


York Summary

- York has 211,012 residents with 5.7% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 83.9% are in good health, with 15.3% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- £691.90 was the Average Net Weekly Household Income in 2017/18 (£637.58 in 2015/2016).
- 66% own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage, 18% are private renters and 14% are social tenants. There are 7,400 Council Houses in York.
- 73.5% of residents have a Level 1 - 4 qualification, of which 62.9% are, at least, qualified to Level 2, but 18.0% have no qualifications at all.
- 13.0% of children are living in low income families (7.7% of children live in a household where a parent or guardian claims an out-of-work benefit) and there are 8.9% of households in fuel poverty.
- 2.0% of the working population (aged 16-64) claim out of work benefits (either Job Seekers Allowance or Universal Credit)




Ward Summary

- Strensall has 8,267 residents with 3.0% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 86.4% are in good health, with 13.4% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- £668.59 was the Average Net Weekly Household Income in 2017/18 (£642.63 in 2015/2016).
- 80% own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage, 13% are private renters and 6% are social tenants. There are no Council Houses in this ward.
- 75.2% of residents have a Level 1 - 4 qualification, of which 63.1% are, at least, qualified to Level 2, but 16.3% have no qualifications at all.
- 8.5% of children are living in low income families (3.7% of children live in a household where a parent or guardian claims an out-of-work benefit) and there are 10.9% of households in fuel poverty.
- 1.3% of the working population (aged 16-64) claim out of work benefits (either Job Seekers Allowance or Universal Credit)


Population by Age











Benefit Claimant Numbers Working age Population (16-64)




Benefit Claimant Rate Working age Population (16-64)




JSA and Universal Credit (out of work) Claimant Rate






JSA and Universal Credit (out of work) Claimant Rate Working age Population (16-64)







Fuel Poverty


The new fuel poverty metric Low Income Low Energy Efficiency (LILEE) considers a household to be fuel poor if:

- its disposable income (income after housing costs (AHC) and energy needs) would be below the poverty line.

Pension Credit is an income-related benefit made up of 2 parts - Guarantee Credit and Savings Credit.




Indices of Multiple Deprivation



Strensall Ward - Barriers to Housing and Services Score: Breakdown by Decile**




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**Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019
Strensall Ward - Crime Score: Breakdown by Decile**




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**Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019
Strensall Ward – Education, Skills and Training Score: Breakdown by Decile**





Strensall Ward – Health Deprivation and Disability Score: Breakdown by Decile**





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
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**Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019
Strensall Ward – Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index Score (IDACI): Breakdown by Decile**



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
**Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019
Strensall Ward – Income Deprivation Affecting Older People (IDOP) Score: Breakdown by Decile**



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







Hospital Admissions, All ages








Emergency hospital admissions




Emergency hospital admissions for injuries resulting from a fall (over 65), per 1,000 population






Premature mortality


Social isolation

A score of 1 indicates that the respondent has plenty of social contact and that they spend their time doing things they enjoy


A score of 4 indicates that the respondent feels socially isolated and that they don't feel they do anything of value with their time.

The mean of all respondents' responses to both questions is the score presented here.





Average Weekly Homecare Hours by Client Age





Homecare Clients by Age









Total Crime and Total Anti-Social Behaviour per 1,000 population







Percentage of road area that is/has













Travel time (minutes) by public transport / walking to nearest...







This data is based on analysis of Ofcom's Connected Nations data for 2020/2021. Ofcom collected and analysed data from major fixed telecoms operators (BT, Virgin Media, Sky, Talk Talk, Vodafone and KCOM). The availability data also includes coverage information provided by alternative network providers (B4RN, BU-UK, City Fibre, Gigaclear, Hyperoptic, ITS and Relish). Due to variations in broadband performance over time, Ofcom cautions that the data should not be regarded as a definitive and fixed view of the broadband infrastructure but rather a snapshot of current variation in availability and performance across the country. Due to privacy concerns Ofcom did not present the information in postcodes with fewer than four broadband connections.



Respondents were asked to consider their Local Area as the area within 15-20 minutes walking distance from their home



Resident satisfaction responses about Public Realm in their Local Area




Resident satisfaction responses about the Council (and partners)



York Council house tenants satisfied with / agree that...





York Council house tenants satisfied with / agree that...


