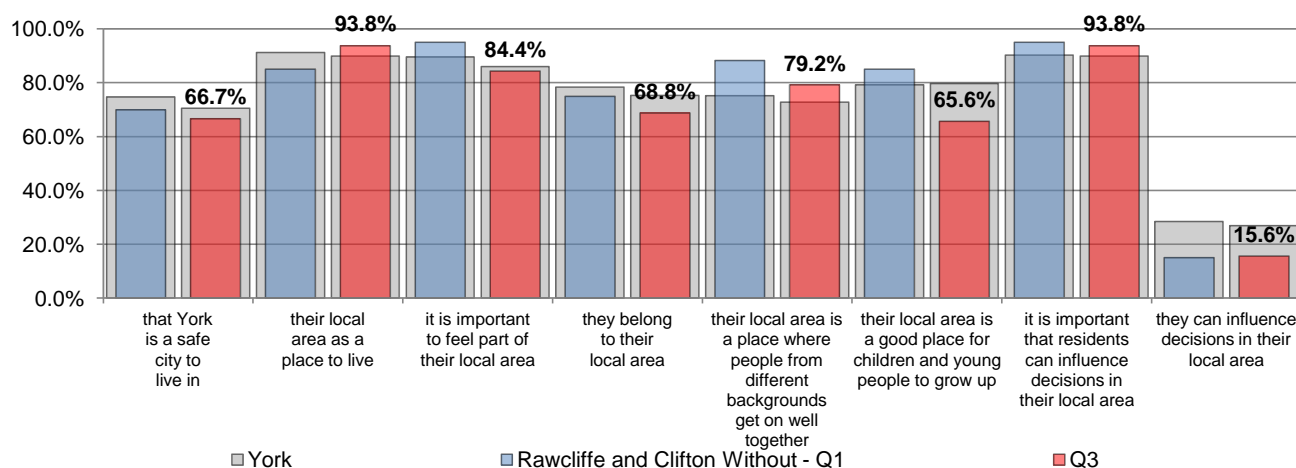

Respondents were asked to consider their Local Area as the area within 15-20 minutes walking distance from their home

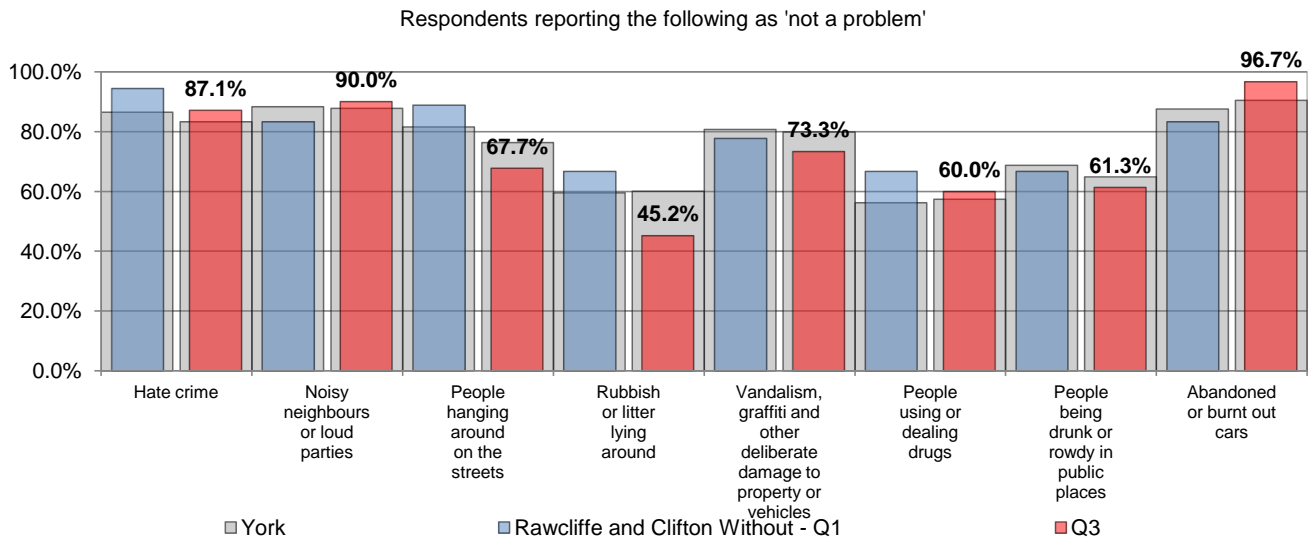

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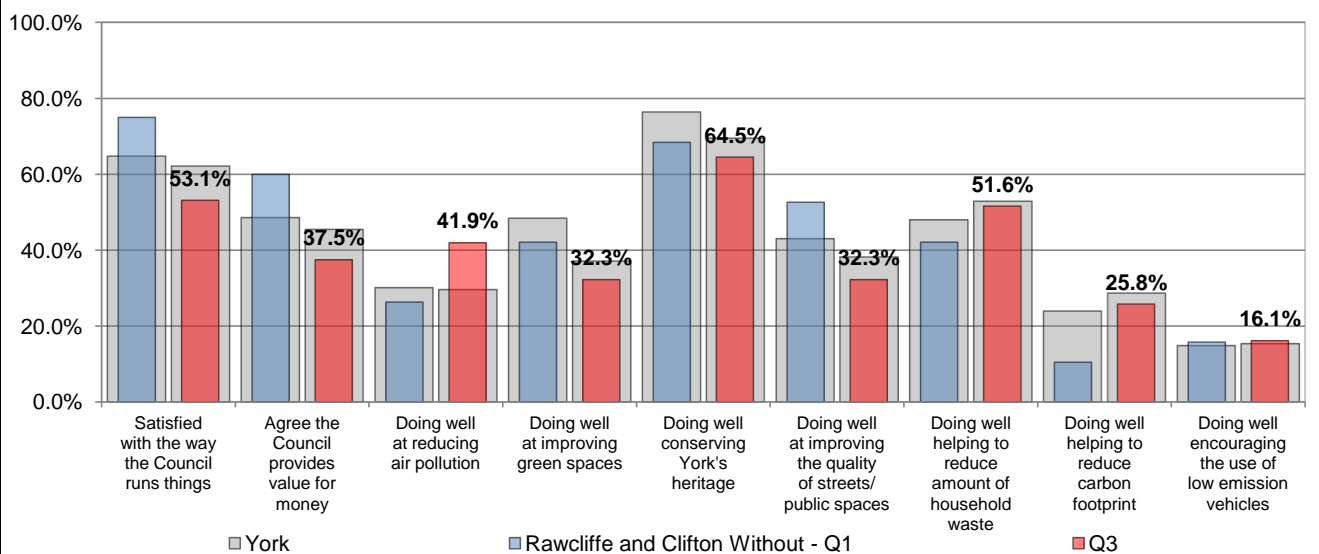
Resident satisfaction responses about Public Realm in their Local Area

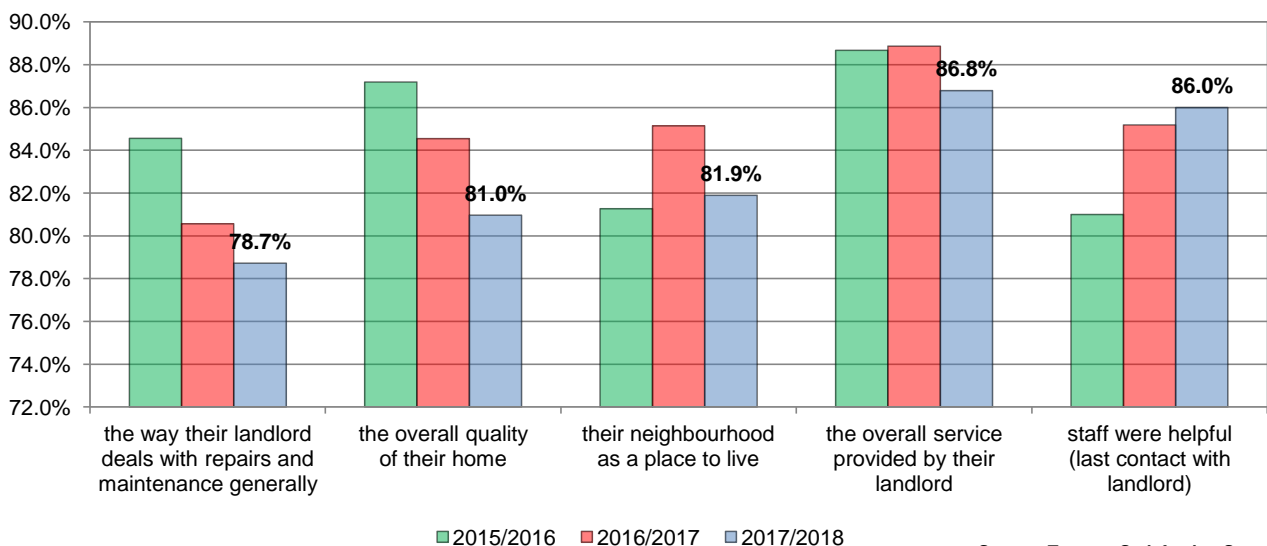
Resident satisfaction responses about the Council (and partners)

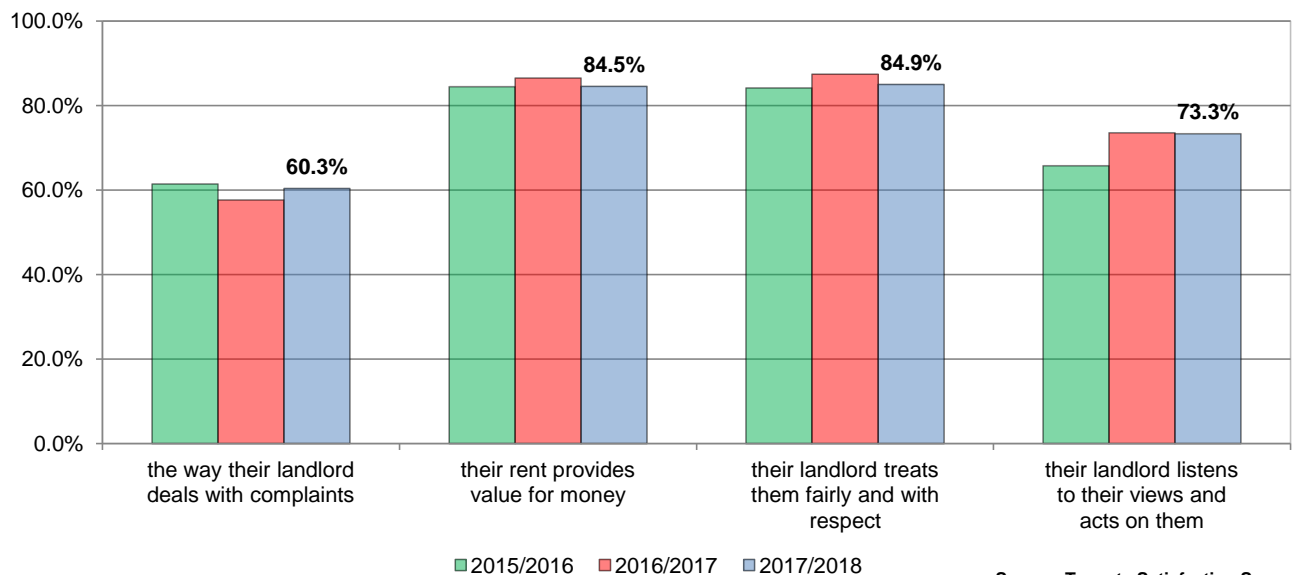
York Council house tenants satisfied with / agree that...



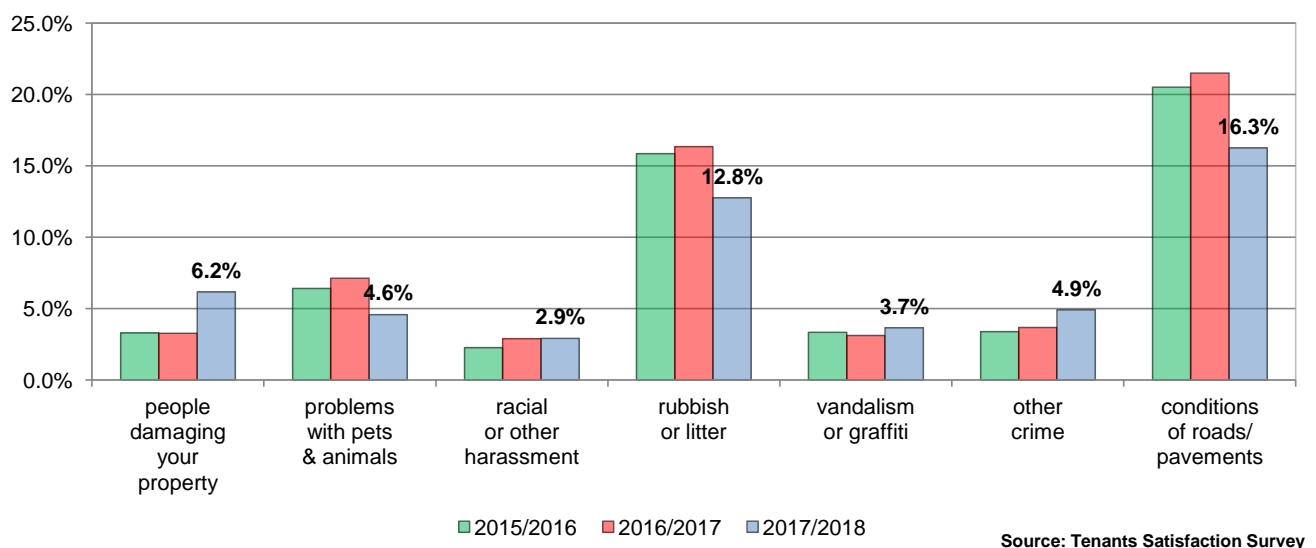
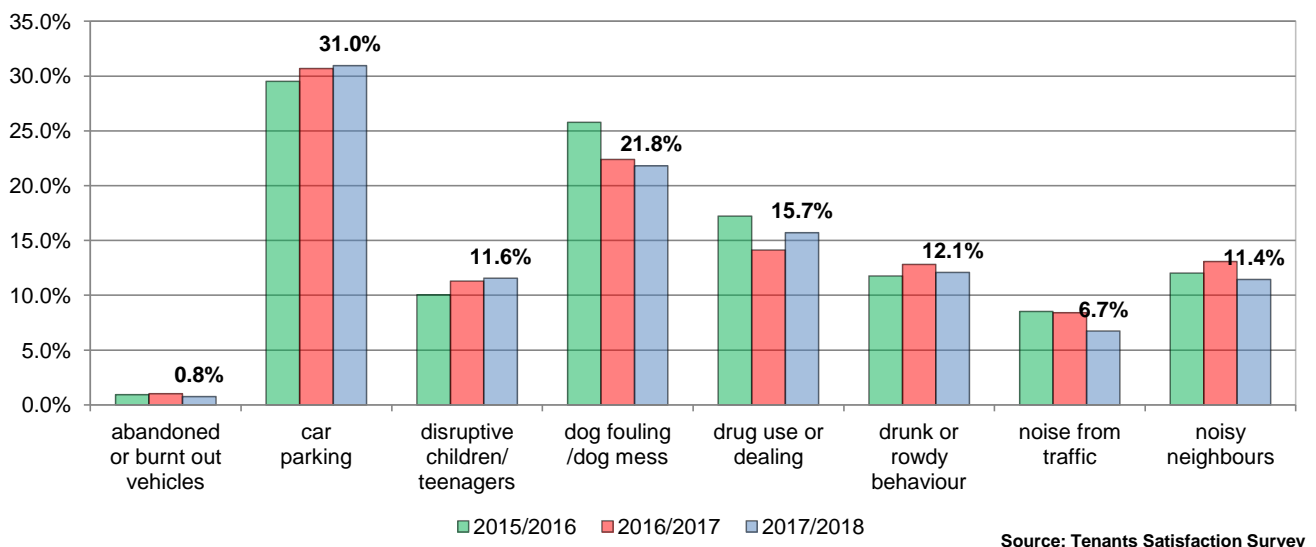

D16 Mid-Career Convention Married couples with kids, traditional suburbs, professional jobs, likely to have life cover, high proportion with mortgage.
H31 First-Rung Futures Younger couples and singles, own 2 or 3 bed semis and terraces, affordable suburbs, have lived there under 4 years, buy and sell on ebay.
