

Privacy Notice for Riverside Path Consultation

This privacy notice was completed in November 2022 and will be regularly reviewed. When we use your personal data, CYC complies with data protection legislation and is the registered 'Controller'. Our data protection notification is registered with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) – reference **Z5809563**.

Why is information being collected?

City of York Council are planning to undertake improvements to the Riverside Path between Jubilee Terrace and Scarborough Bridge and we are working with external partners Aecom Design Consultants. To understand the views and priorities of local residents on the proposed scheme a public consultation exercise is being undertaken. We want to ensure we are delivering a scheme which best meets the aspirations of residents within the constraints of the location and funding that is available.

Our survey asks for some personal information to ensure that the council is being fair and inclusive and considering everyone's needs when developing the scheme.

What information will be collected?

- Your use of the route
- Your views on the need for improvements
- Your views on options and priorities for the improvements.
- Your postcode, age, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethnicity, health information

What will we do with the information?

We are using the information you give us with your consent. You can withdraw your consent at any time by contacting business.intelligence@york.gov.uk or 01904 551550

The information we collect will be included in presentations, statistics, reports and planning applications. Any presentations, reports and statistics for publication or use outside of the authorised council staff, will be anonymised and cannot be linked back to you, your family or individuals. This includes the work we are doing with the design consultants Aecom.

If you have completed a paper survey, once you complete and return it to us, we will transfer the information you have given us onto the council's secure network and then destroy confidentially the paper copy.

We will not use the information for any other purpose than set out in this privacy notice and will not disclose to a third party i.e. other companies or individuals, unless we are required to do so by law for the prevention of crime and detection of fraud, or, in some circumstances, when we feel that you or others are at risk.

Storage of information

We will keep the information you give us in CYC's secure network drive and make sure it can only be accessed by authorised staff.

How long will we keep the information?

We will keep the information you give us for up to three years and then will securely and confidentially destroy it.

Where required or appropriate, at the end of the retention period we will pass onto the City Archives any relevant information.

Further processing

If we wish to use your personal information for a new purpose, not covered by this Privacy Notice, we will provide you with a new notice explaining the purpose prior to commencing the processing and the processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your consent prior to the new processing.
