

Following the introduction of Universal Credit, the claimant count takes into account:

- people claiming contribution JSA (this is not affected by the introduction of Universal Credit)
- people claiming income based JSA during the transition period to Universal Credit
- people claiming Universal Credit who are subject to labour market rules (available for work and actively seeking employment) - not yet available at Local Authority level.
- the figures for Universal Credit are provisional for the current month and may be revised in the next update.

Key Messages from today's release:

York overall picture:

The JSA Claimant count for York in June 2017 is 560.

This is a decrease of 55 from the previous month.

This represents 0.4% of the working age population. The region stands at 1.5% and GB at 1.2%.

Last Year - June 2016, the total was 545 (therefore an increase of 15) and was 0.4% of the working age population.

The JSA figures should be viewed in the context of the number of people receiving Universal Credit in York increasing from 705 in May to 706 in June. Of which, 354 in May and 356 in June were not in employment.

The total of JSA claimants and UC (out of work) claimants is 940. This is an increase of 40 (4.4%) since June 2016.

Since June 2016 the number of people on JSA has increased by 2.8%.

Further Headlines

1) York has seen a decrease in its Youth Unemployment count, down by 10 from last month. In June 2016 the total number of claimants (18-24) stood at 55, increasing by 5 to 60 in June 2017 - a 9.09% increase.

2) 18-24 year olds, claiming over one year, showed no change from last month, there is no change from one year ago.

3) Claimants out of work for over one year, decreased by 5 from last month, totalling 115, 35 less than one year ago - a 23.33% decrease.

4) Male Claimants have decreased by 20 from last month, totalling 330, 15 less than one year ago - a 4.35% decrease.

5) Female Claimants have decreased by 25 from last month, totalling 235, 35 more than one year ago - a 17.50% increase.
