

York Summary

- York has **198,051 residents** with 9.8% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 84% are in good health, with 15.3% stating they have some limitation in day to day activities. Males can expect to live to 79.6 and females to 83.1 years of age. There are 28.3% of the population classed as healthy eating adults, however obesity accounts for 23%.
- There are **83,552 houses** in York with 66% of residents owning their own home outright or via a mortgage, 18% are private renters and 14% social tenants.
- 73.5% of residents have a NVQ level 1-4 qualification with 18% having no qualification at all.
- 4575 (12.9%) children live in poverty. 25 of 212 (11.8%) pensioners receive pension credit.
- 8.8% of the working population claim out of work benefits and 2.1% claim job seekers allowance.
- Telephone is the favoured communication channel for contacting the council with 44% of contacts from York residents, face to face accounts for 11% while self serve accounts for 6%.



Ward Summary

- Heslington has 4792 residents with 35.2% from a black and minority ethnic community group. This compares to 4122 residents and a BME proportion of 28.3% in 2001.
- 93.5% are in good health, with 6.4% stating they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- 86.1% of adults are single and 10.7% are married.
- Males can expect to live to 81.3 and females to 83.1 years of age. There are 34.1% of the population classed as healthy eating adults, however obesity accounts for 14%.
- There are 480 houses in this ward with 57% of residents owning their own home outright or via a mortgage, 27% are private renters and 11% social tenants.
- 89.2% of residents have a NVQ level 1-4 qualification with 2.6% having no qualification at all.
- 15 (11.7%) children live in poverty and 25 of 212 (11.8%) pensioners receive pension credit.
- 0.9% of the working population claiming out of work benefits and 0.1% claim job seekers allowance. There are 7 JSA claimants in Heslington with 5 claiming over 6 months.
- Telephone is the favoured communication channel for contacting the council at 45%, face to face accounts for up 7% while self serve accounts 22%.




Population

In 2011 the ward's population was 4,792, or 2.4% of York's total population. 80.3% were under the age of 25, and 4.4% were over 65. (Census 2011)


% Population by age (Census 2011)




Life Expectancy at birth (APHO 2011)




Gender (Census 2011)



Ethnicity (2011 Census)




BME Community (does not include white British)





Marital Status (Census)















Household Composition (Census 2011)






% Child Obesity (NHS 2010)




% Healthy Adults (APHO 2010)




General Health (Census 2011)

Day to Day Activities and Unpaid Care (2011 Census)








Environment Crime per 1000 population (SYP 2012)




Anti-Social Behaviour per 1000 population (SYP 2012)



Monthly Total ASB per 1000 population for Heslington




Crime Rate per 1000 population (SYP 2012)



Pension Credit - NOMIS (proportion of 65+ Population)






Benefits Claimants Numbers (NOMIS) By Ward



Benefits Claimants Rate (16-64) Benchmark (NOMIS)




Total Ward Claimant Rate (Age and Gender) Benchmark (NOMIS)




JSA Claimants Numbers (NOMIS) By Ward

JSA Claimants Rate Benchmark (NOMIS 16-64)


