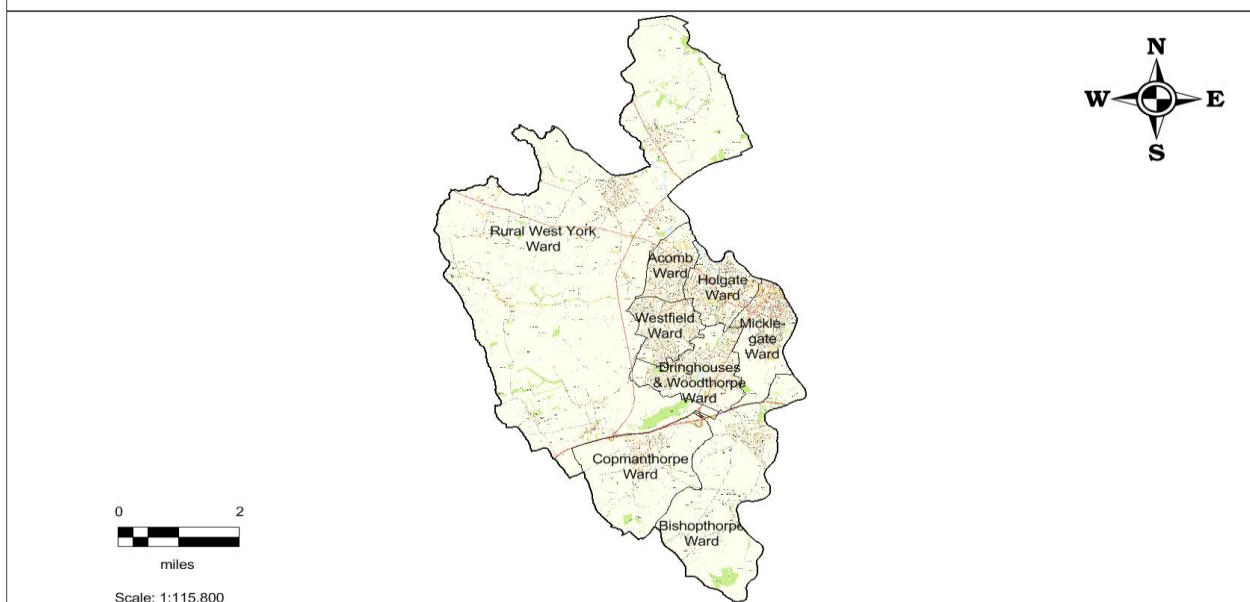


York Summary

- York has 206,856 residents with 5.7% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 83.9% are in good health, with 15.3% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- 66% own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage, 18% are private renters and 14% are social tenants.
- 73.5% of residents have a NVQ level 1 - 4 qualification and 18.0% have no qualifications at all.
- 11.6% of children live in poverty and there are 10.7% of households in fuel poverty.
- 4.9% of the working population (aged 16-64) claim out of work benefits and 0.5% claim job seekers allowance.

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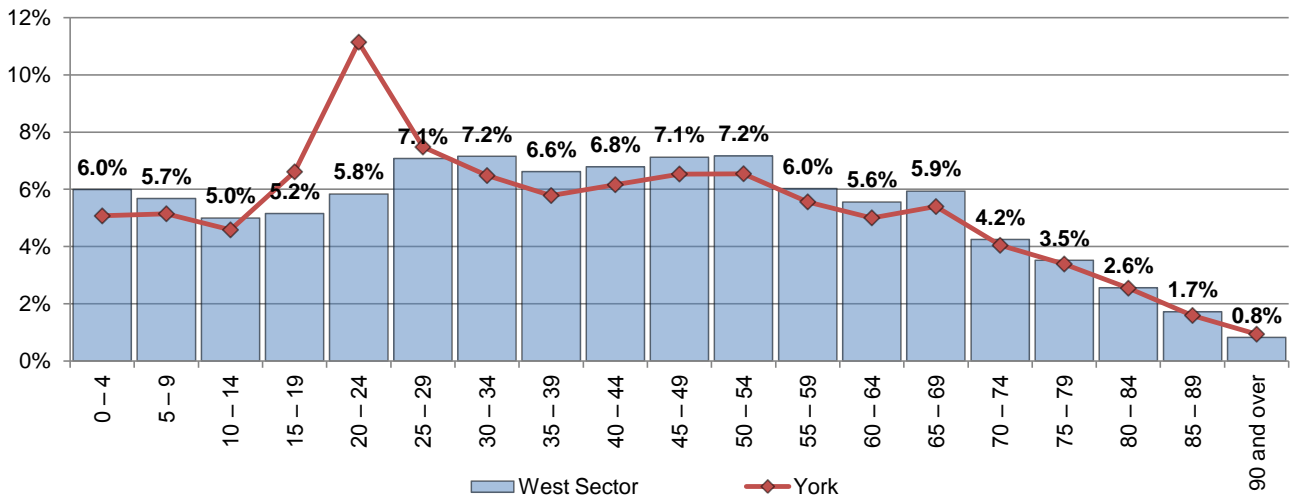
West Sector Summary

Includes the following wards: Acomb, Bishopthorpe, Copmanthorpe, Dringhouses and Woodthorpe, Holgate, Micklegate, Rural West York and Westfield.

- The West Sector has 76,596 residents with 3.9% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 83.6% are in good health, with 15.3% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- 70% own their own home, either outright, with a mortgage or shared ownership, 15% are private renters and 14% are social tenants.
- 72.2% of residents have a NVQ level 1 - 4 qualification and 19.2% have no qualifications at all.
- 12.1% of children live in poverty and there are 8.5% of households in fuel poverty.
- 5.6% of the working population claim out of work benefits and 0.6% claim job seekers allowance.

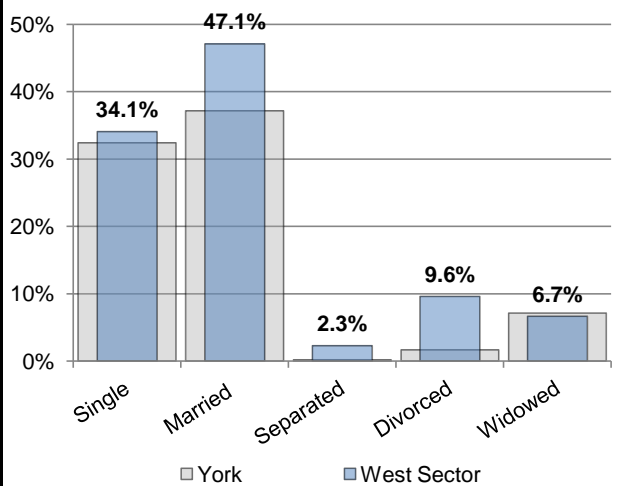

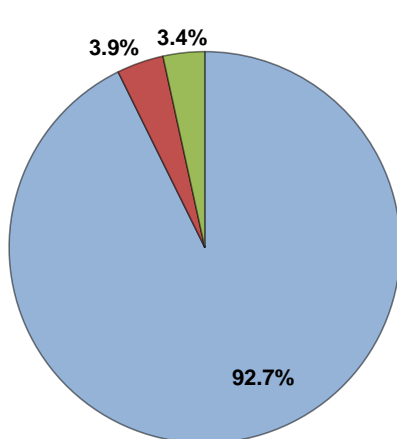

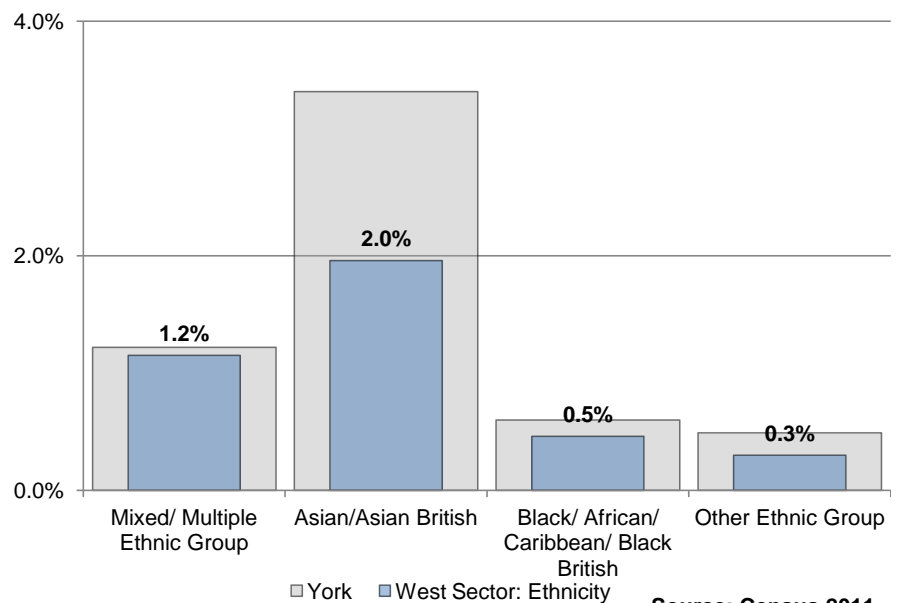

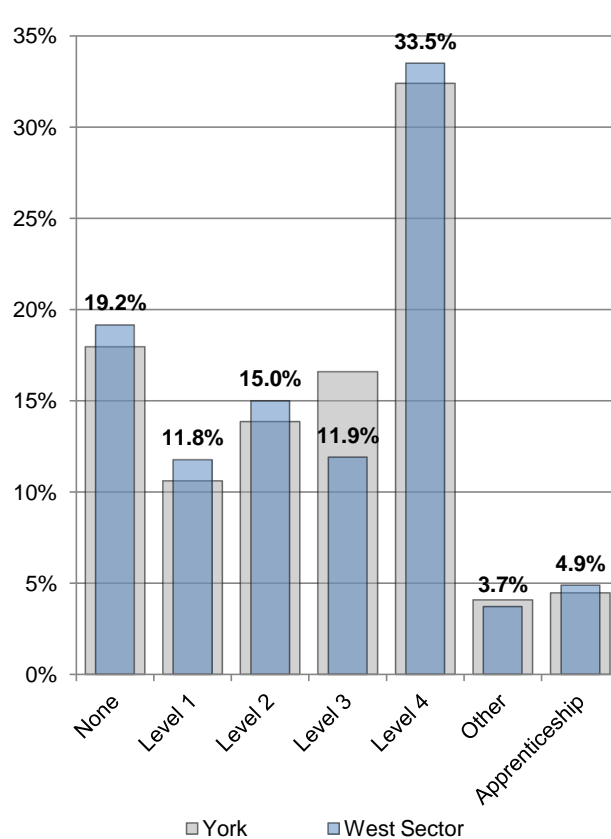

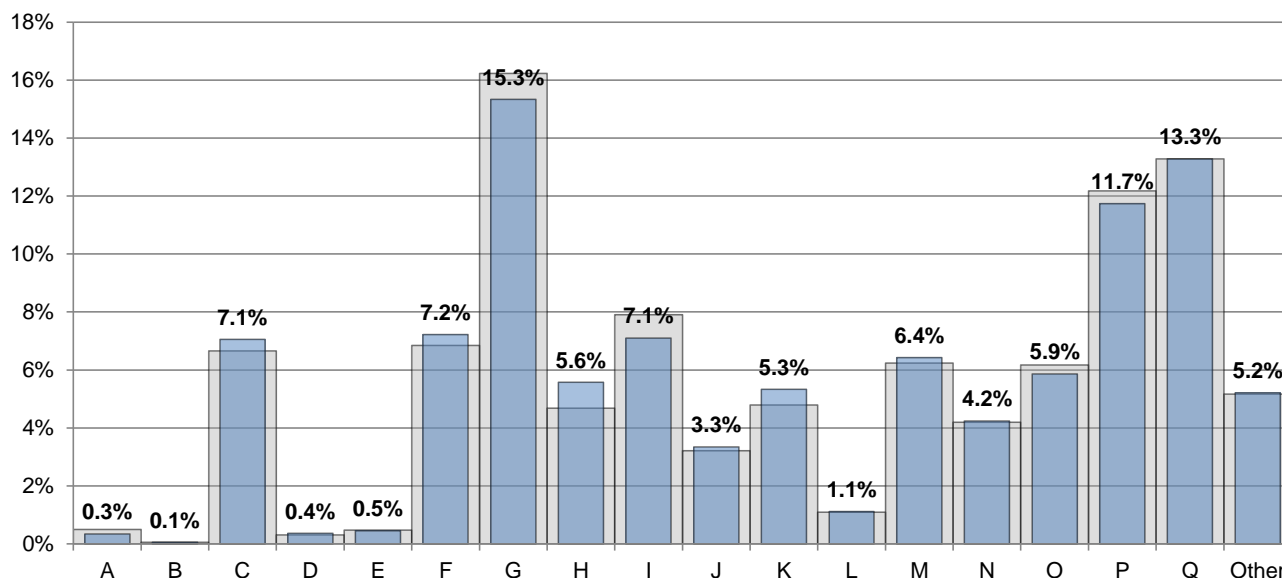

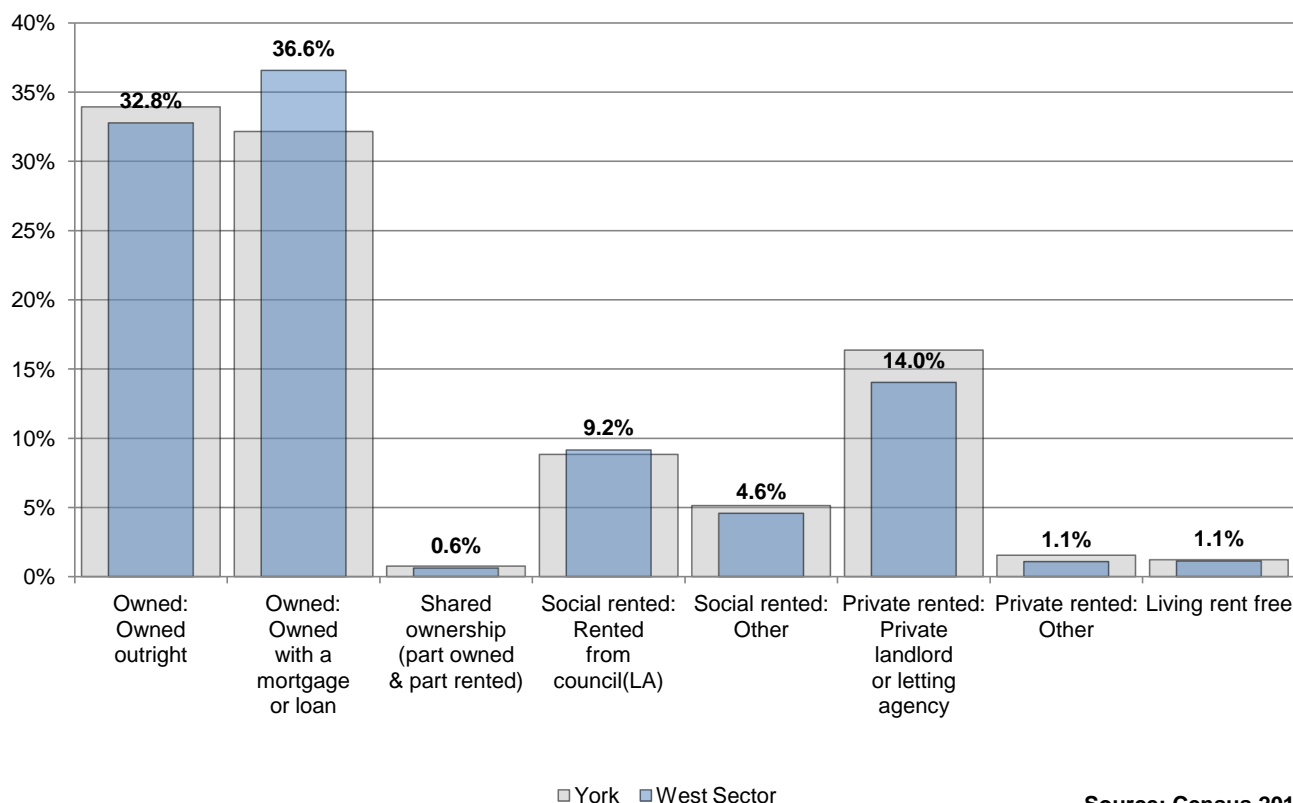

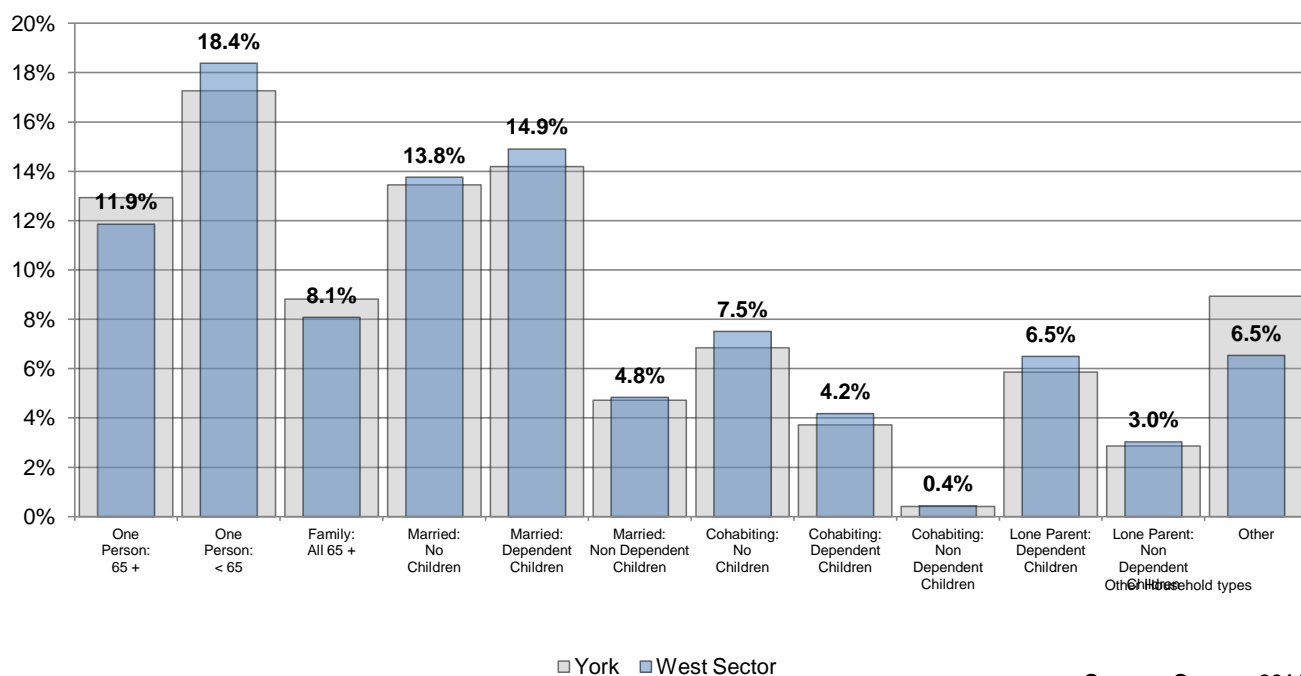

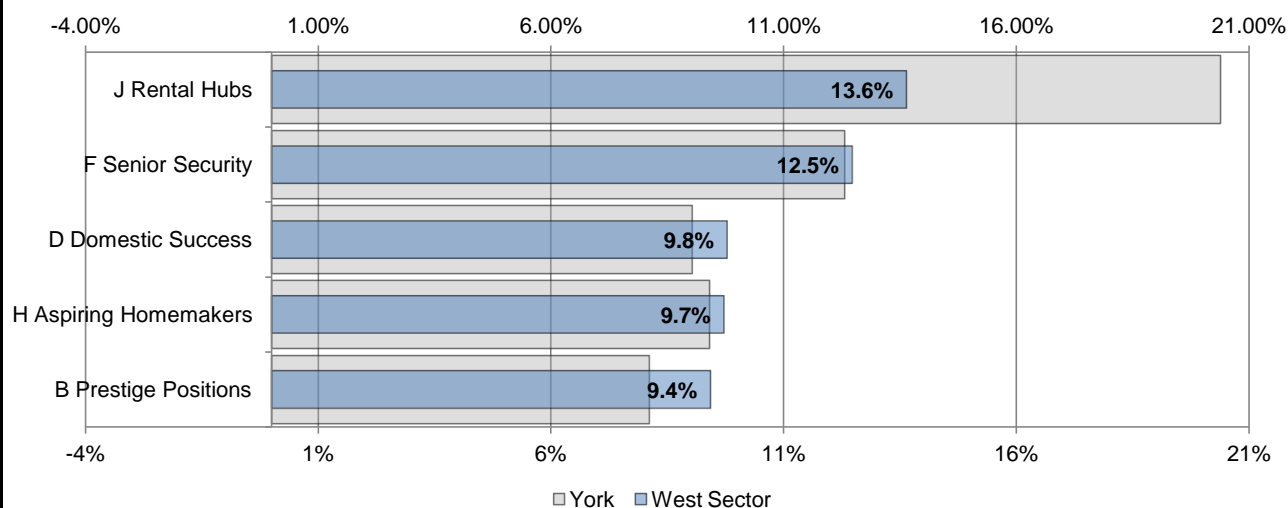
Household Composition

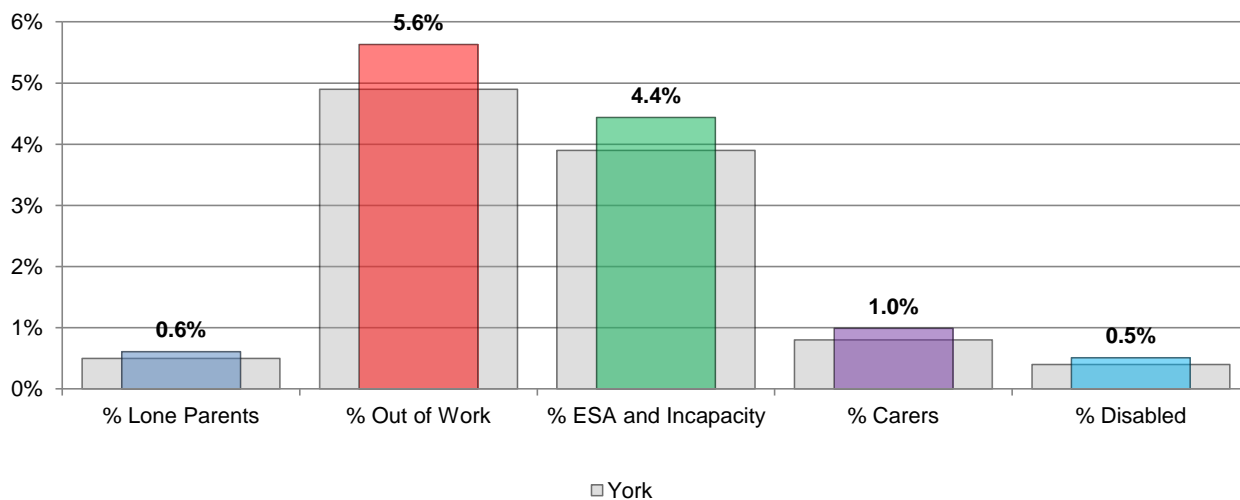

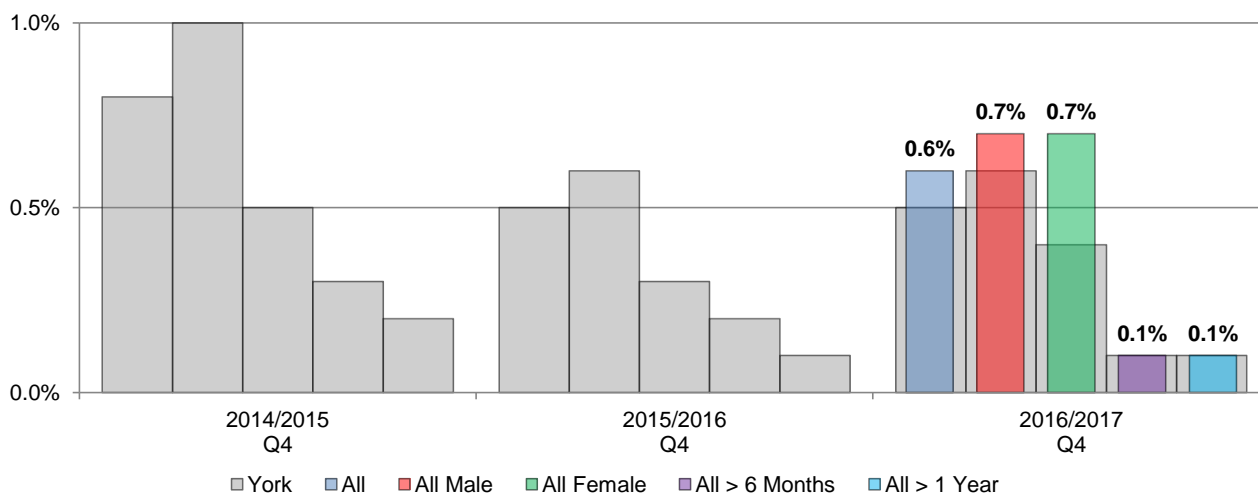

JSA Claimant Rate (Age and Gender) Working age Population (16-64)

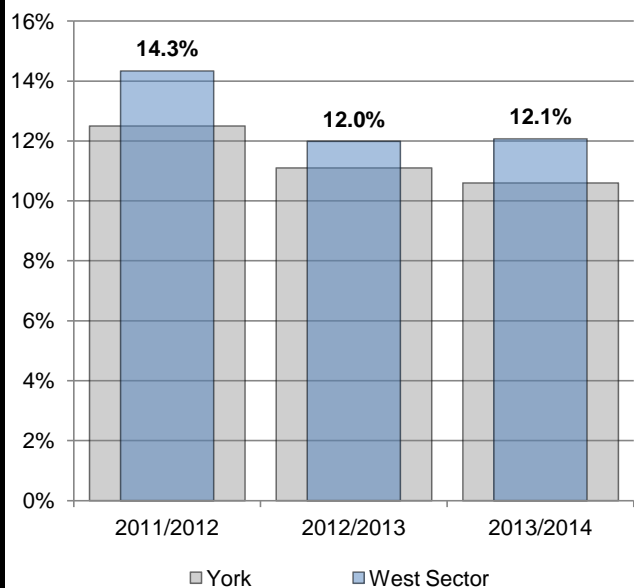

The proportion of children living in families in receipt of out-of-work (means-tested) benefits or in receipt of tax credits where their reported income is less than 60 per cent of UK median income.



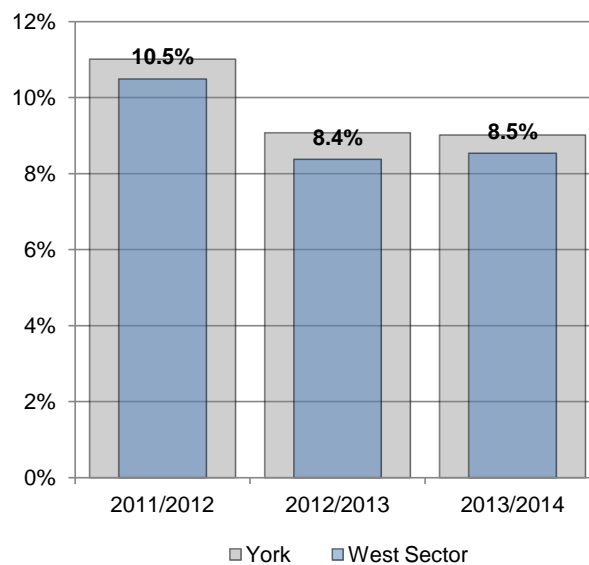

Fuel Poverty

The Low Income High Costs indicator is a twin indicator consisting of:

- the number of households that have both low incomes and high fuel costs; and
- the depth of fuel poverty amongst these fuel poor households.

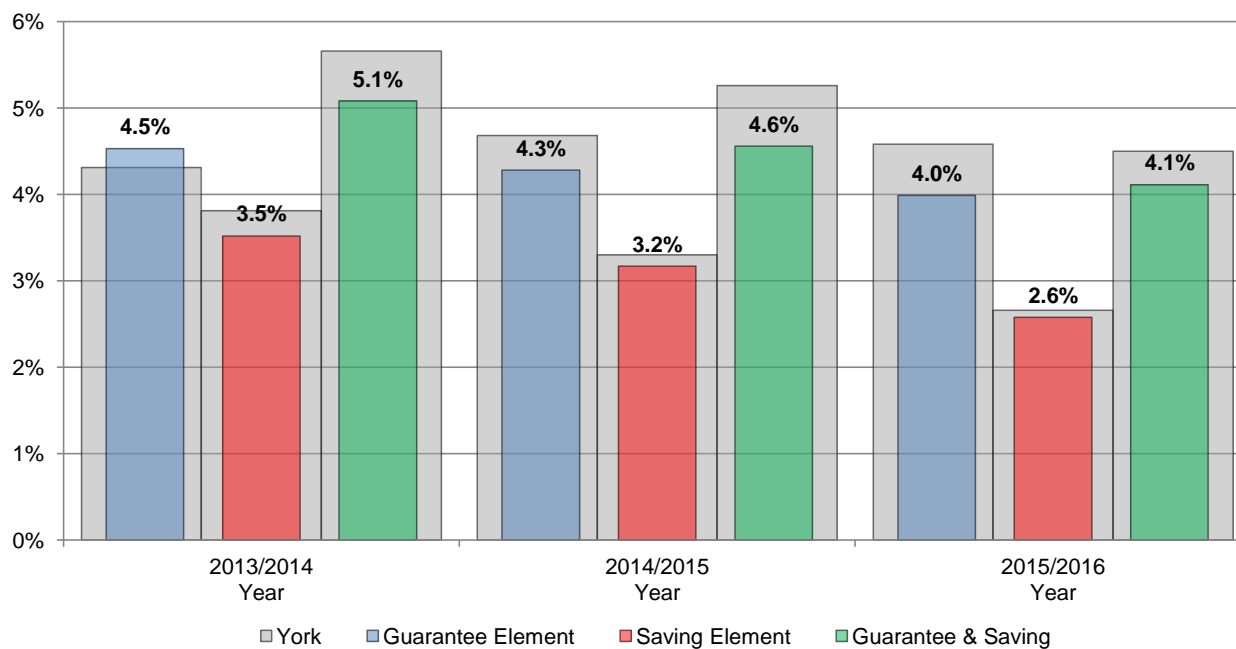
This is measured through a fuel poverty gap which represents the difference between the required fuel costs for each household and the median required fuel costs.

Pension Credit

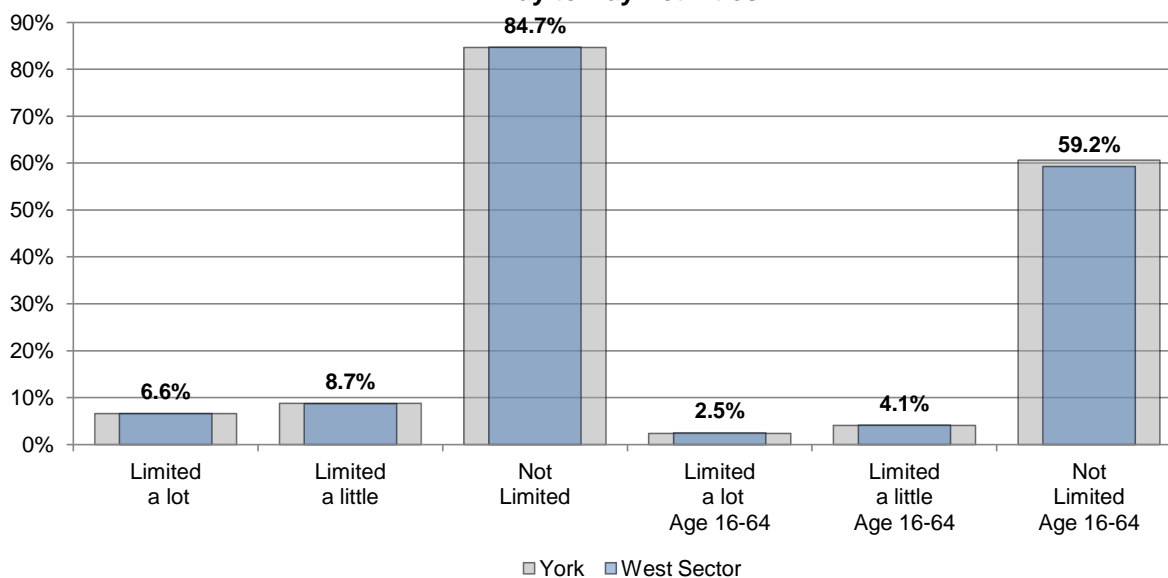
Pension Credit is an income-related benefit made up of 2 parts - Guarantee Credit and Savings Credit.

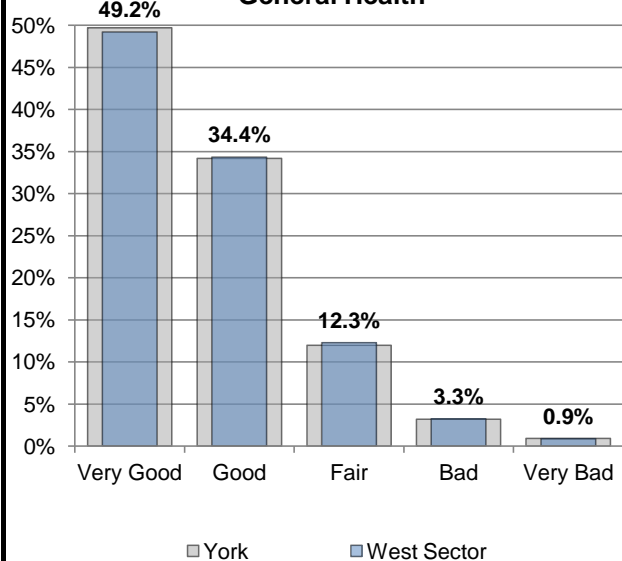

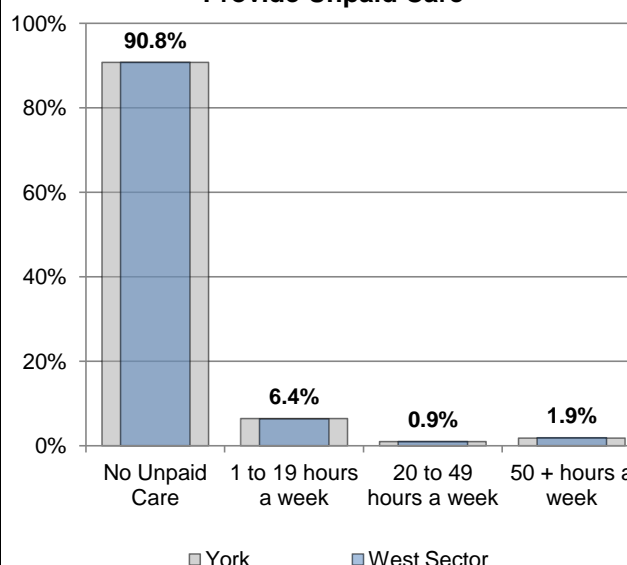

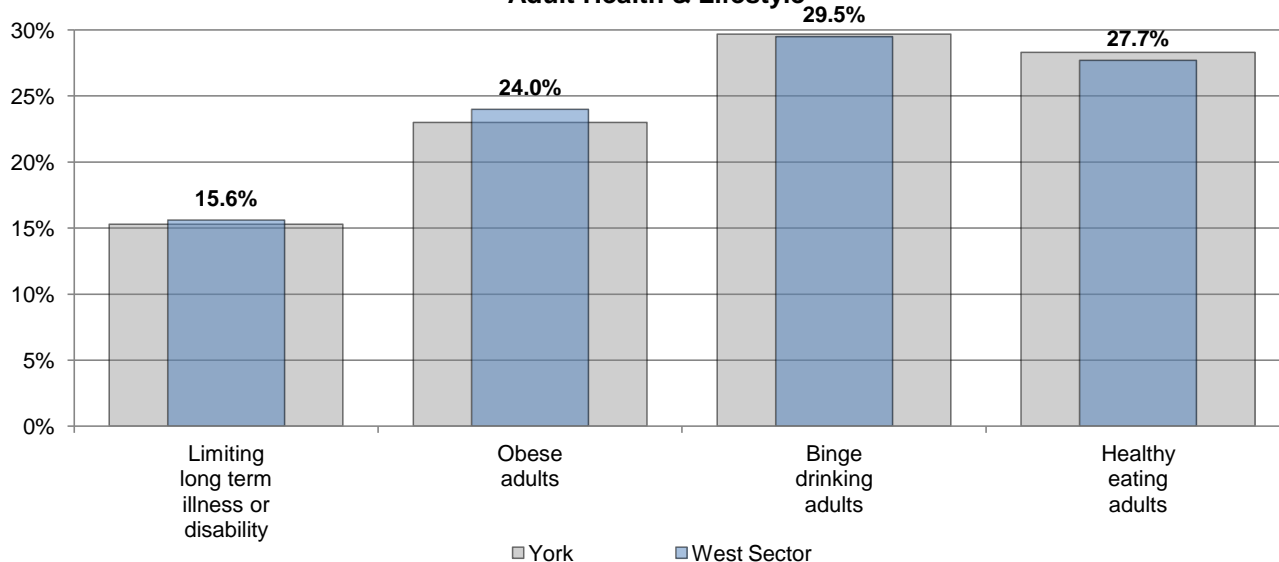

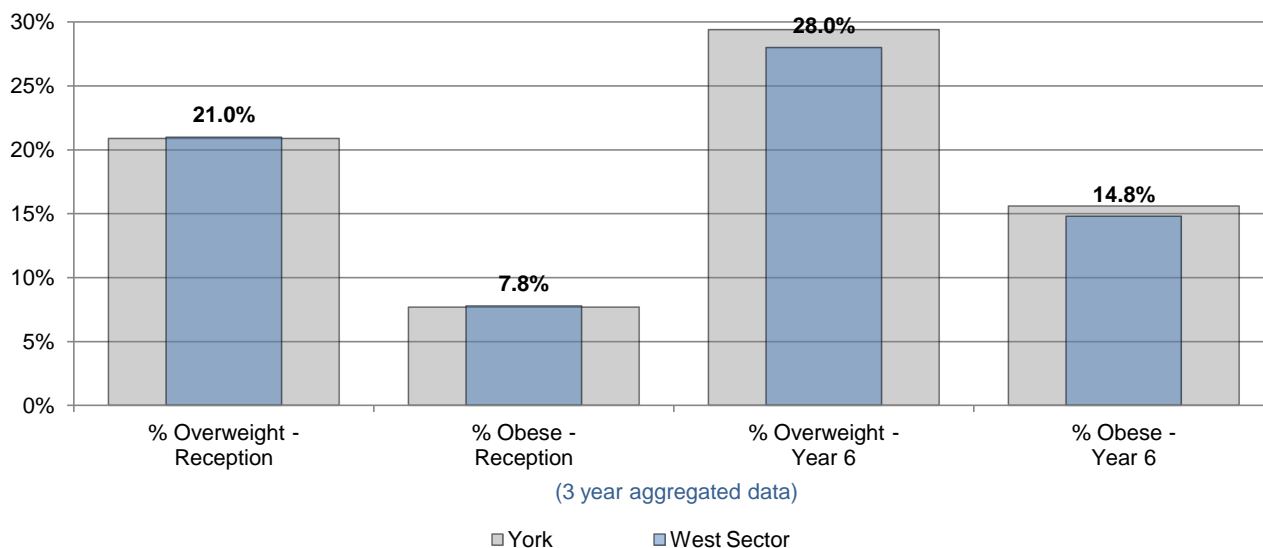

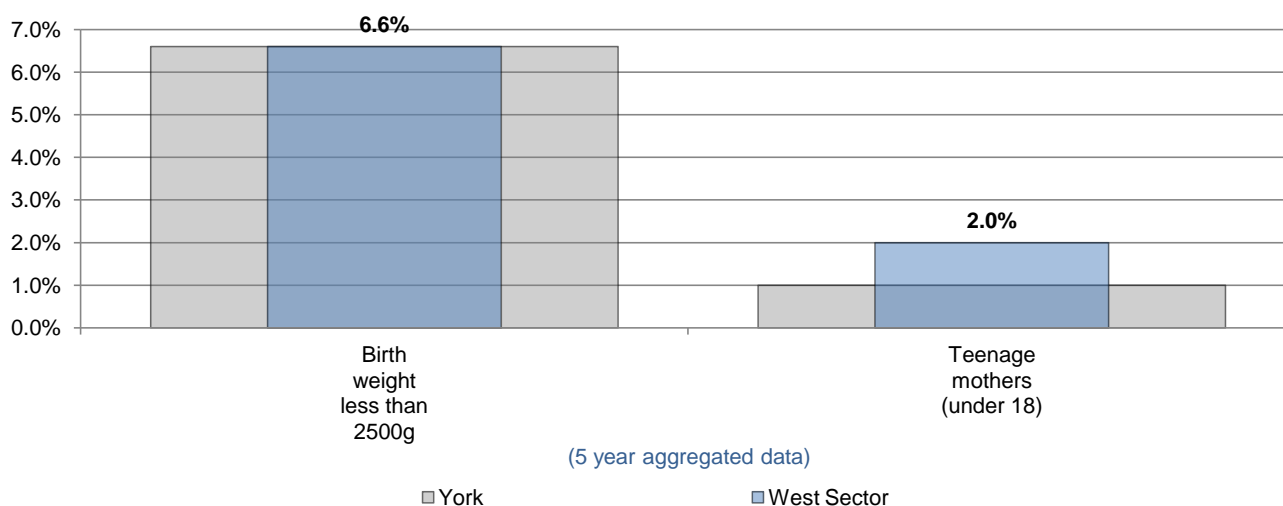

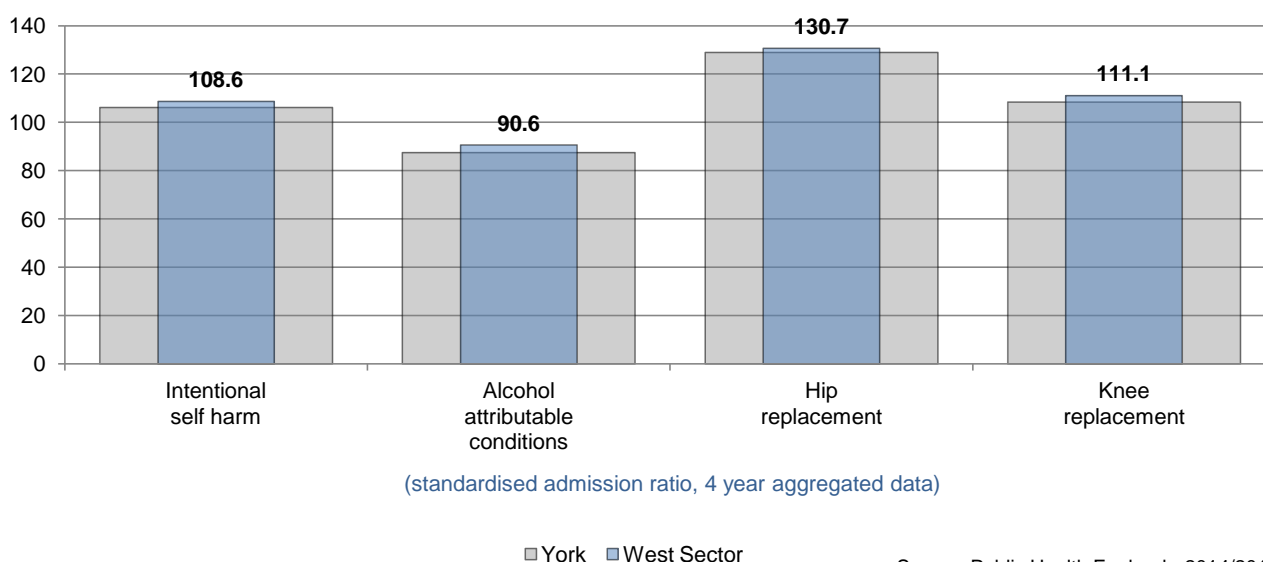

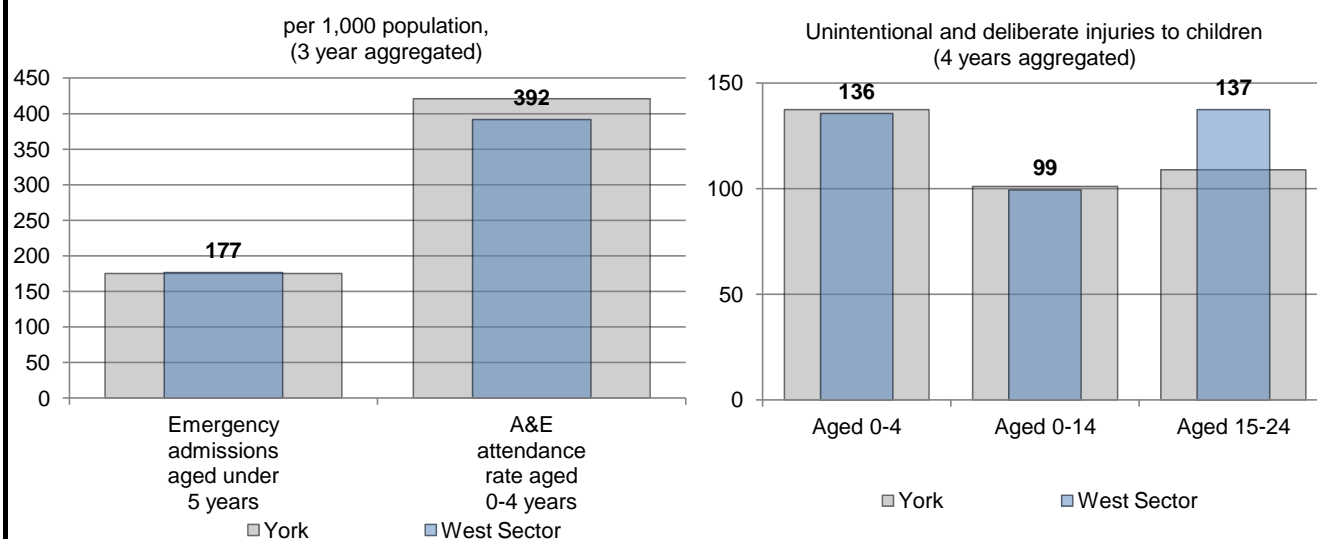
Hospital Admissions, All ages

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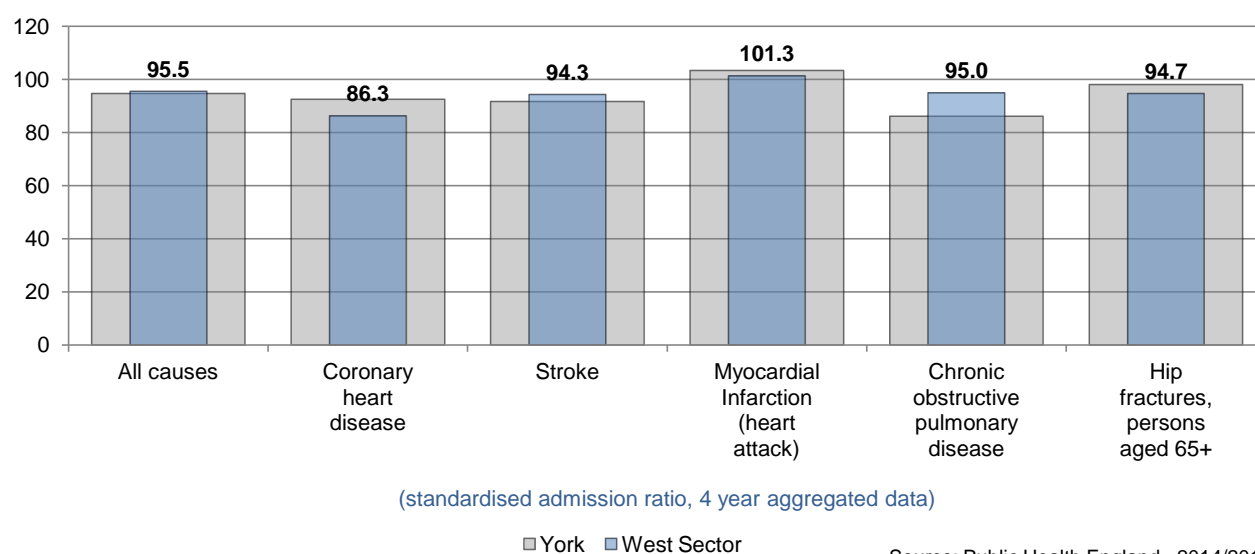
Hospital Admissions - Children & Young People

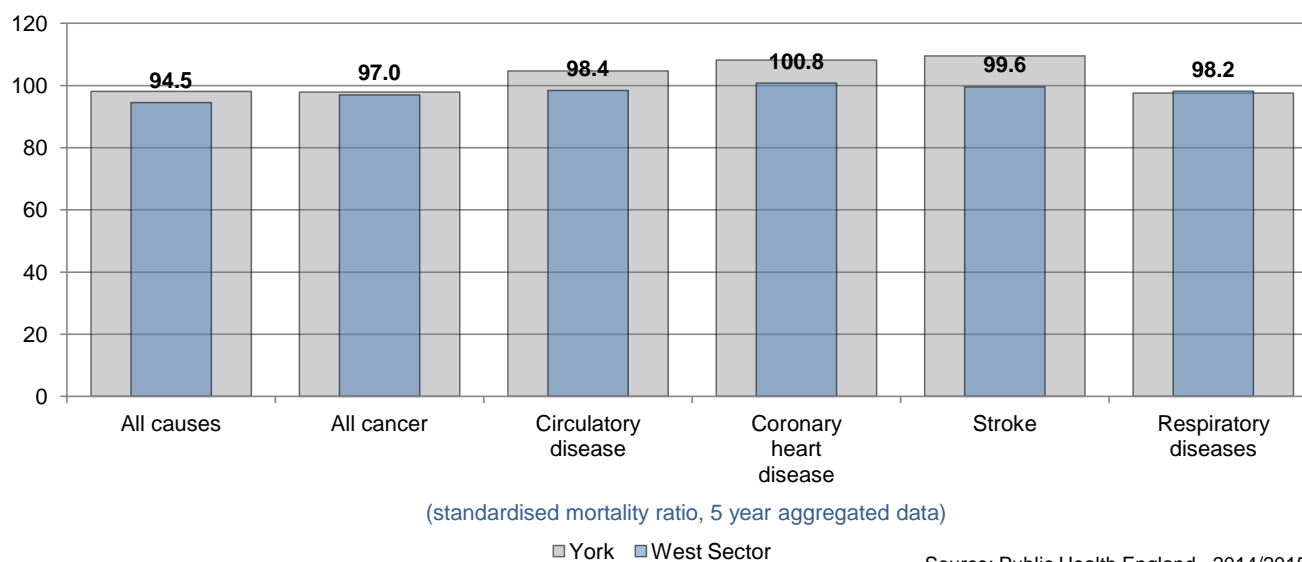
Emergency hospital admissions

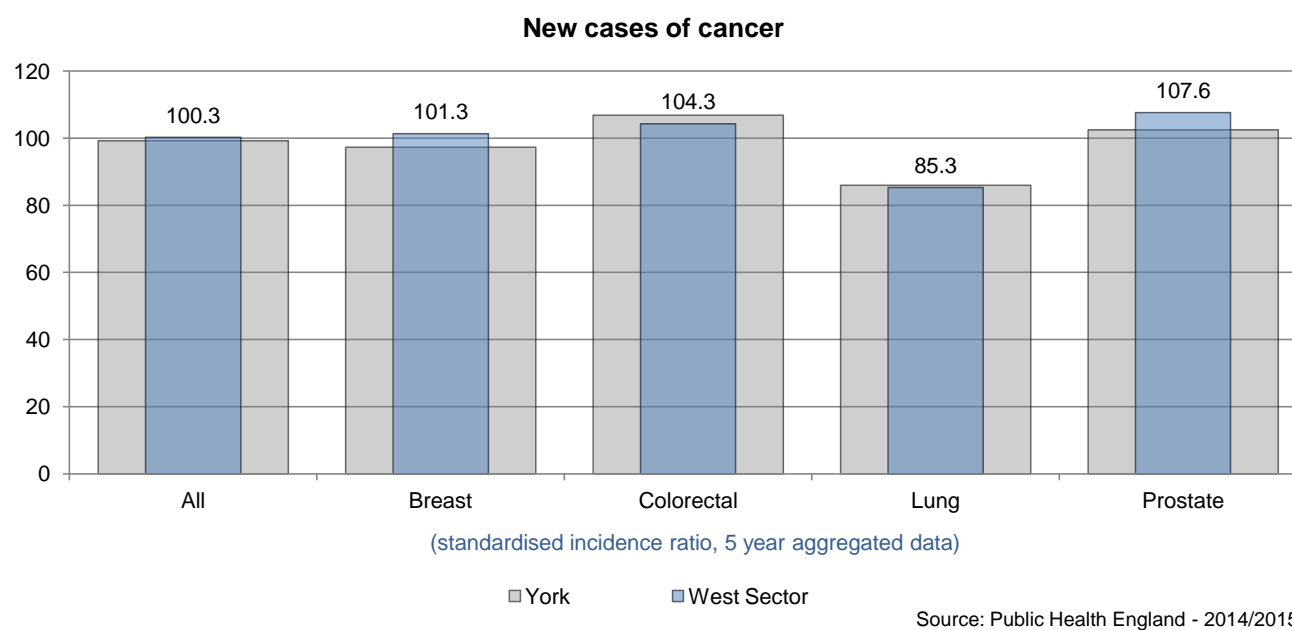
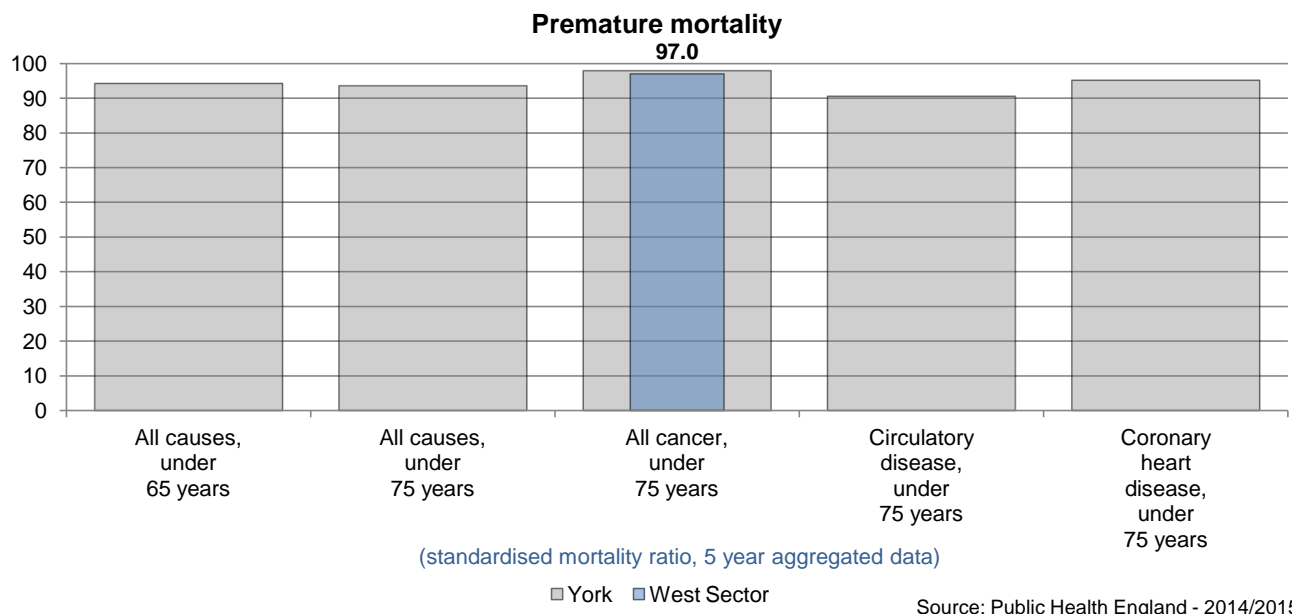

Mortality, All ages



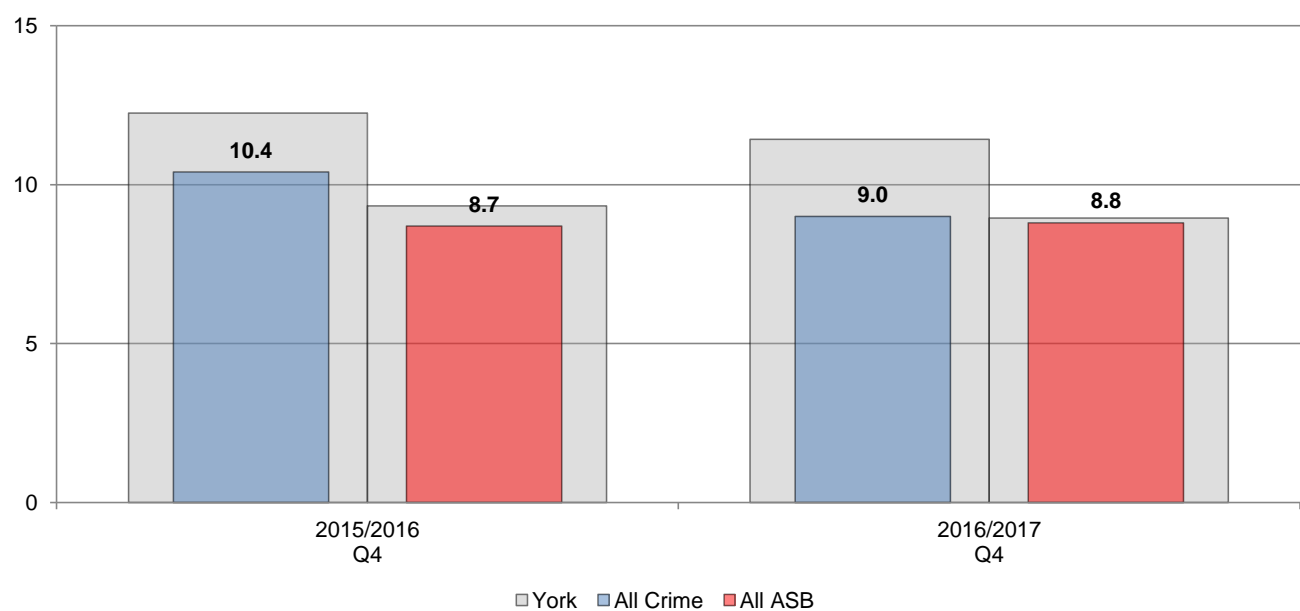

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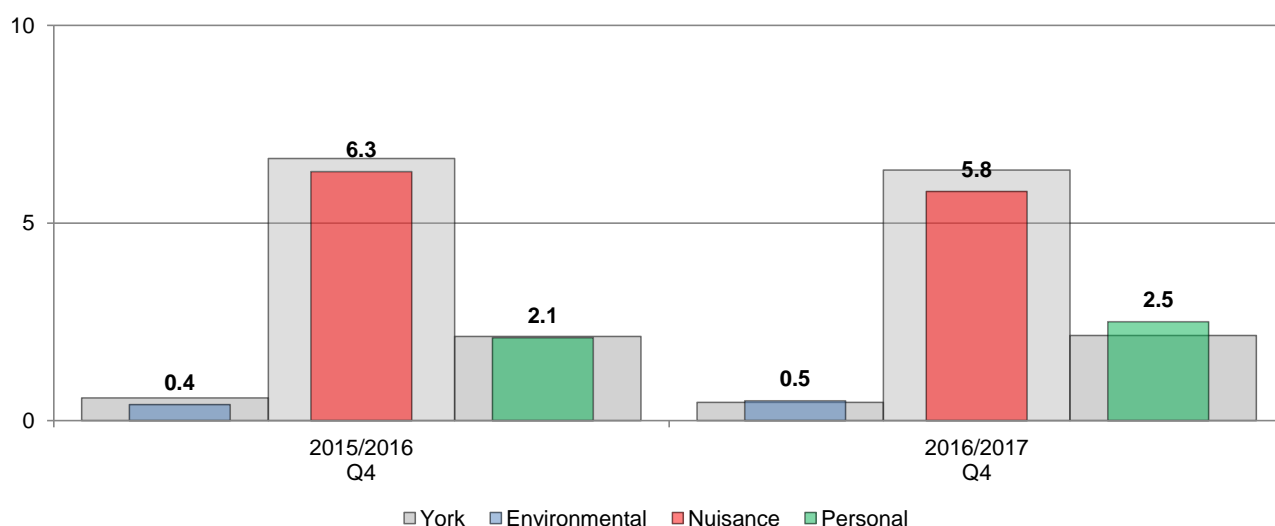
Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour

Total Crime and Total Anti-Social Behaviour per 1,000 population

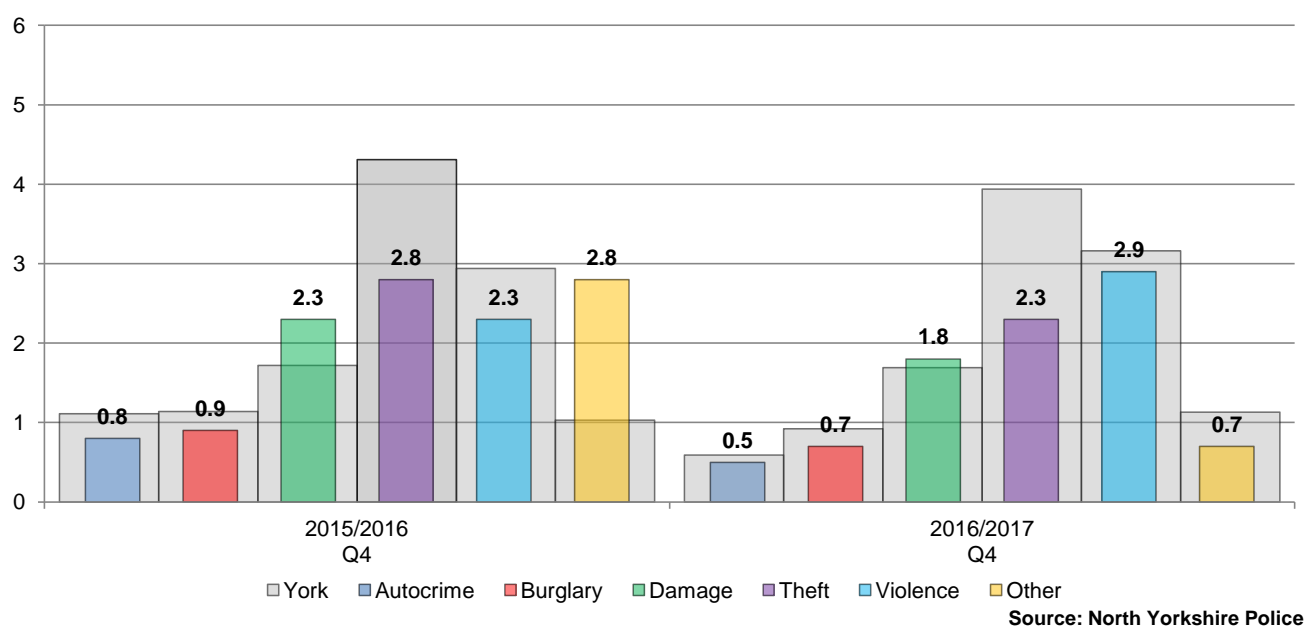


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ASB per 1,000 population

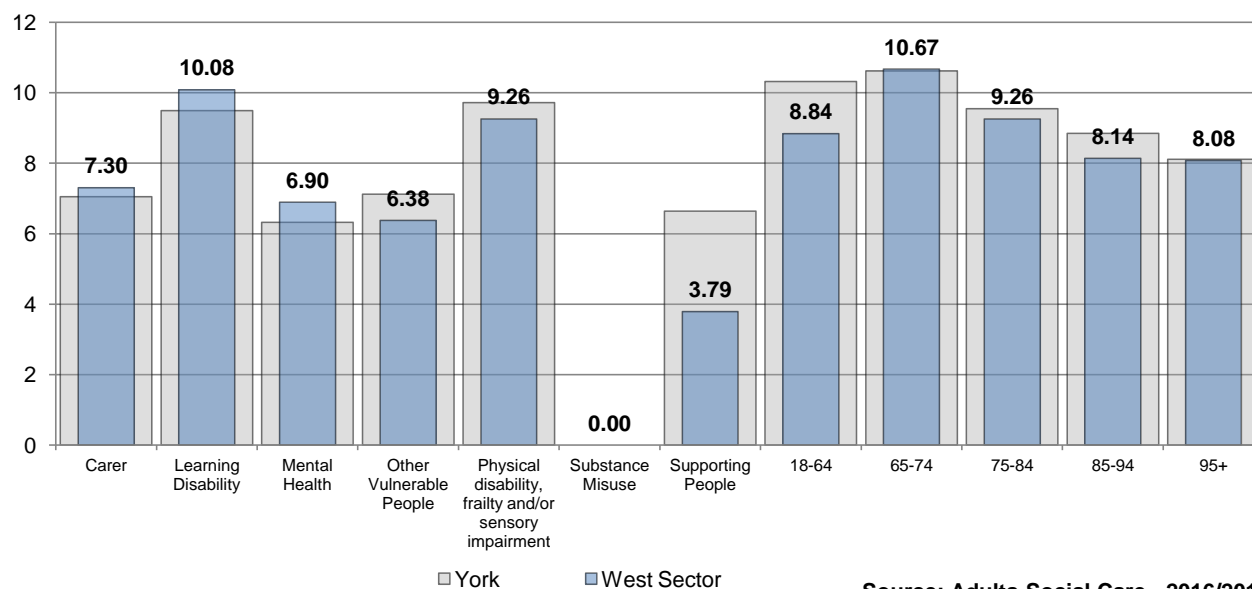


Crime Rate per 1,000 population

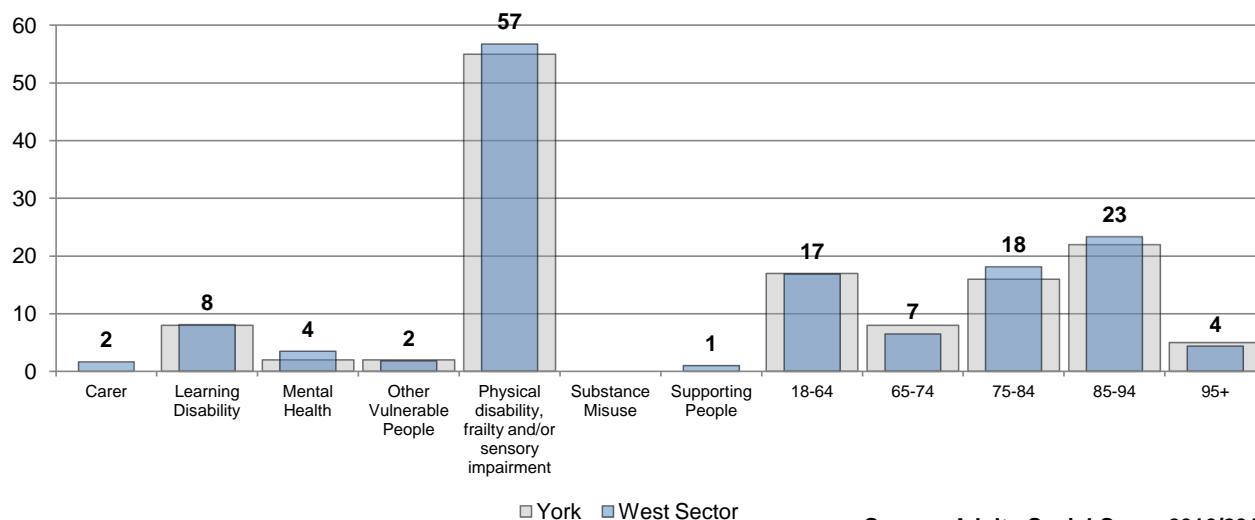

Average Weekly Homecare Hours by Client Type and Age

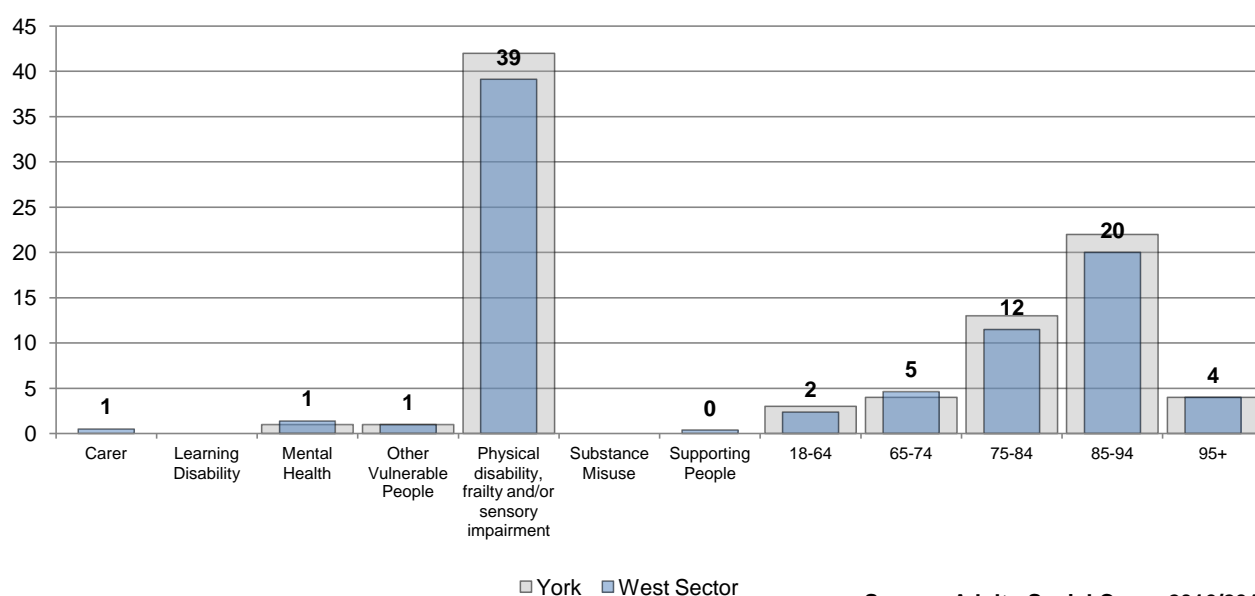


Homecare Clients by Type and Age



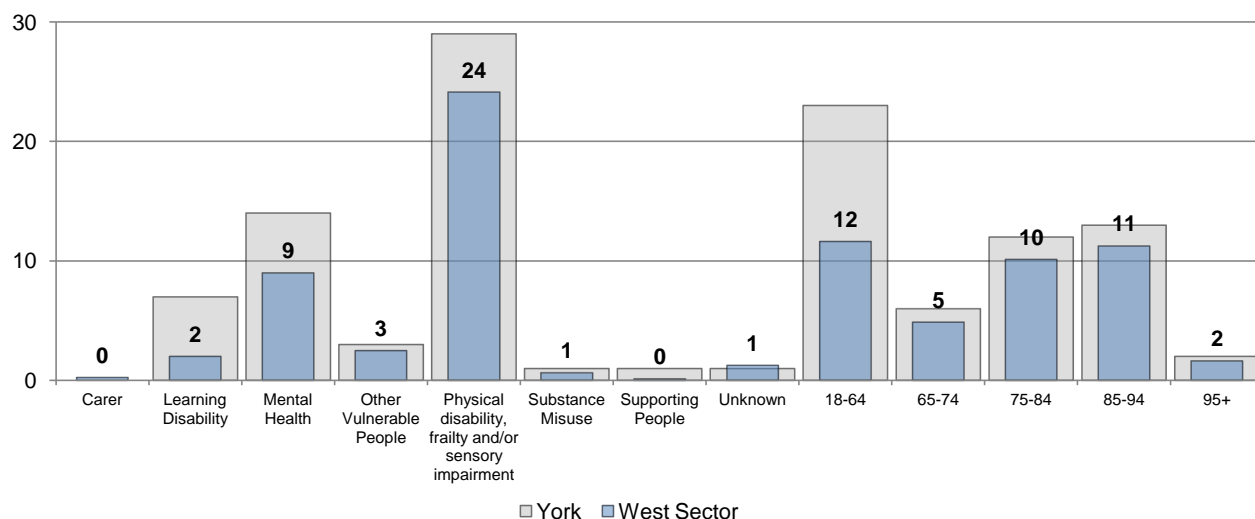

Adults Safeguarding Concerns by Client Type and Age



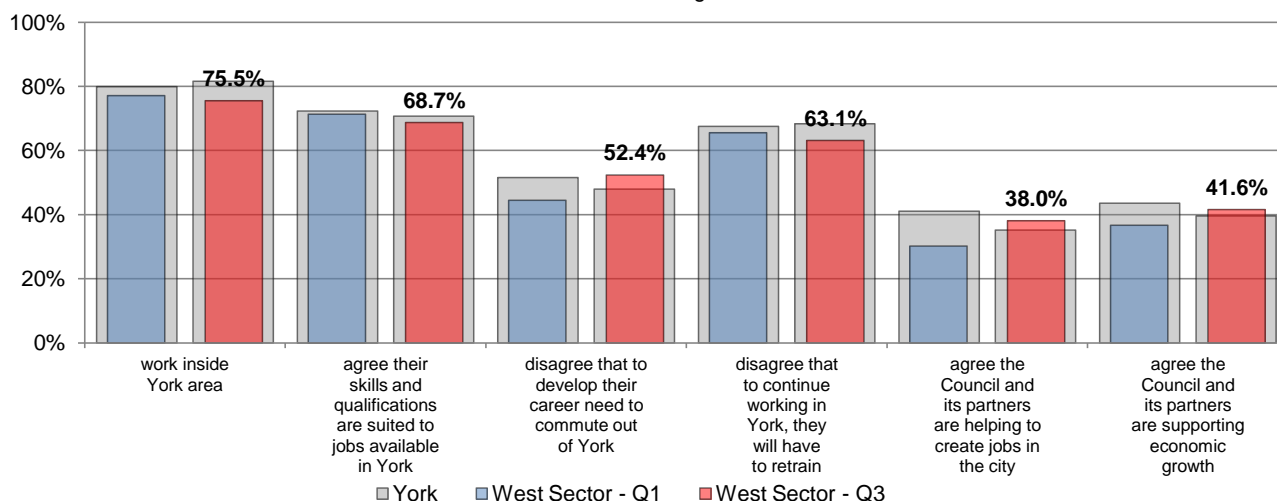

Respondents who are retired or not working due to long term illness or disability were unable to answer the following

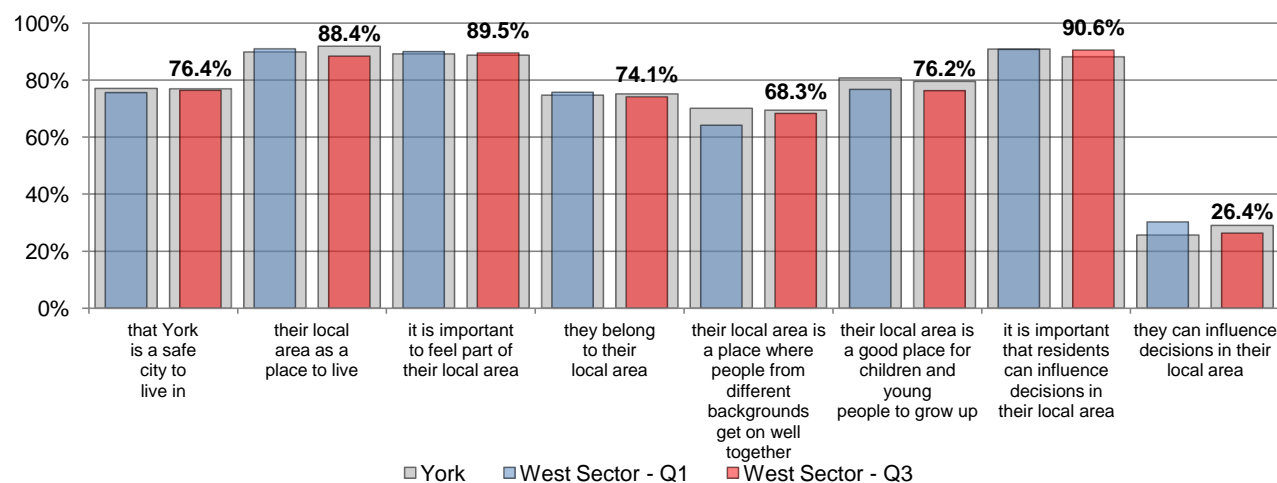

Respondents were asked to consider their Local Area as the area within 15-20 minutes walking distance from their home

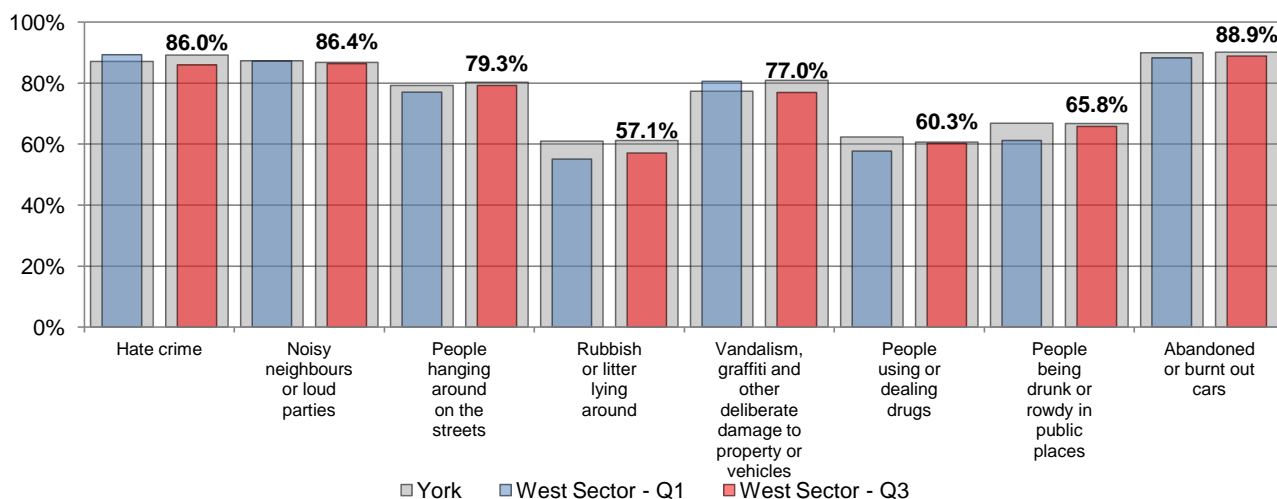

Respondents reporting the following as 'not a problem'



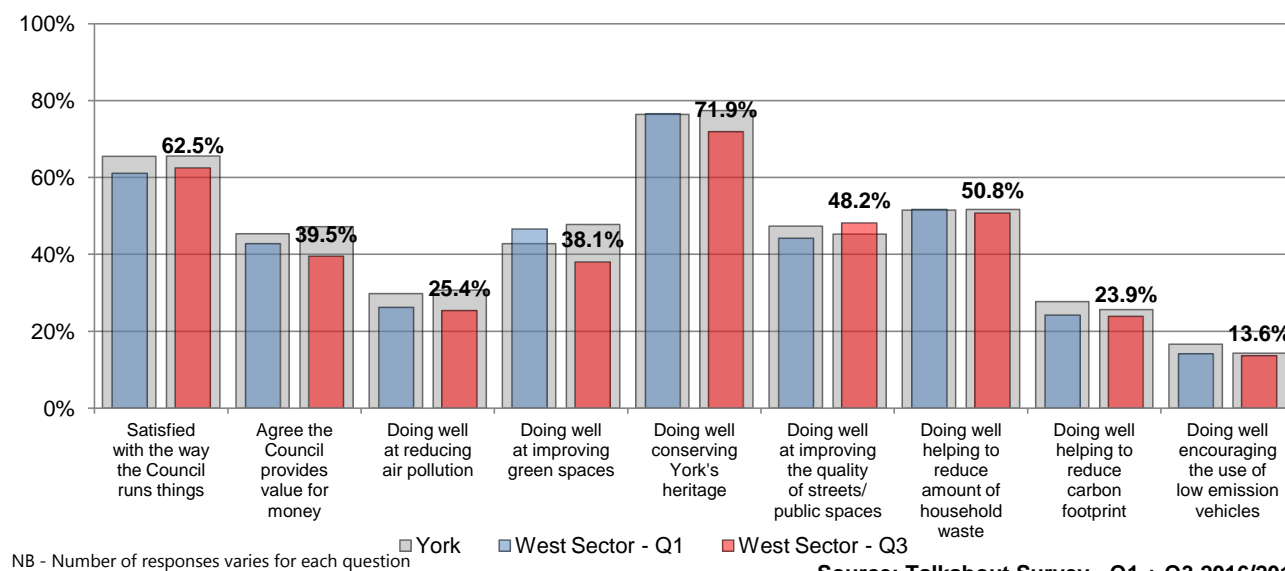
