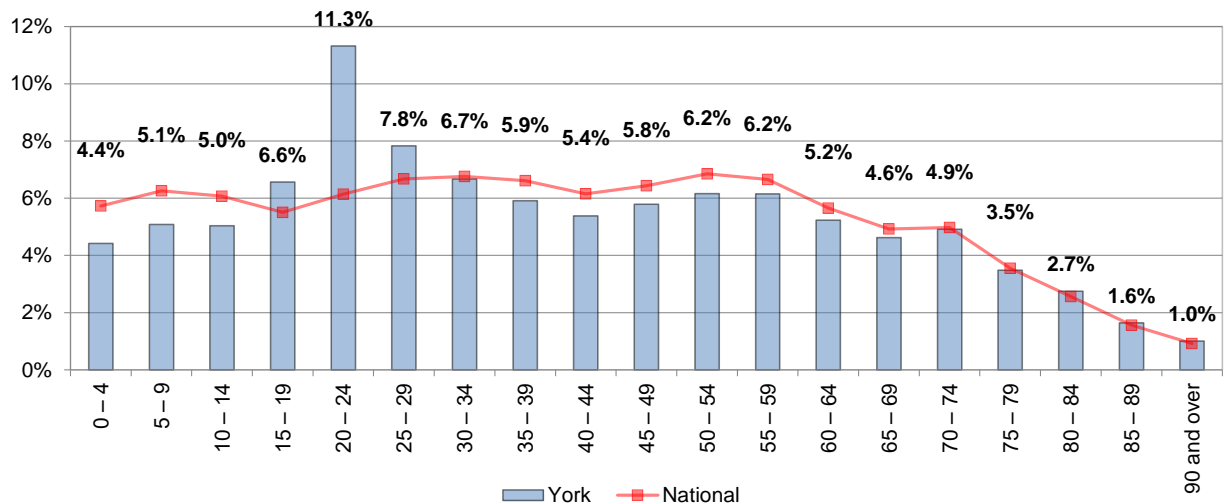

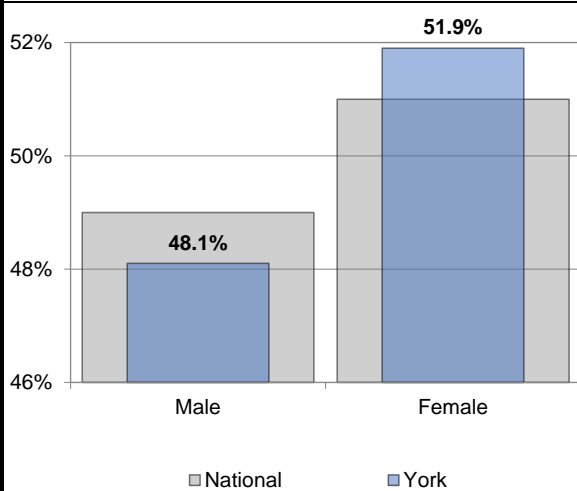
Population by Age

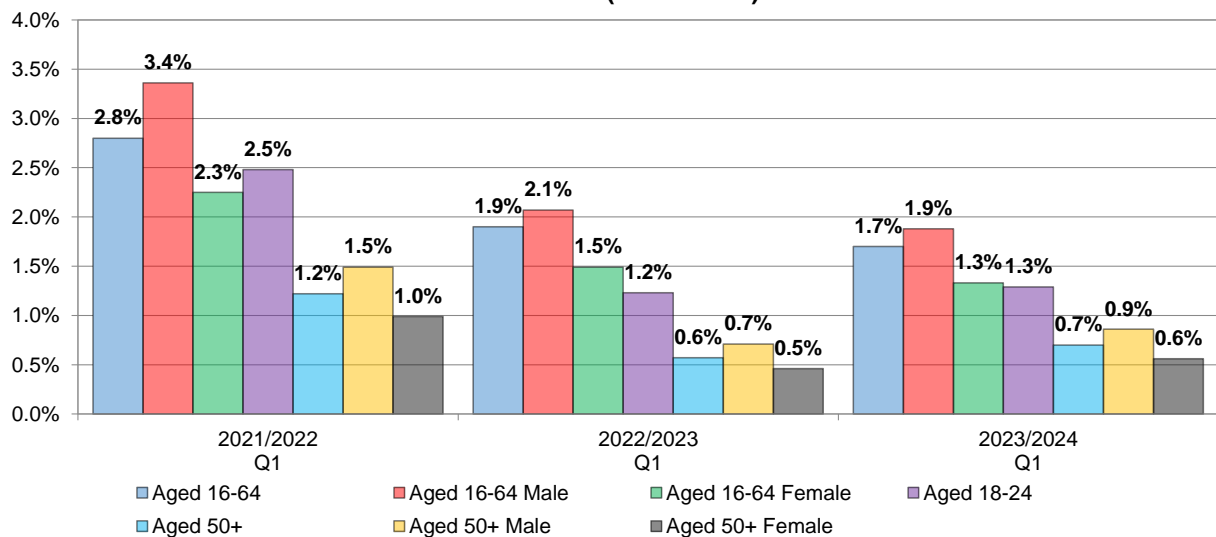

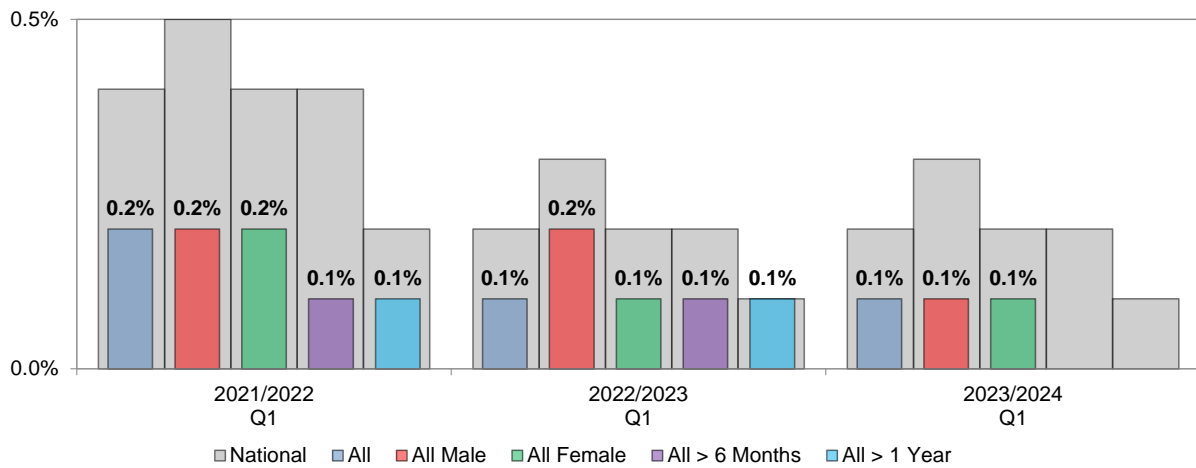


JSA and Universal Credit (out of work) Claimant Rate



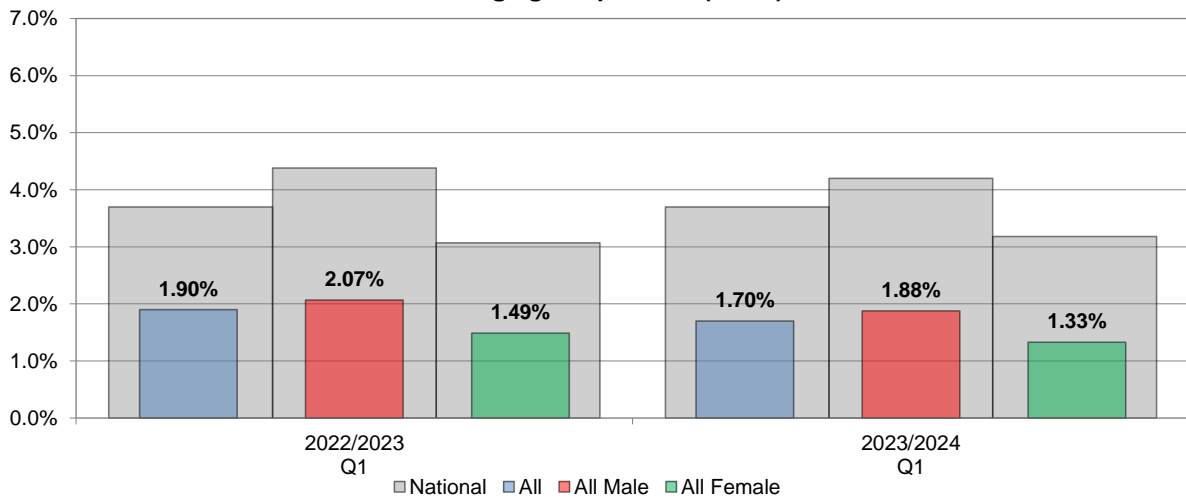

The proportion of children (under 16) who are living in families whose reported income is less than 60 per cent of UK median income

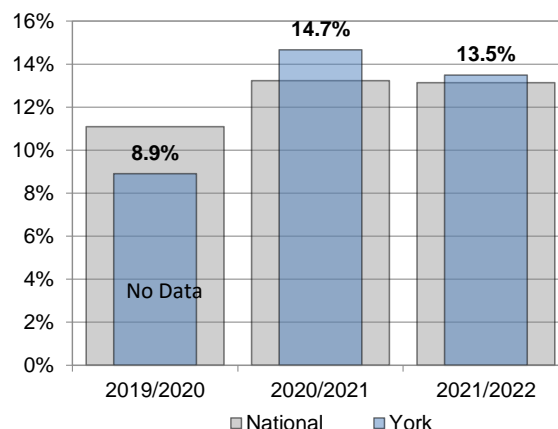

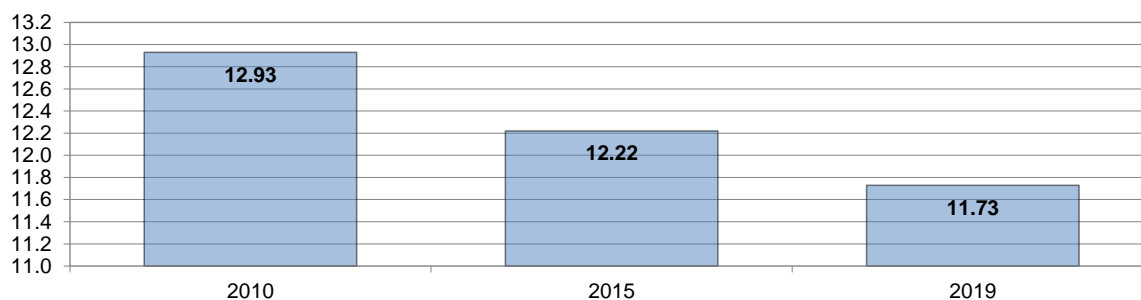

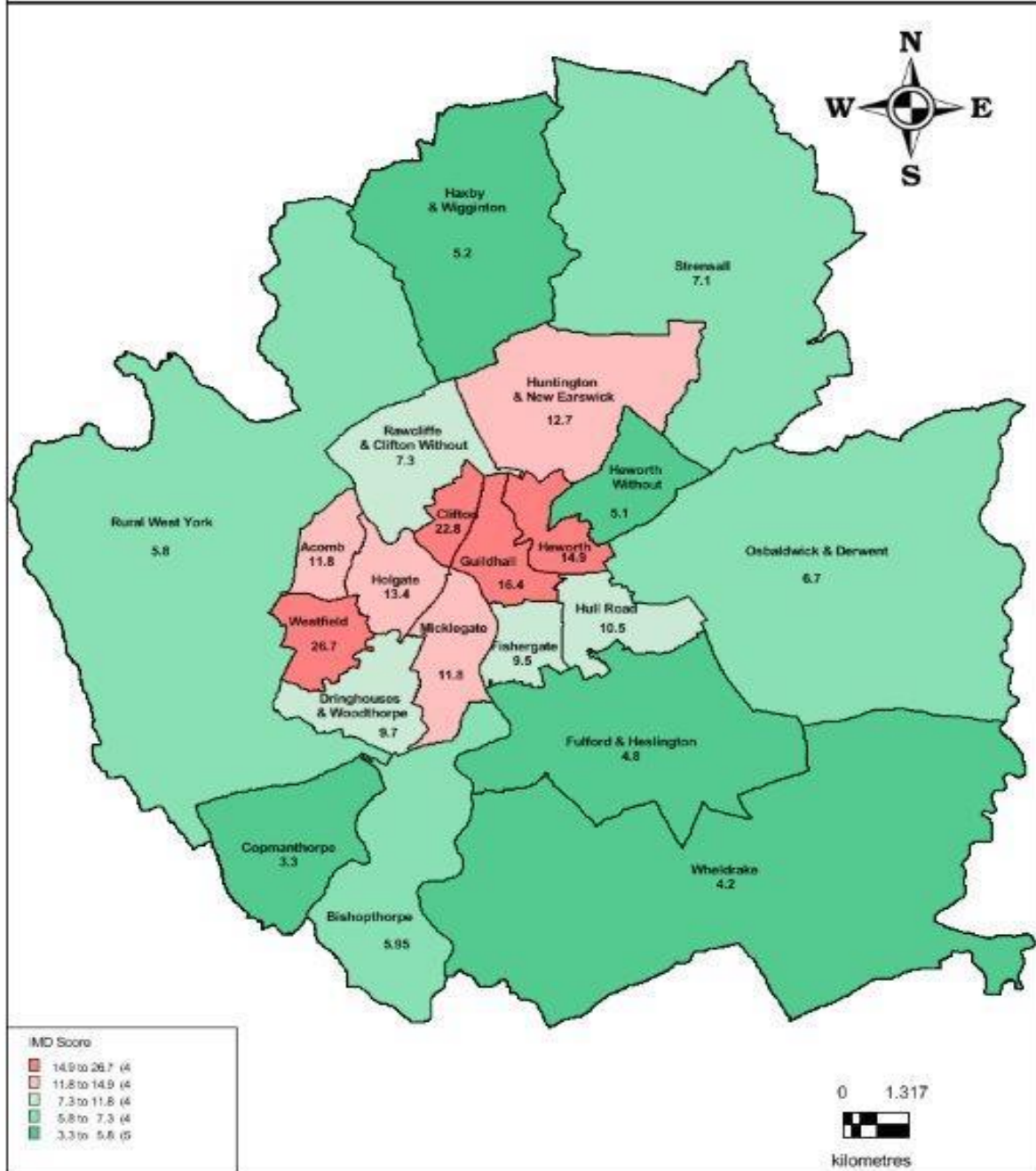

Deprivation Score for Wards in York (IMD 2019)

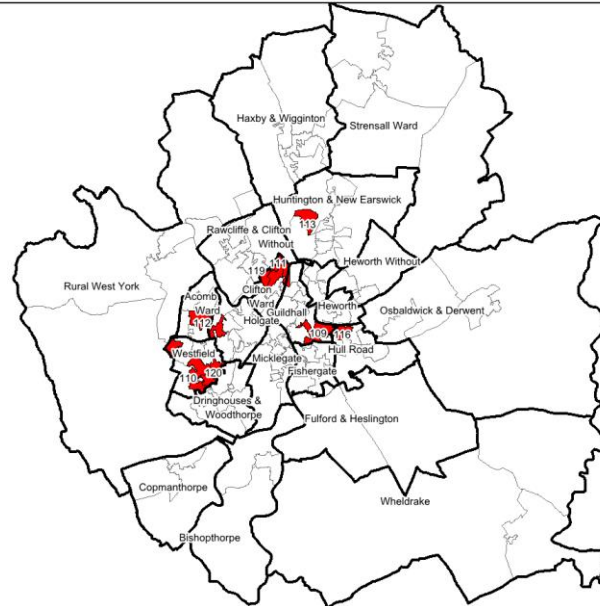


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Indices of Multiple Deprivation - Decile 10 (York's most deprived LSOA's)



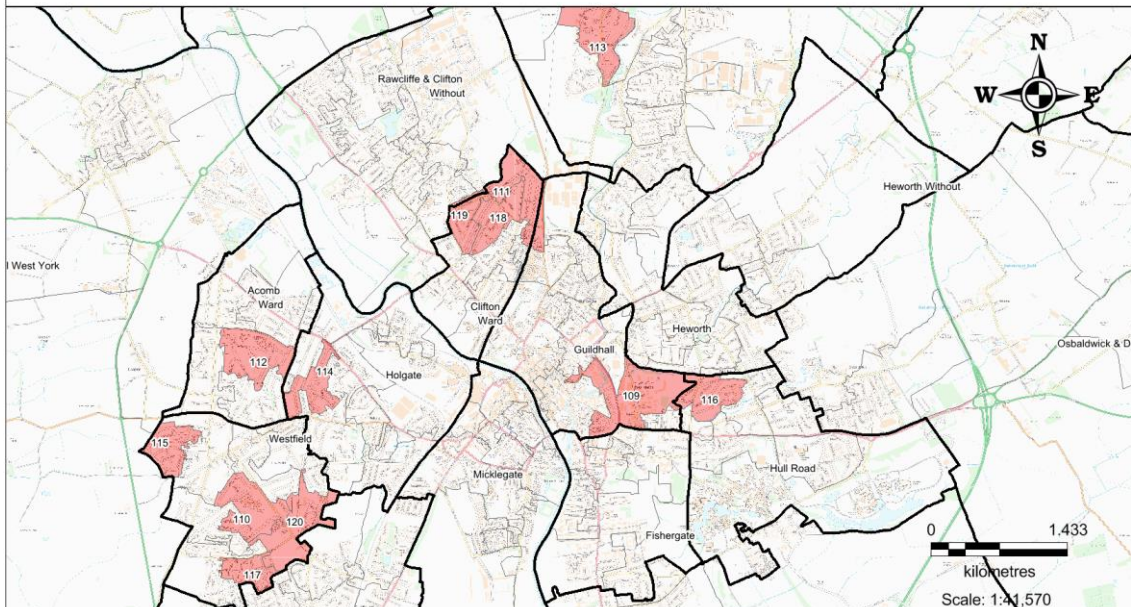

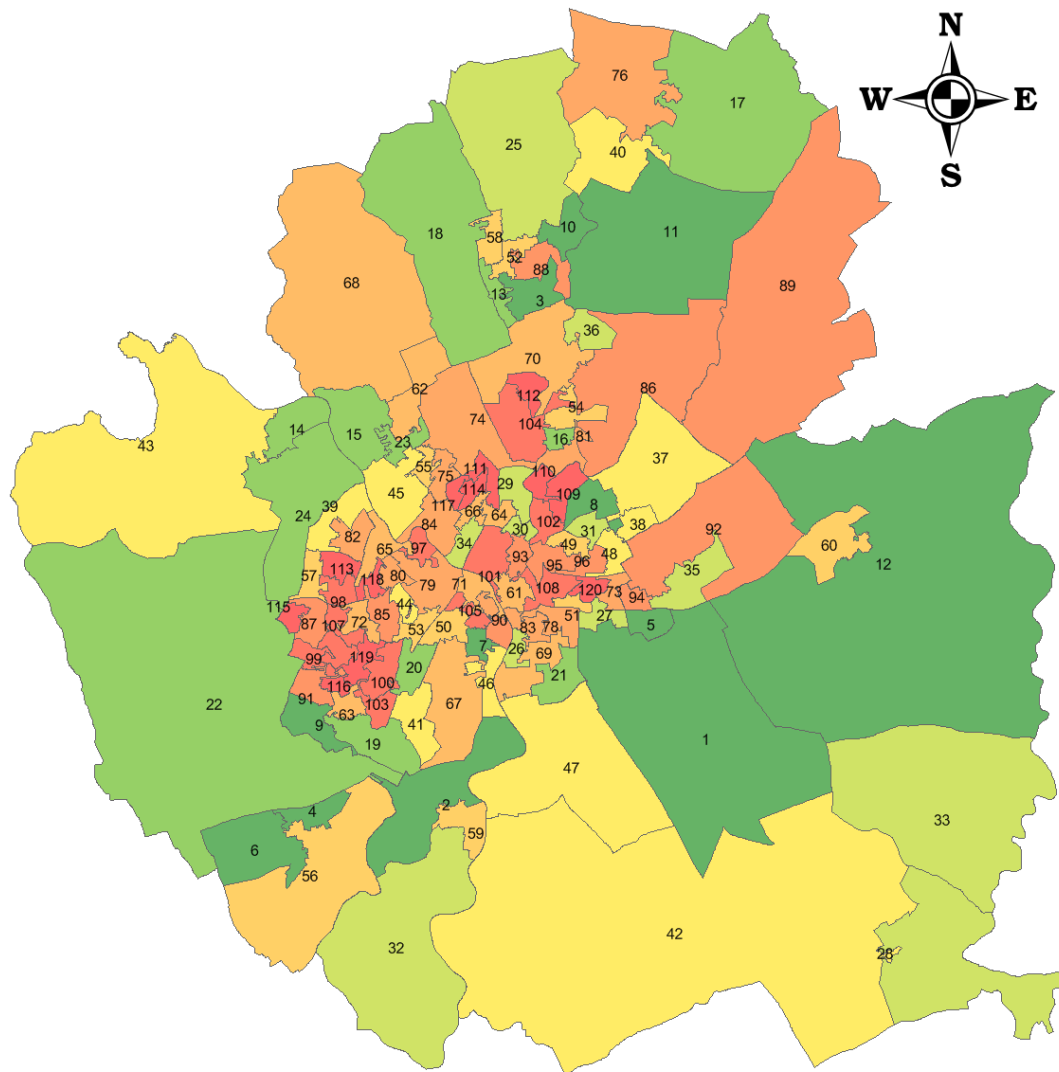
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Index of Income Deprivation 2019 - Rank for each LSOA within York

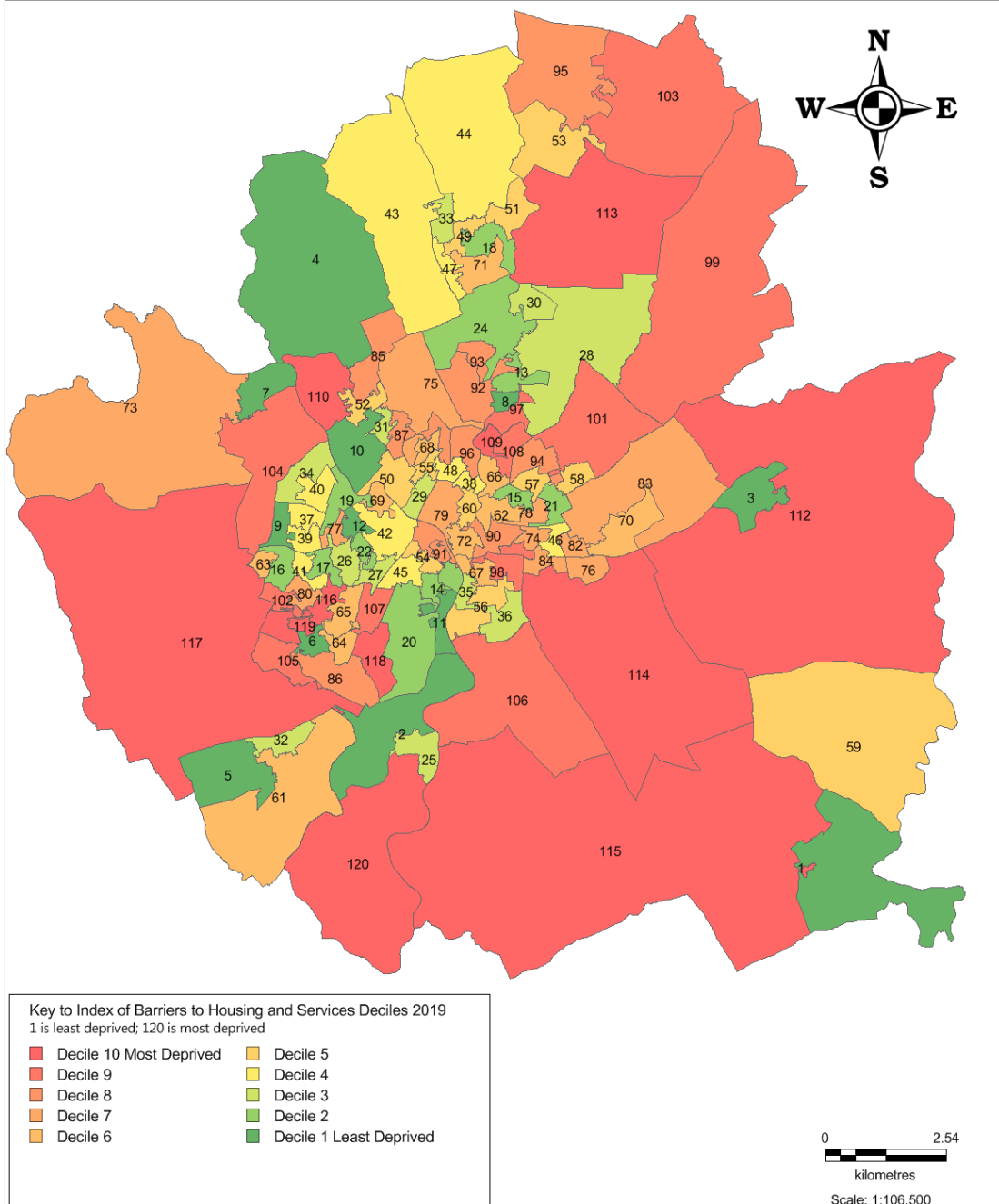

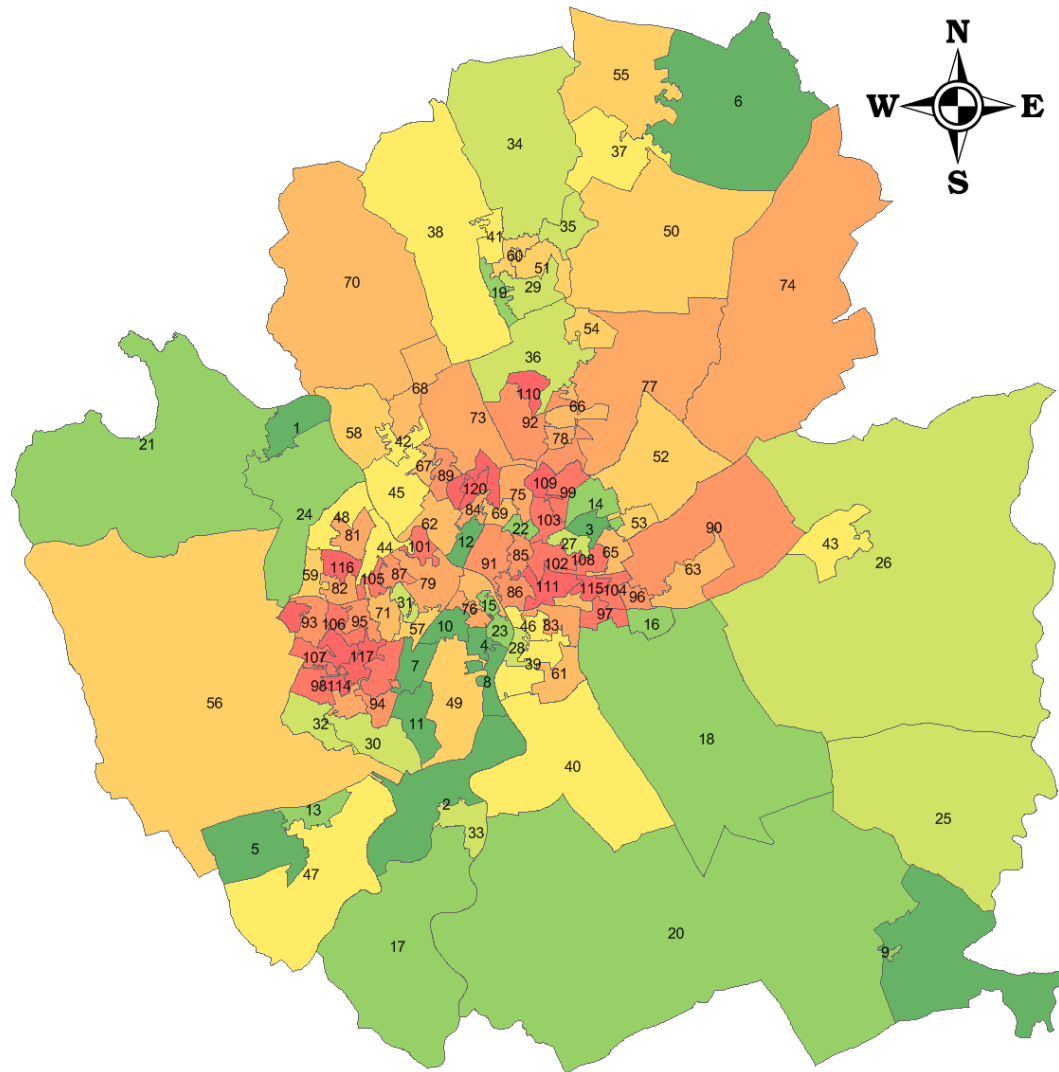
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Index of Education Deprivation 2019 - Rank for each LSOA within York

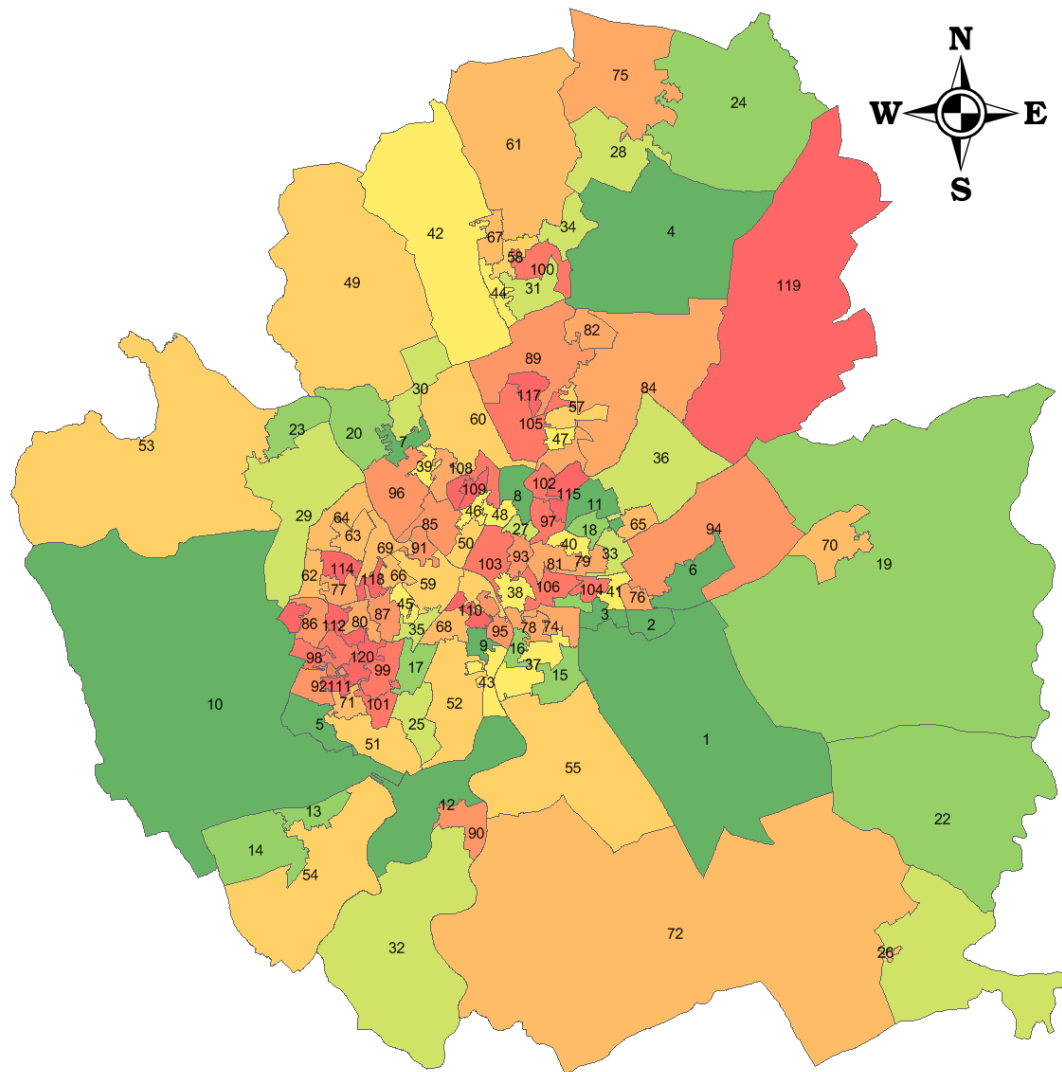

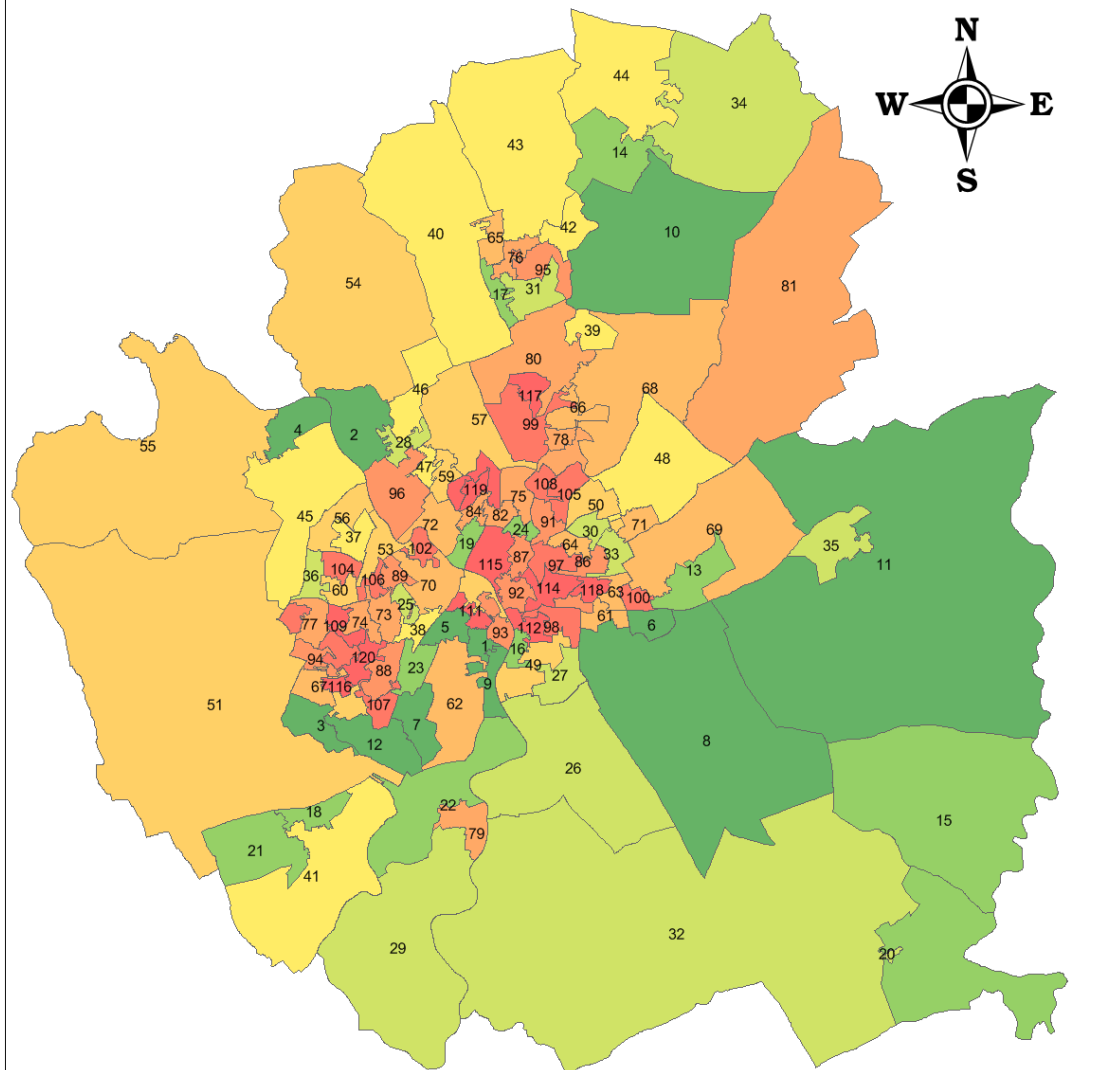
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Index of Health Deprivation 2019 - Rank for each LSOA within York

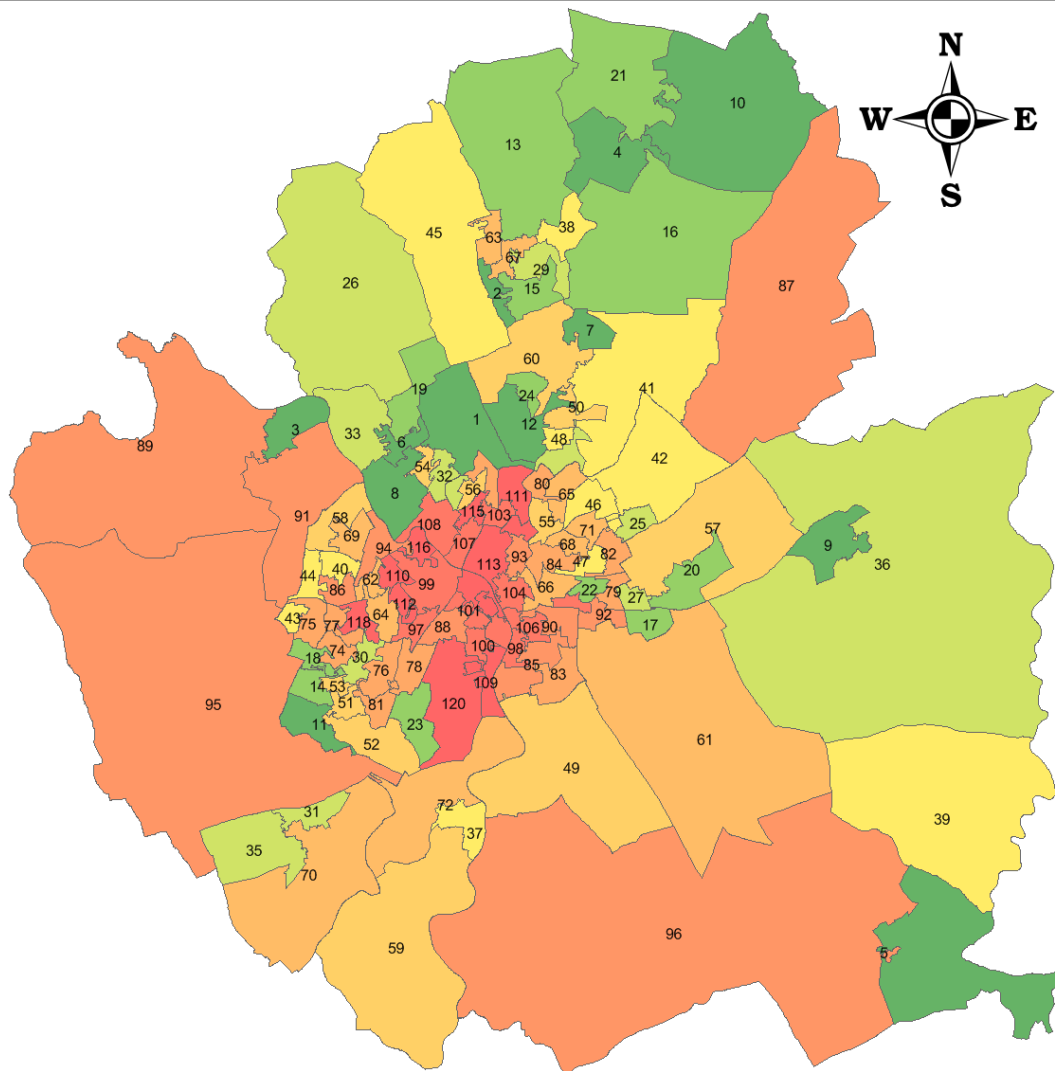
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Index of Living Environment Deprivation 2019 Rank for each LSOA within York

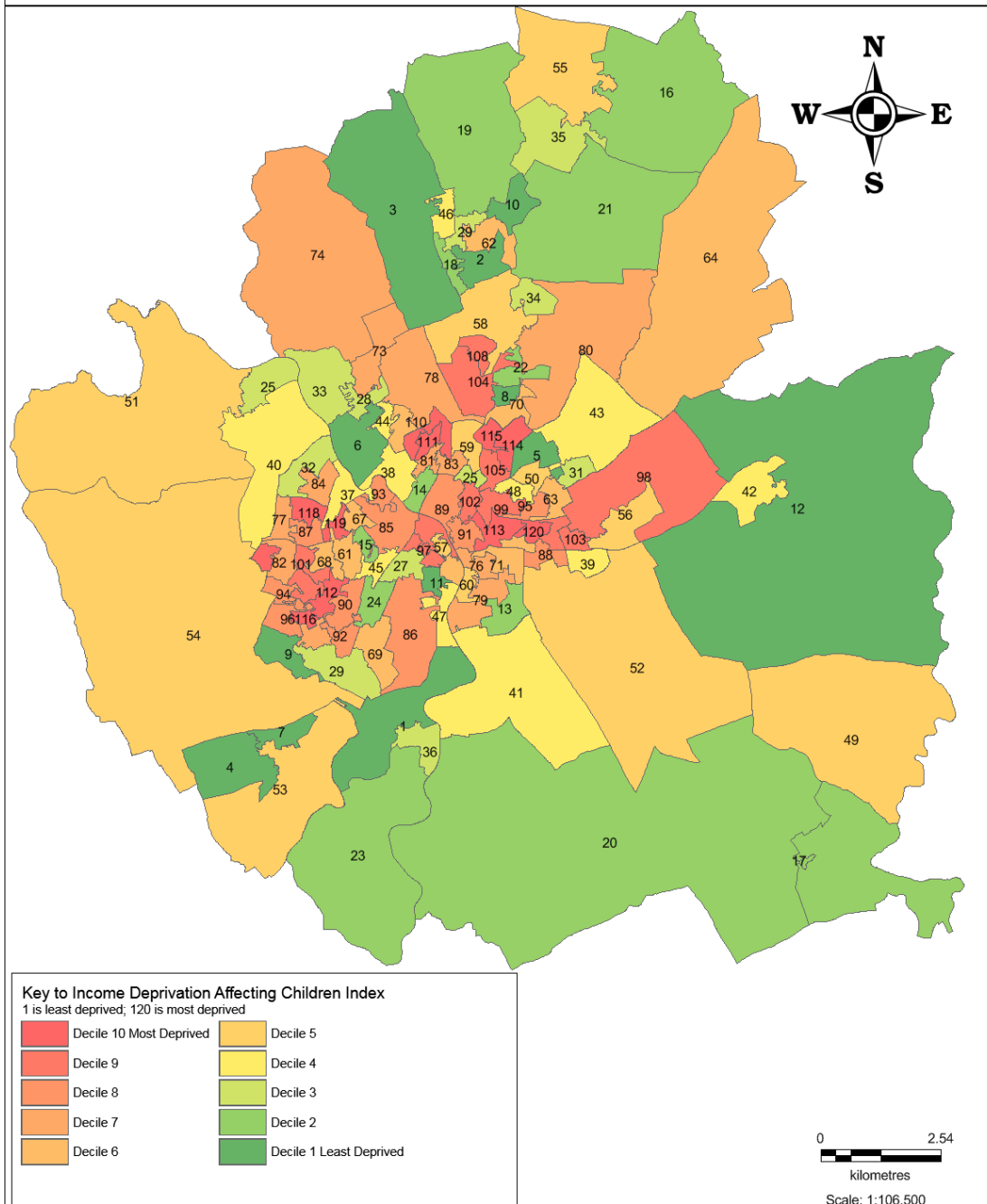
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Income Deprivation Affecting Children 2019 Rank for each LSOA within York

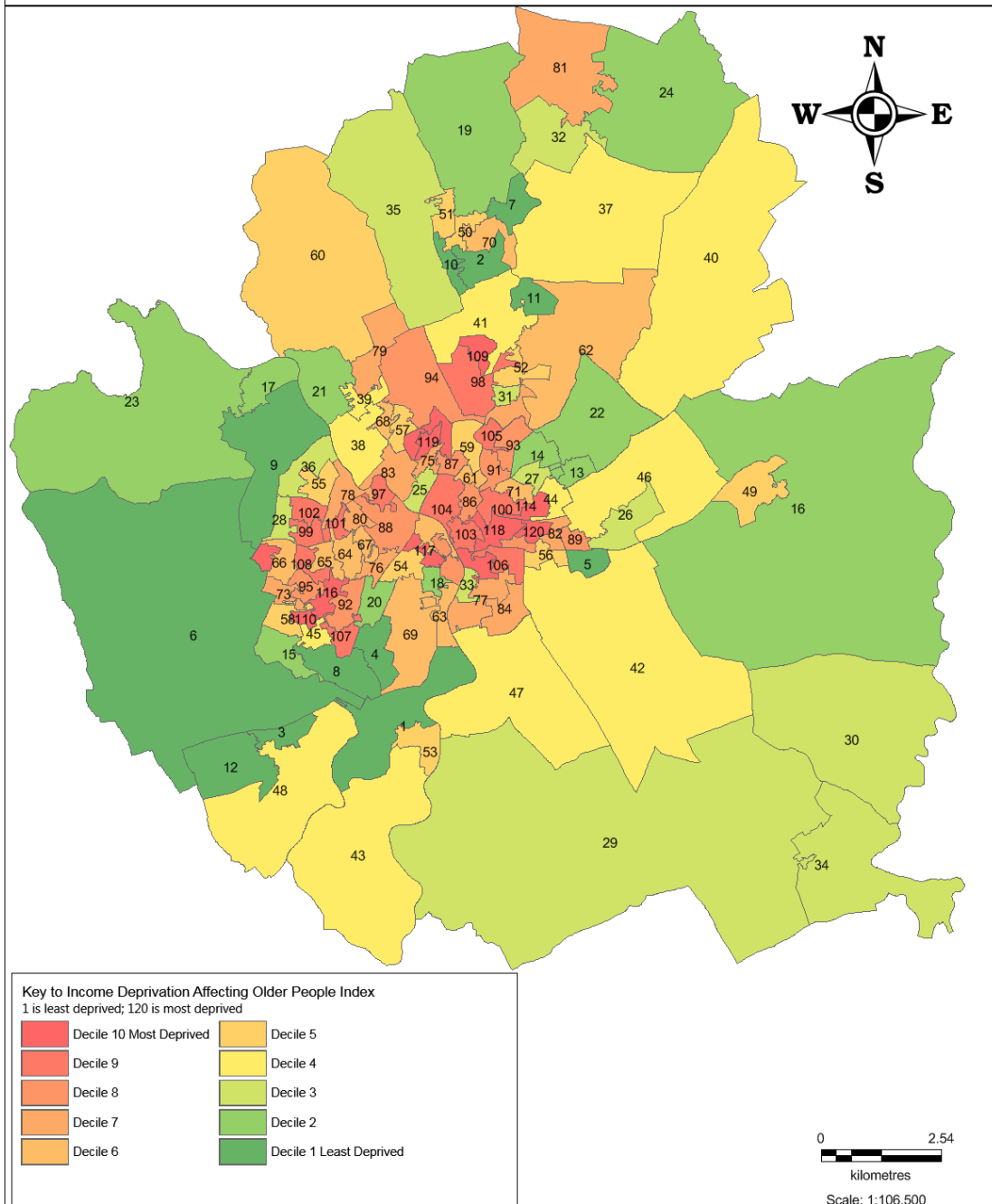

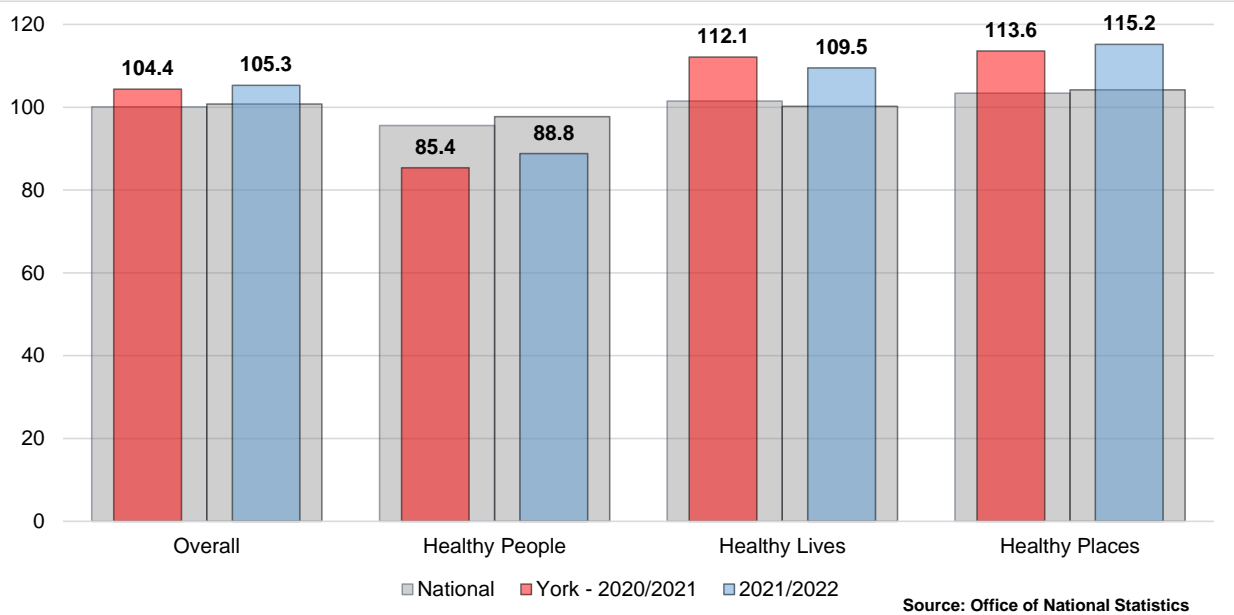

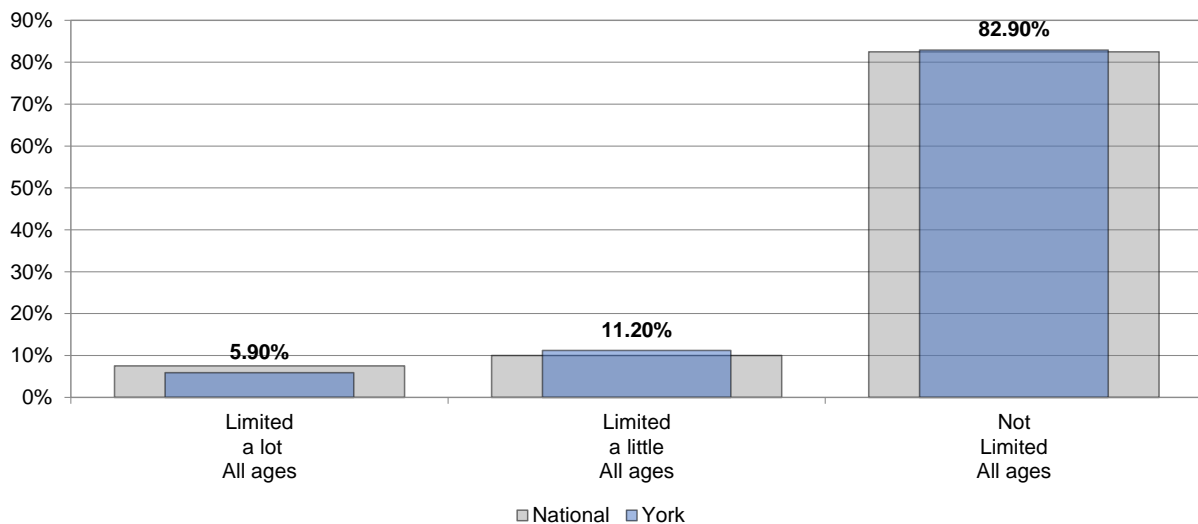
The Index is split into three domains:

- Healthy People focusing on health outcomes
- Healthy Lives focusing on health-related behaviours and personal circumstances
- Healthy Places focusing on wider determinants of health, environmental factors



The Health Index has been scaled to a base of 100 for England, with base year of 2015. Values higher than 100 indicate better health than England 2015, and values below 100 indicate worse health. The scale is such for indicators at LTLA level that a score of 110 represents a score one standard deviation higher than England's 2015 score for that same indicator, 120 represents a value two standard deviations higher, and so on.

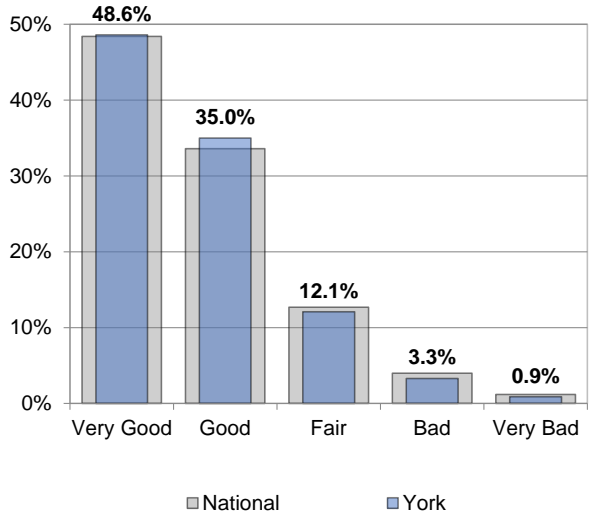

Percentage of children breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks

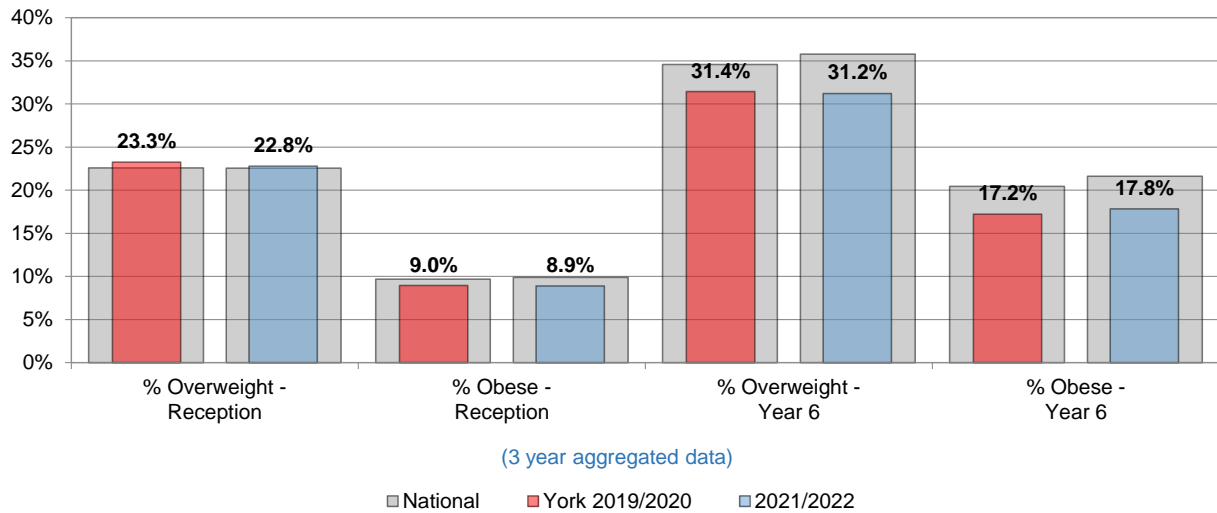

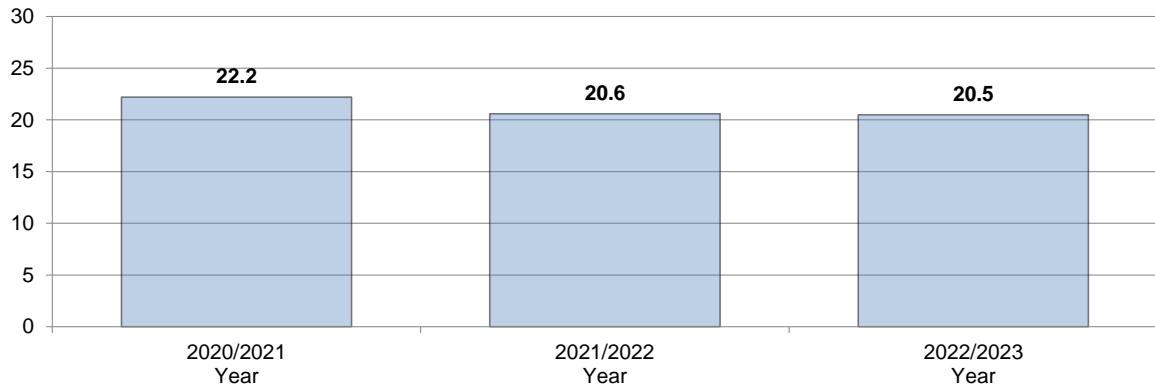

Emergency hospital admissions for injuries resulting from a fall (over 65), per 1,000 population

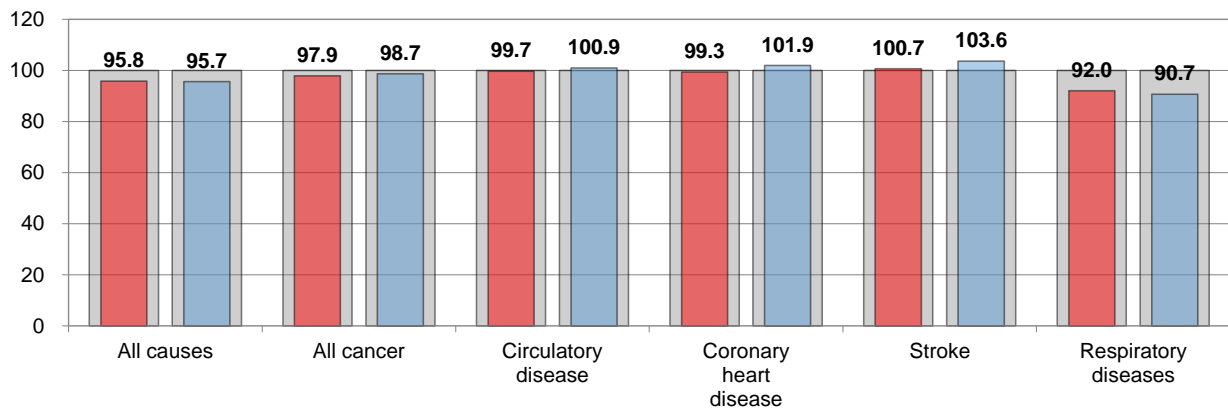

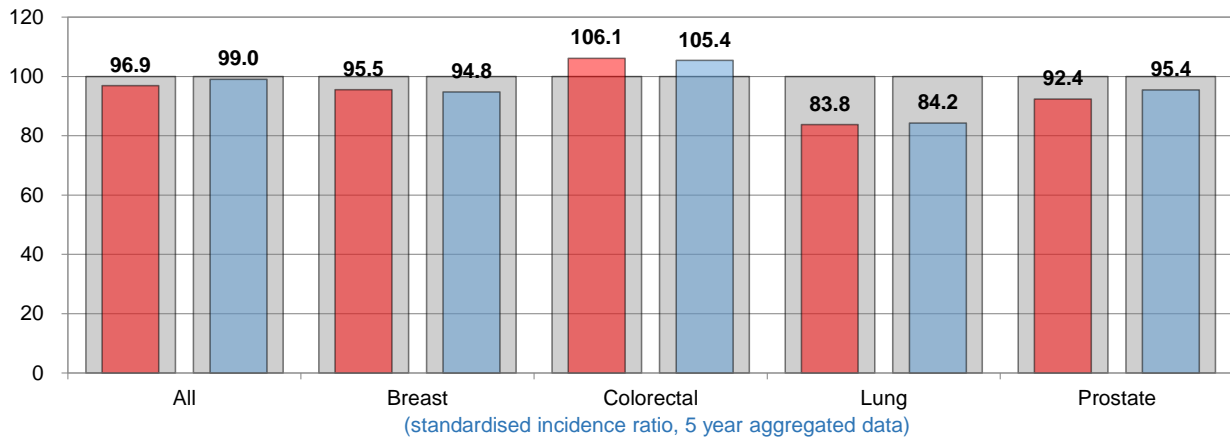

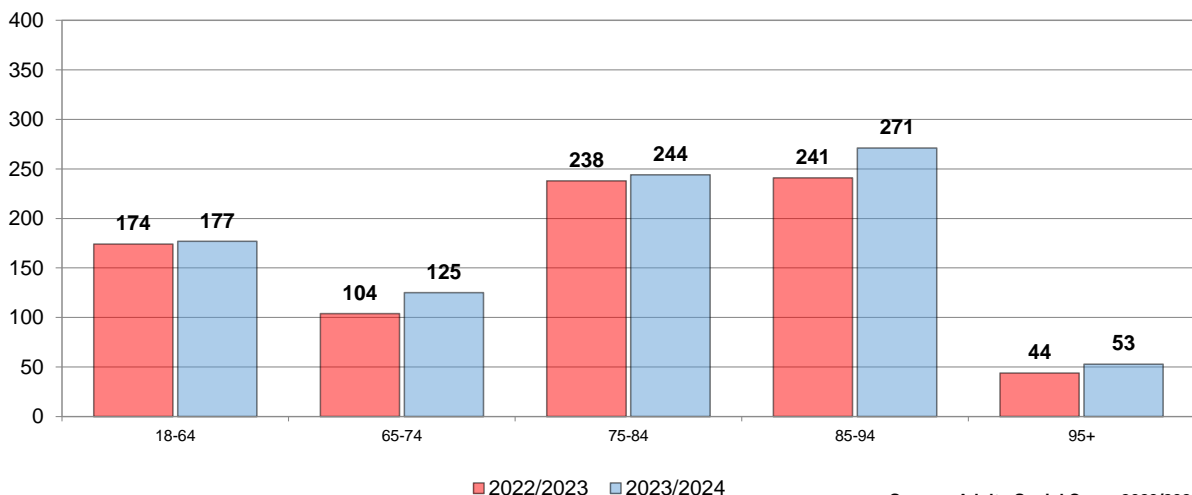

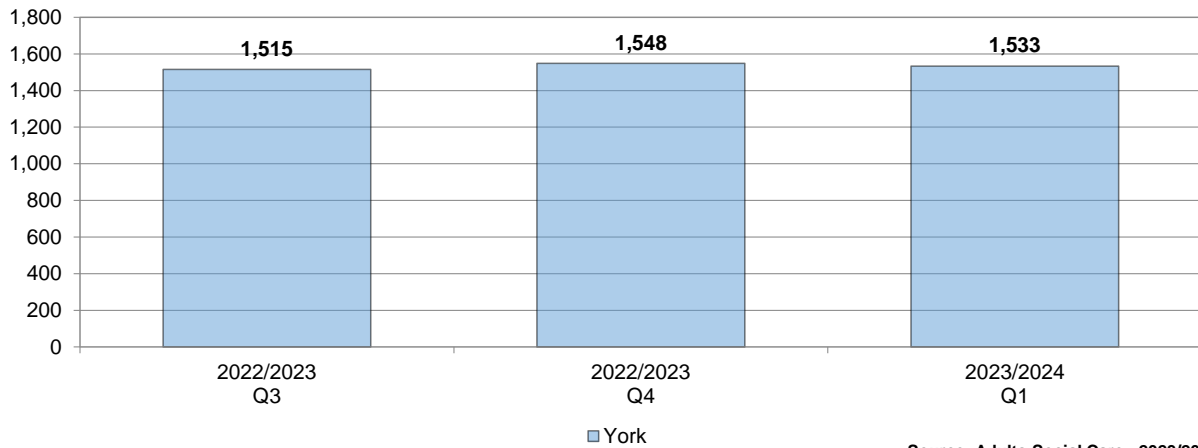

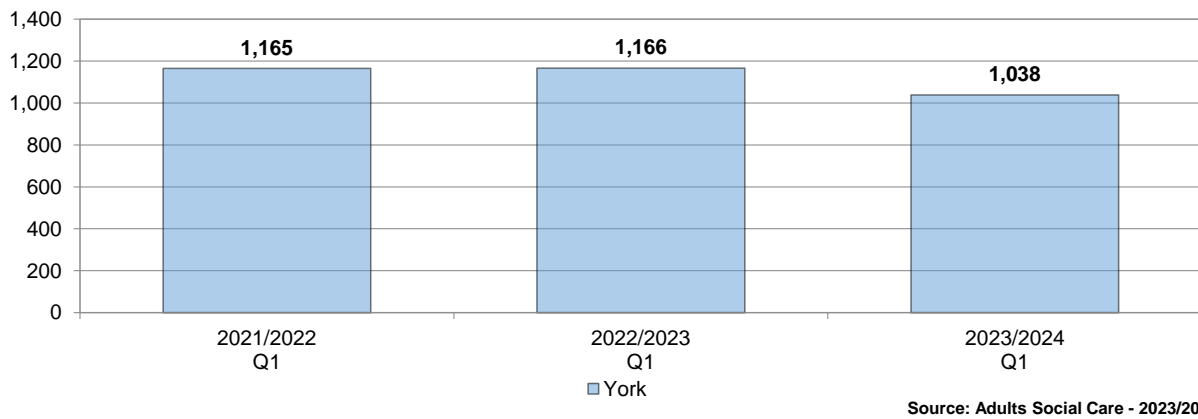

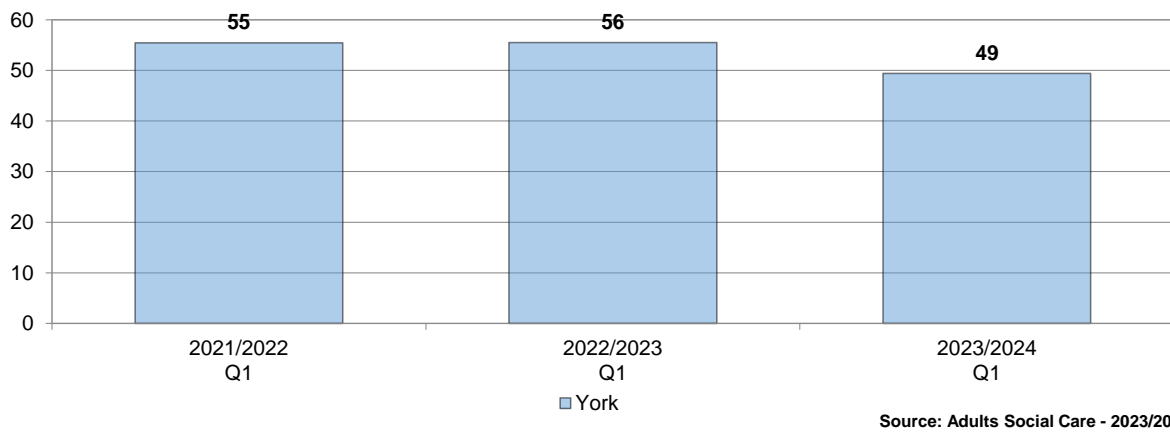
Number of clients getting paid packages of care that are not residential/nursing care



Number of new customers requesting Adult Social Care support

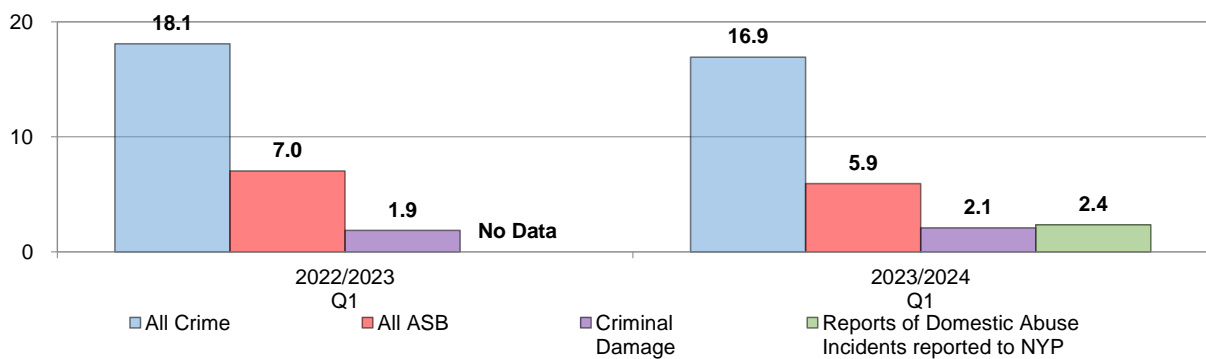


Average Weekly Homecare Hours by Client Type: Mental Health



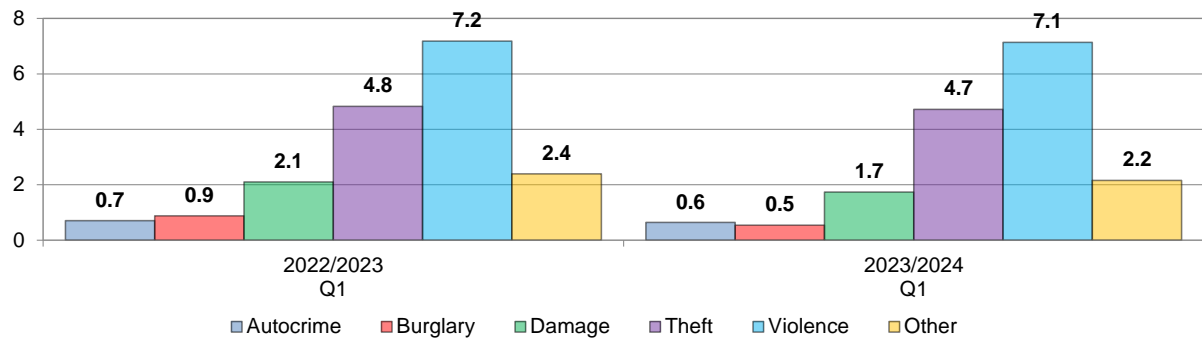

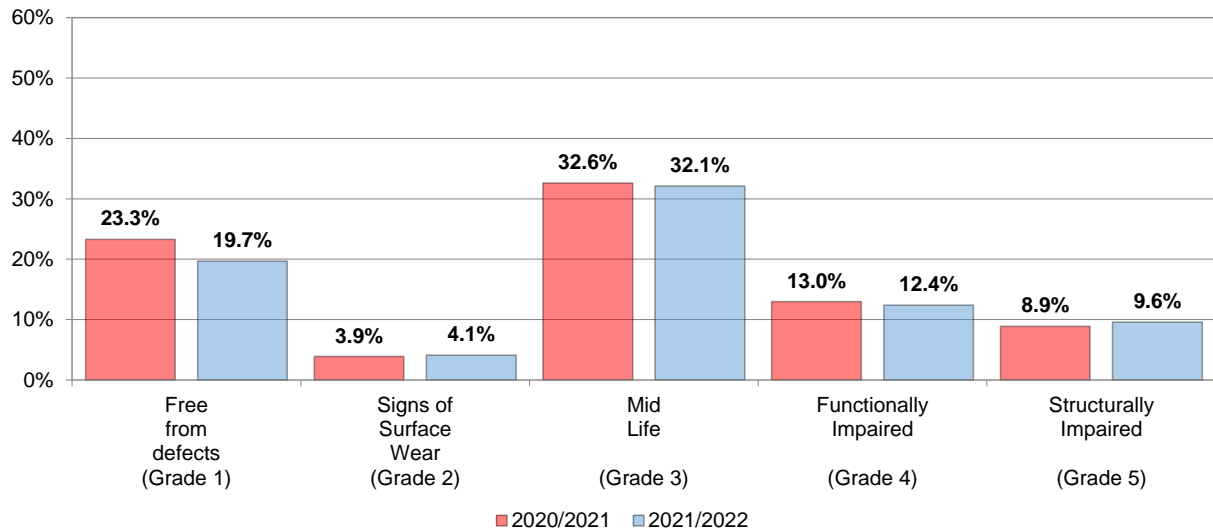

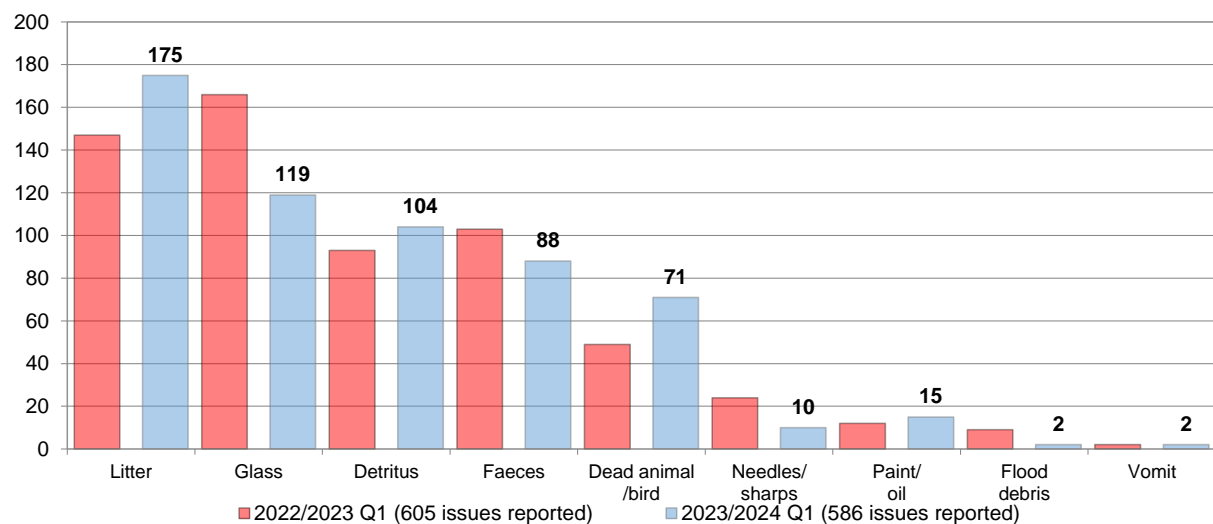

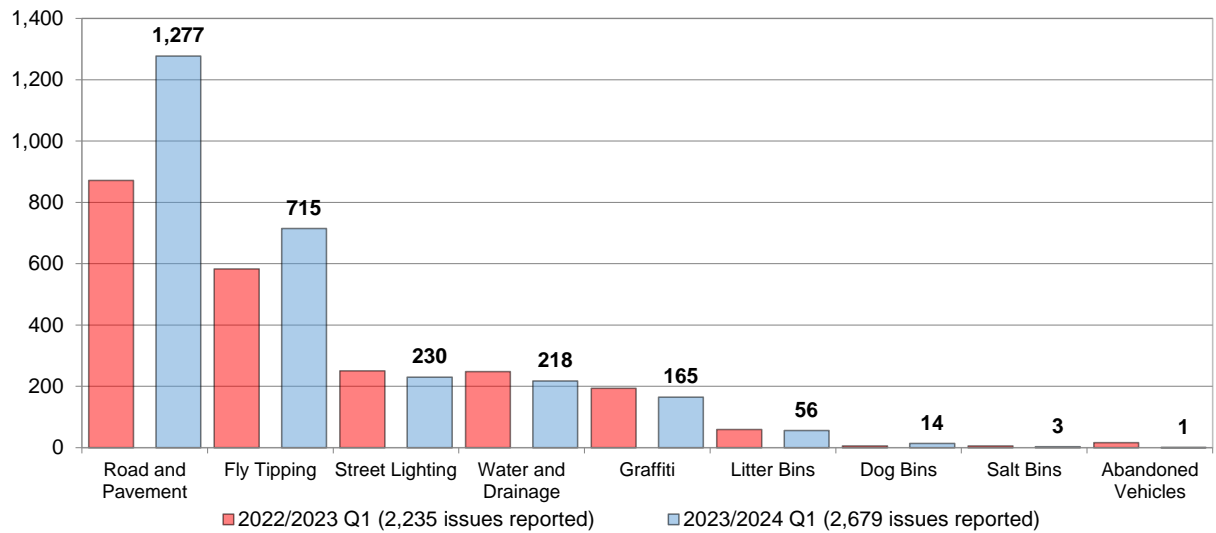

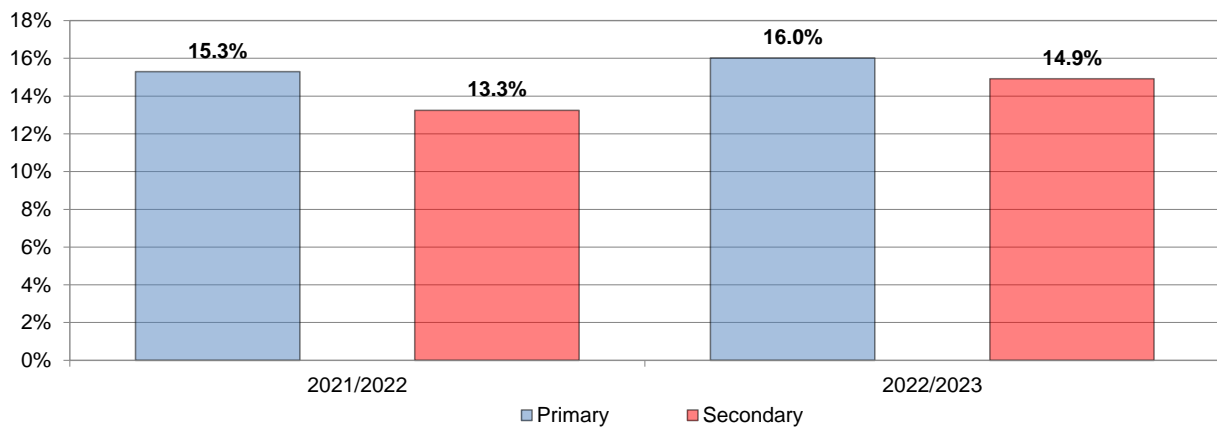

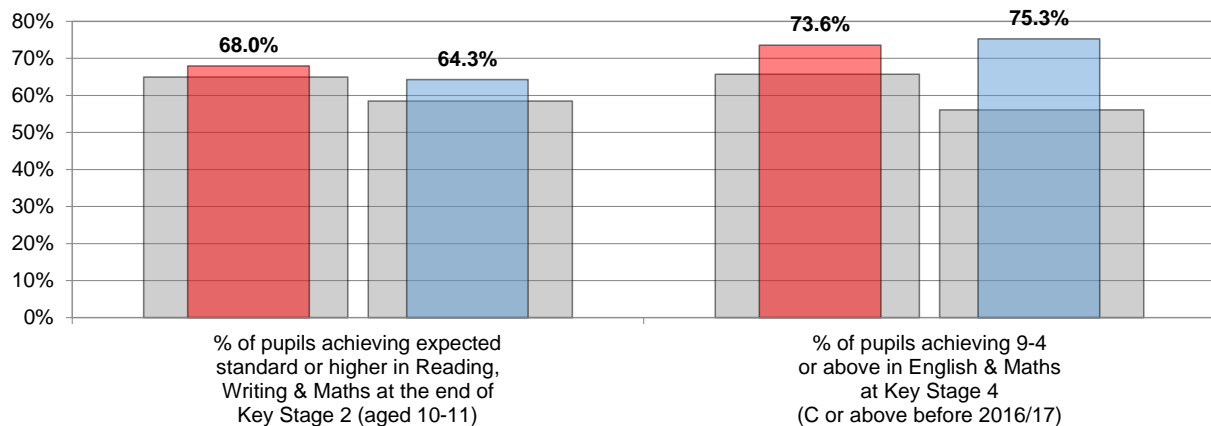

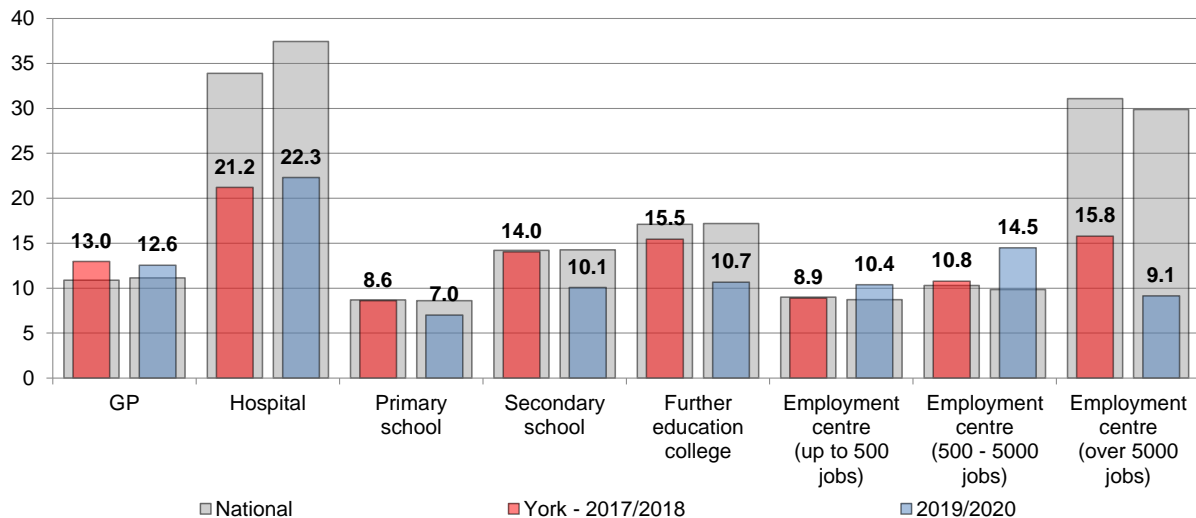
Access to local services

Travel time (minutes) by public transport / walking to nearest...



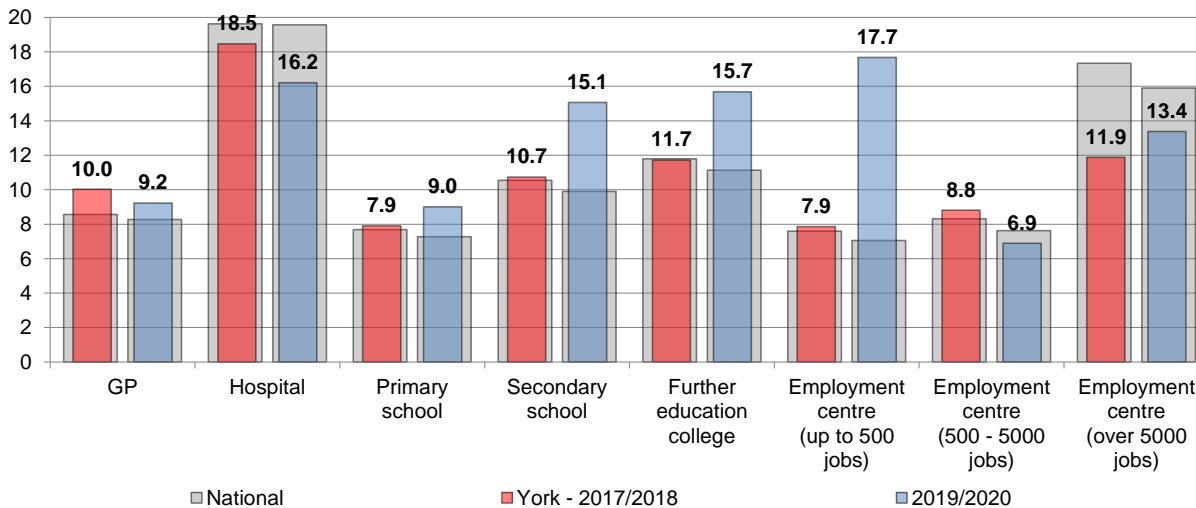

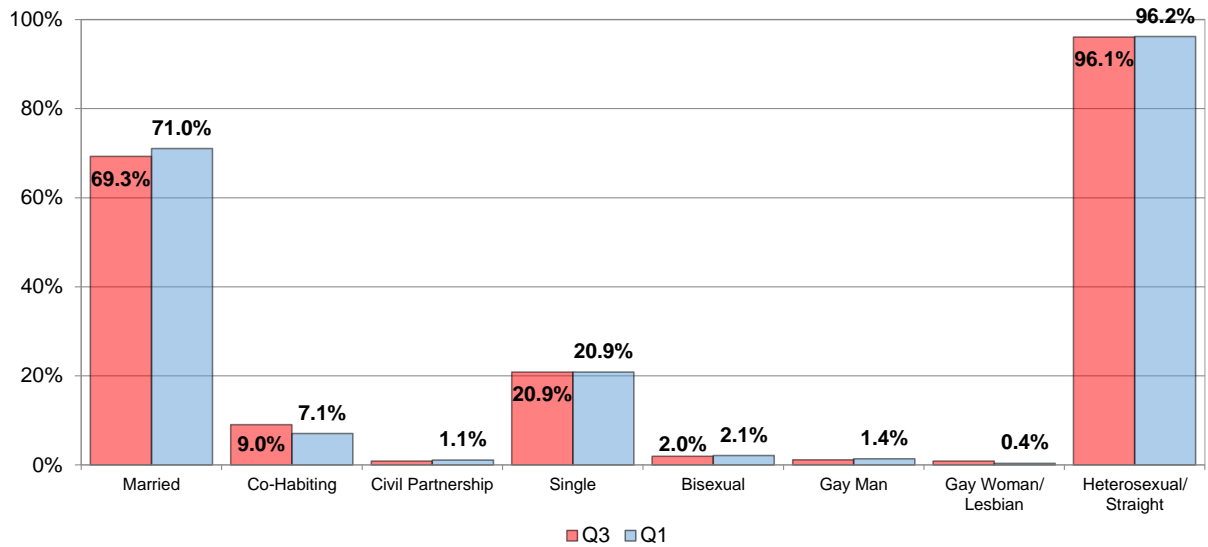

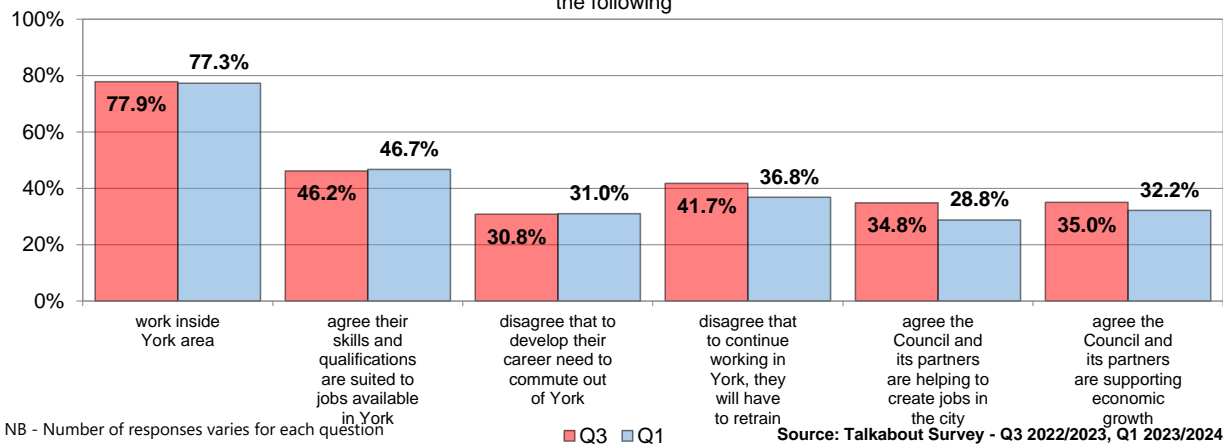

Resident responses about the Local Economy

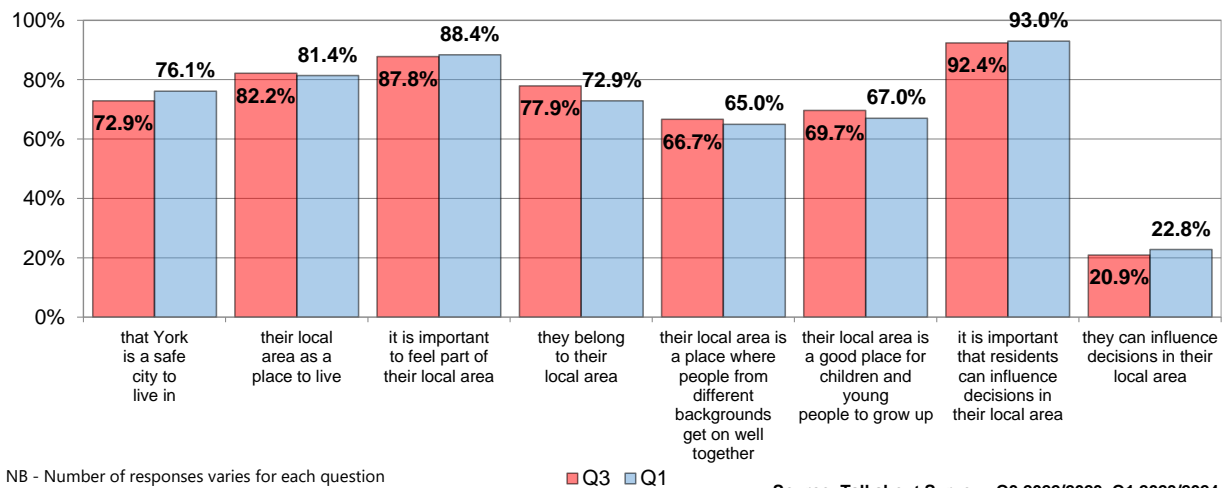

Resident satisfaction responses about their Local Area

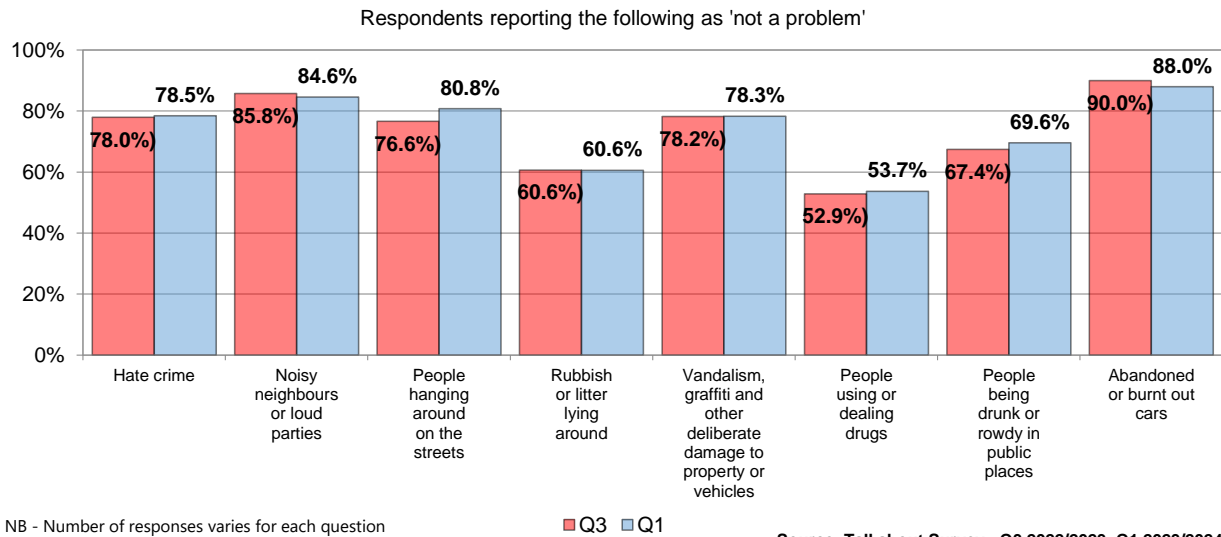

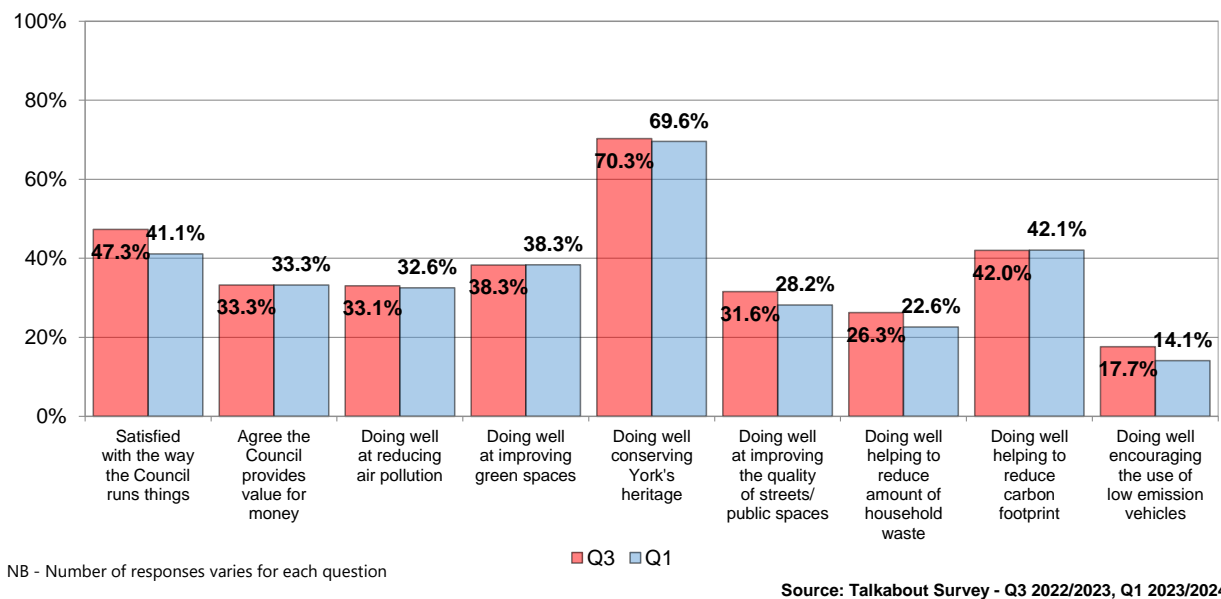

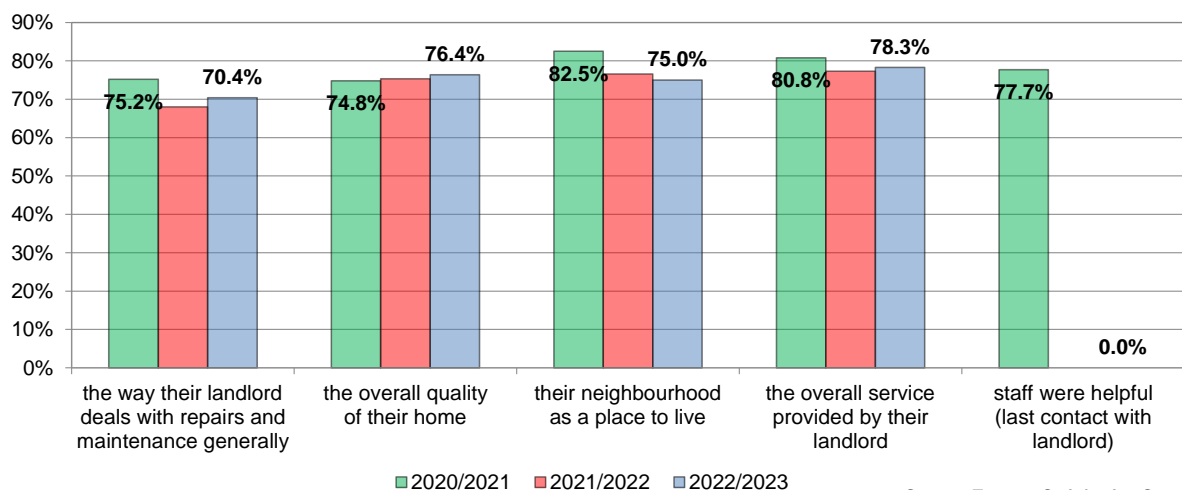
Resident satisfaction responses about Public Realm in their Local Area



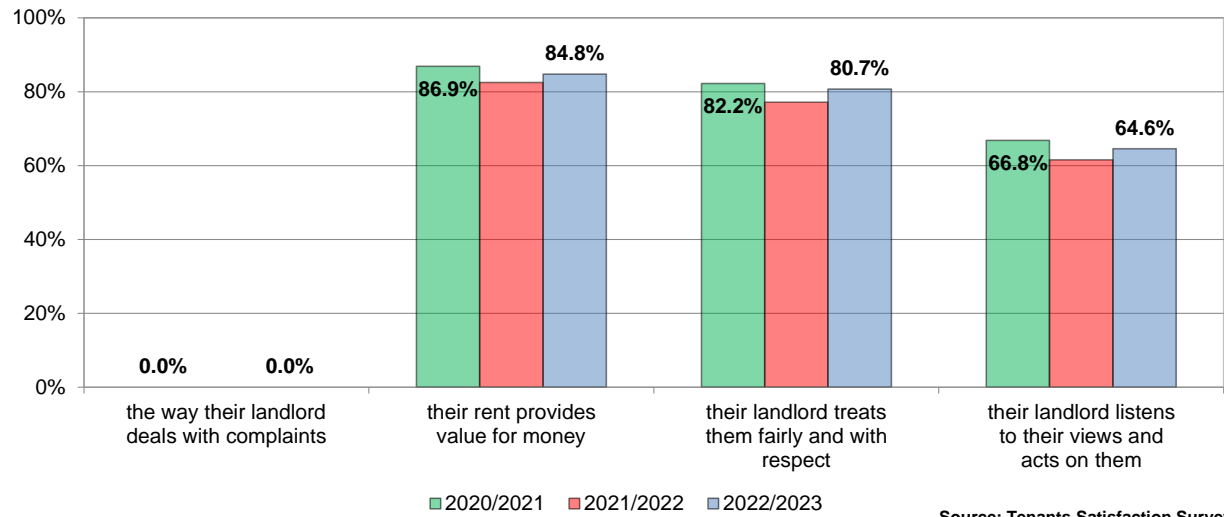

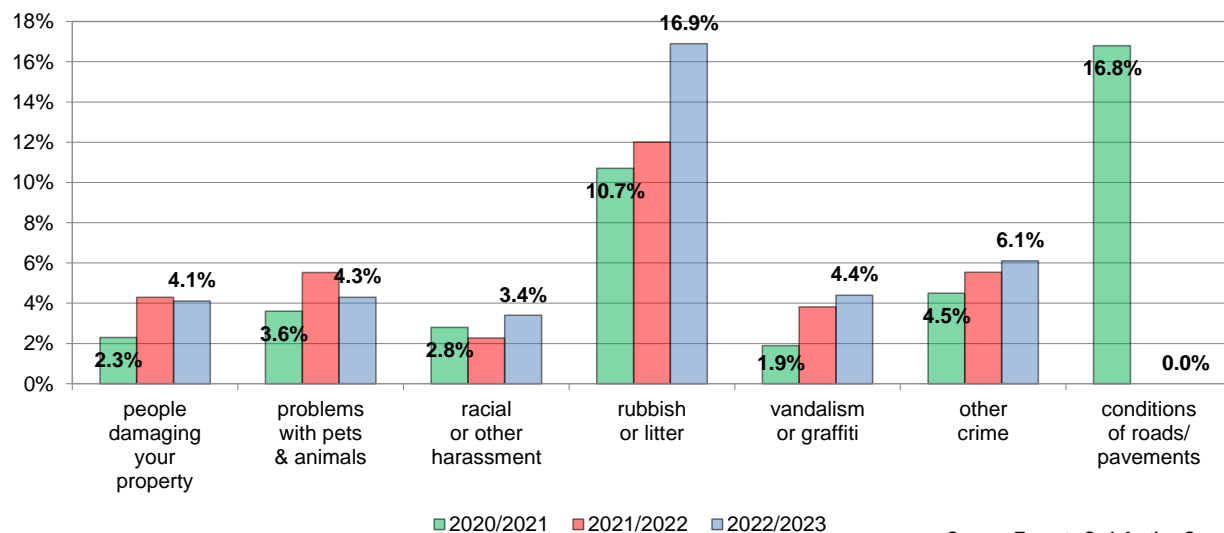
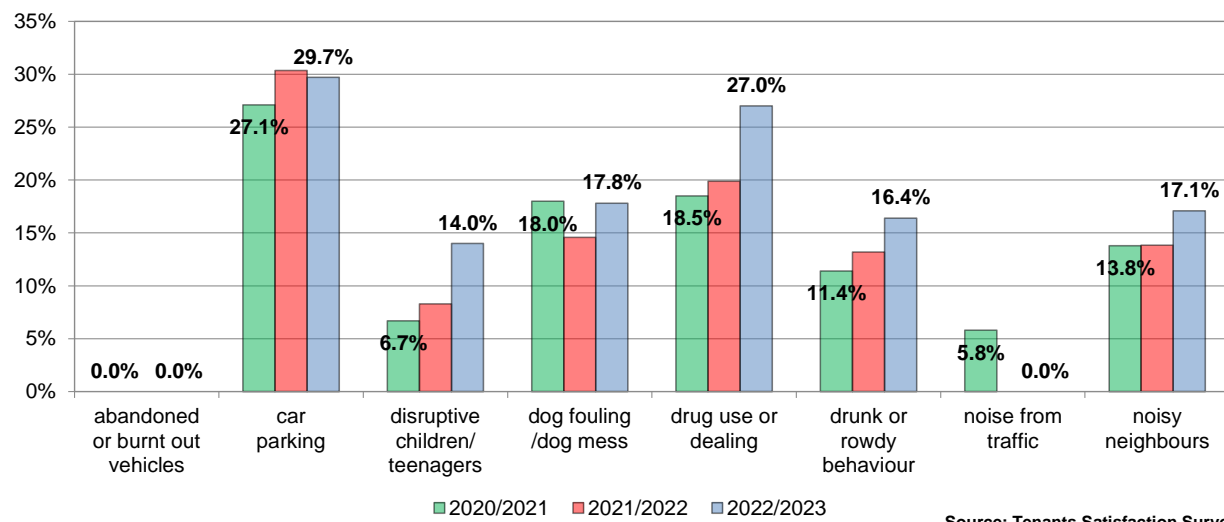
